Mother's Day is usually a joyful event spent with family, sharing food, and celebrating mom. But for the 1.5 million children in this country who have a parent in prison, Mother's Day can be very lonely.

"Get On The Bus", founded in 1999, is an annual event that reunites children and mothers in prison who otherwise may never have an opportunity to visit during the parent's incarceration. The children are unable to visit due to lack of transportation...the prisons are located in central California, which is an eight-hour trip one way from San Diego. Last year "Get On The Bus" participants left San Diego Friday at 4:00am and returned home Saturday at 1:00am. Often these children are being cared for by an elderly grandparent or are in foster care, making the trip impossible for them.

"Get On The Bus" not only provides transportation for the children and their caregivers to the prison, it also provides three meals for each child, caregiver, and volunteer. Children also receive a family photograph, a special teddy bear, a commemorative event t-shirt, and post-visit counseling. Additionally, volunteers assist each family with the mountain of paperwork it takes to get clearance for the visit. Each year the number of children taken from the San Diego area continues to grow.

"Get On The Bus" is in need of monetary donations to help offset the cost of this trip. It costs approximately \$4,000 to take a busload of children and caregivers on the trip. Three buses will come from the San Diego area.
