Its purpose is to bring the voices and concerns of North County people to political leaders. <u>CCA</u> seeks to create new public policies and to change existing public policies through organizing efforts. <u>CCA</u> works on issues and concerns that emerge as priorities from the organizing efforts of its member congregations.

On Tuesday, October 26th at 6:30PM, <u>Congregations for Civic Action</u> is holding the 2004 Mayoral/City Council Candidate Interviews for the City of Oceanside. Mission San Luis Rey Parish, Shiloh Church of God in Christ, and the Church of St. Thomas More are sponsoring the evening.
