#### a. Annual Gala - Chris Smith

Cinco de Gala went well with 250 people attending. Wheel of Fortune and Champagne Diamond Attendance and profits were down this year due to multiple events and "asks" at STM.

The Pastor's dinners are being well received at the Rectory. Two down and one to go. Cost is \$150/person with a \$75/person profit at 20 people per dinner for an intimate setting.

Cheeseburger in Paradise with Deacon John and Debbie was a big hit. Cost was \$110/person with a \$50-60 profit projected. There were 3 of these dinners. \$44,000 was given to the parish from these events.

Ongoing events to be held are the Wine Tasting 101 in October and The Christmas Cookie Exchange. Depending how well these events do we may be able to issue another check to STM in Dec. We need to leave enough money in the account for start-up cash for 2018 events.

#### Finance Council - Ron Briseno

This was a little difficult year because this was the first year with both buildings but all in all we are doing well. Now we have a gauge for coming years. Working on a template to use in reporting the finances to the Parish.

### **Development Council – Jody Cadieux**

Highlights from the meeting on June 14<sup>th</sup> were given.

The Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) now stands at \$61,500. Our Parish Assessment is \$50,000. Any overage of the assessment is returned to the Parish.

The Fall new member luncheon is scheduled for October 15<sup>th</sup>.

Lena Rumps is now helping Jane Gladden heading up public relations and submitted an article for the spring/summer Tower on the Marian Shrine which also appeared in The Southern Cross. Scrip sales has about \$1100 coming back to the parish. There was Scrip fraud but the Scrip company did not charge us for it and they are covered by insurance for this.

Vehicle donation has about \$2700 coming back to the parish so far this year.

Planned giving received \$10,000 and has another distribution pending estimated to be \$30,000-\$35,000.

# Social Ministries – Morgan & Stacey Espe

- **a. Blood Drive (Morgan and Stacey Espe):** The Blood drive on June 25<sup>th</sup> was successful and we will have another one on October 15, 2017.
- **b. CPR\AED Classes (Philip Goscienski M.D.):** This quarter the CPR Program completed training and certification of 32 members of the parish. Classes will resume in September.
- c. Culture of Life Activities (Jane Kelleher): The Culture of Life group continues to pray the Rosary at Planned Parenthood in Vista weekly. We pray each Thursday from 10-11 AM. We recently had a Baby Bottle Drive to benefit COLFS (Culture of Life Family Services). They are a faith based medical clinic in Escondido coming up in November, we will participate in the Side by Side Walk, formerly Life Walk. This is an organization that deals with post abortion healing for anyone who has been affected in any way. We will also be attending the annual fundraising banquet for Birth Choice, our local Pregnancy Resource Center.
- **d. Brother Benno's (Don and Jan Le May):** Don and Jan have taken over this ministry. Continue to serve and have no special needs at this time.
- e. Angel Tree Ministry (Lisa Seufert): As Christmas Angel Chair, I would like to say that the time is fast approaching when we begin our activity in collecting gifts for the children and families from Catholic Charities, Solutions for Change and Camp Pendleton. Planning meetings will be held in late September and mid October with the ornament adorned trees going up the first weekend of November. Gifts need to be returned to the church by the first week of December in order to get them to the appropriate groups in time for Christmas. \* I will be looking for an assistant "Angel" this

<u>year as I have travel plans for the first 2 weeks of December. If you could please spread</u> the word that would be greatly appreciated!

#### SDOP – Sr. Maureen

<u>April:</u> Faith Not Fear Summit: a gathering of over 700 people from the diocese supporting the rights of all families in our community. Our Pastor and members of our parish attended. Sr. Maureen participated in leading the event.

May: Sr. Maureen attended the 2017 PICO National Federation Directors

Meeting in Baltimore. Representatives from PICO National and local affiliates met to set National and local goals for the coming year. (PICO is a national network of faith based community organizations working to create innovative solutions to problems facing urban, suburban and rural communities. SDOP is our local affiliate.)

June and ongoing: In order to protect and support individuals without citizenship papers threatened by an increase in deportation raids, we are developing Rapid Response Teams and Accompaniment Teams in North County in conjunction with other faith organizations. 25 to 30 of our parishioners have expressed interest in joining one of these teams.

#### "Aging with Grace, Part II

Plans continue for the second event of the successful September 2016 "Aging with Grace" Conference. The date has been set for Saturday, November 11, 2017. Dr.

Sharon Hamill from California State University, San Marcos Institute for Palliative Care and Father Mike will be our presenters.

Once again, it is to be noted that ICWJ has disbanded and we are no longer involved. As always, our future plans include the further support of our parish, community and other needs based on Catholic Social teachings in conjunction with the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), Catholic Charities, ICWJ, SDOP, Just Faith and other local and national organizations.

- g. Syrian Refugee Family Ministry (Lisa and Patrick Attardo): This is a new Ministry!

  The Almustafa family, while grieving, are doing their best to move forward. The STM Syrian Family Fund has been able to pay for a private tutor that is working with the father, Husam, 2 3 days per week and his English is improving. There is an accounting firm that has agreed to hire him as soon as he can be proficient in his English, which we are hoping is 2 months away. The 2 older daughters are attending their first year of college, also working on their English as well as general studies. The mother, Douha, has had the most difficult time coping with the loss of their son. She feels she will be ready soon to shop with some of our women from the quilting group and resume her sewing. The STM fund continues to provide \$500 per month in support for food, gas for their van, toiletries, etc. with Scrip Gift Cards that they choose each month. We also pay for their cable and internet each month and are currently looking into paying off their travel loan. This month, they do not have any new requests. They are overwhelmed with everyone's generosity!
