"Christian Unity Week – Where Two or Three Are Gathered in My Name..."

In the midst of January, all Christian Churches are invited to participate in a *"Week of Prayer for Christian Unity."*

The goals of this annual week are to remind all Christians of the scandal of our divisions, to create an ever deeper longing for unity as the Body of Christ, and to beg God for the grace and strength necessary to dedicate the ministries of the Churches in bringing all Christians closer together as brothers and sisters.

This week the St. Thomas More Faith Community is participating in two events to help foster these goals.

The first event takes place on Sunday, January 15,' at 4:00pm. The Church of St. Thomas More is hosting an *Ecumenical Prayer Service*. The theme of the Service is "Where Two or Three Are Gathered in My Name..."

Participating in this prayer event are San Marcos Lutheran Church, First Presbyterian Church of Oceanside, Pilgrim United Church of Christ in Carlsbad, North Coast United Methodist Church, United Methodist Church of Vista, St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Church in Vista, and St. Thomas More Catholic Church in Oceanside.
