Social Ministries: Discussion regarding concern for the many requests of donations during the Christmas season tabled until our next meeting in August when Suzie is present to discuss with council.

#### 5. New Business

<u>Victory Garden:</u> Sondra Parks shared her idea for the members of the Parish and nearby community to be able to use the land set aside for our school at STM for a Victory Garden. Sondra shared that this idea is popular in other areas of the country and that many people may like to garden but are unable to participate as

they live in condos or apartments. Near STM, we have elderly people and young children who would benefit from the gardening experience. Fruit trees could be planted. Water is available, but many details will have to be worked out. Members of the council suggested that a bulletin announcement run for a couple of weeks to determine parish interest and lead to the possible formation of a committee to study the idea and determine the feasibility of the project at STM.

Laughter Ministry: Mark Darcy shared about how laughter clubs have helped him with chronic pain management and how this therapy has improved his life. He talked about how laughter groups create bonds with others and can give participants stress relief and a more optimistic outlook on life. He participates in and leads laughter clubs and he would like to share this "medicine" of laughter with our parish. The sessions will include breathing and stretching exercises along with various types of laughter actions. Mark suggested the group could meet monthly. Mark could place a bulletin announcement and make an announcement during the masses to promote this ministry.

## 6. Committee Updates

## **Evangelization and Faith Formation Committee**

<u>RCIA</u>: At STM we have four candidates and catechumens currently in our RCIA process. Since we had a short time before Easter this year, our current group will celebrate the Easter Sacraments in 2009.

<u>Liturgy of the Word for Children</u>: We are looking for people to help facilitate during the summer months so LOWC can be at both 8:30 & 10:30 Masses.

<u>Religious Education for Adolescents and Children</u>: Another year of Faith Formation has been completed; 254 children participated

#### Adult Religious Education Committee:

- Father Mikes Bookies will continue with staff members leading discussions beginning in the fall; 5 sessions will be held next year
- Parish Lenten Retreat (the week before Palm Sunday) is in the planning stages with Sound Mission Ministries leading the retreat
- The Men's Prayer Breakfast was well attended with 35 men in attendance; Women's Prayer Breakfast will be held in October

#### Middle School Youth Ministry:

- PUSH Middle School Youth Group Retreat was just completed. The theme of the retreat was Answered Prayers. "The Thirsting" Catholic Rock Band provided the music. Father Tom celebrated Mass in Polish.
- Bishops Cordelione and Chavez and Abbott Charles Wright celebrated Mass during the last three months with the Monday Night Mass Group. Father

- Anthony Saroki will celebrate on June  $2^{nd}$  and Abbott Charles is returning on July  $7^{th}$ .
- On May 12<sup>th</sup> the STM Youth Ministry hosted a concert featuring "The Thirsting" Catholic Rock Band. Over a 100 youth attended along with 28 adults.

## High School and Young Adult Women Ministries:

• Steubenville San Diego will take place on July 25-27 at San Diego State with 60 participants from STM.

## Sacramental Preparation:

- 29 children are preparing to celebrate First Eucharist on May 31 and June 1st.
- Bishop Brom confirmed 30 young adults at Mass on May 11th

<u>Sister Parish:</u> Sr. Maureen Brown organized a potluck dinner for STM parishioners to learn about our efforts to help in New Orleans following Katrina hurricane. This was very successful with 60-70 people attending.

CPR Training: Dr. Phil reports 300 people have been trained so far.

<u>More's Workers</u>: A new group, now to be included under social ministries. Suzee will contact Dick and Charlene Belprez for their activities.

## Marriage and Family Life
