“Prepare the Way of the Lord!”

As we continue to journey through this Season of Advent, we are mindful that we are a people of “the Second Coming.” We are a people waiting for the return of Jesus, God’s “Word Made Flesh.” The One who once came to us as the babe in Bethlehem is to return as the Prince of Peace who will bind all our wounds and bring all things to their final end.
