





### Intention for the Day

That we may fully enter into the discipline of the Season of Lent. That Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving may become a part of our daily lives.



### GREGORIAN CHANT, THE CHURCH, AND YOU!

Chants were passed down by oral tradition until a form of notation was invented to write down the melodies. It is one of the earliest type of music we have written down in notation that we can understand. The language of Gregorian chant is Latin. Gregorian chant is derived from ancient Jewish chant and has been around for thousands of years.

Named after Pope Gregory the Great, who played a part in organizing and standardizing all of the chants (there are hundreds of them), Gregorian Chant is monophonic, which means that everyone sings the same single melody in unison; there is no "harmony" or instruments accompanying the melody. Western choral music history grew from this style of music.

The Church recognizes Gregorian chant as being specially suited to the Roman Liturgy. Gregorian chant is uniquely the Church's own music. Chant is a living connection with our forebears in the faith, the traditional music of the Roman rite, a sign of communion with the universal Church, a bond of unity across cultures, a means for diverse communities to participate together in song, and a summons for contemplative participation in the Liturgy. The Second Vatican Council directed that the faithful be able to sing parts of the Mass together in Latin. The United States Bishops have offered a list of the "basics" for use in our liturgies. During Lent this year, we will be singing these traditional Gregorian chants, using them in our liturgies, some in Latin and some in English. (Not to worry...the sample below is in old notation, and we will be using more modern notation for our singing.)



For some of us, singing the chants will be like visiting old friends. For others, they will be new and unlike the parts of the Mass we usually sing. However, this parish has a tradition of chanting the Lord's Prayer, and these new-to-some, familiarto-others songs will become familiar to all of us over time.

One parishioner, recently returned from a pilgrimage in Mexico, shared with me that she was pleased that the church she visited used Latin during the liturgy, making it easier for her to follow along as she was familiar with some of the texts.

Through our chanting this Lent, we too will re-familiarize ourselves with or meet for the first time this grand tradition of the Church, making a living connection with our forbears in faith.

### **First Sunday of Lent**

Philip Yancey's thoughts were а wonderful focus for me in entering this Lenten season:

"I remember addressing the topic 'Culture Wars'. . . when my turn came to speak, I mentioned that on such issues I seek guidance from the life of a Jew from the first century, who was also involved in a culture war. A rigid religious establishment hounded him throughout his time on earth, worried that his revolutionary message might upset the ruling authorities. And surely the pagan empire he lived under gave him cause for offense. Rome had practices-slavery,

mass executions, infanticide, public gladiator games-that no modern state would tolerate. Jesus relied on one main weapon to 'fight' the culture wars: sacrificial love. Among the last words he spoke before death were these: 'Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing.

After the panel, a television celebrity came up to me . . . 'I've got to tell you, that stabbed me right in the heart,' he said. 'I was prepared to dislike you because I dislike all right-wing Christians and I assumed you were one. You can't imagine the mail I get from right-wingers. I don't follow Jesus-I'm a Jew. But when you told about Jesus forgiving his enemies, I realized how far from that spirit I am. I fight my enemies, especially rightwingers. I don't forgive them. I have much to learn from the spirit of Jesus.' The power of Jesus' sacrificial love was at work yet again."

May this Lenten season find us open to the spirit of Jesus!



### On the Journey

At St. Thomas More we are blest to have four candidates and catechumen currently in our RCIA process. The Church strongly recommends that the period of catechumenate be a full year. During this time the catechumens are formed in the Christian way of life and

- "presented with Catholic teaching to enlighten their faith,
- direct the heart toward God,
- foster participation in the liturgy,
- inspire apostolic activity and
- nurture a life completely in accord with the spirit of Christ." (RCIA, ¶ 78)

In order to allow the time for this development, our current group look forward to celebrating the Easter Sacraments in 2009 rather than at the Easter Vigil, 2008.

Remember: Lourdes Acevedo, Kurt Schwend, Billy Turley and Bri Wasch "become familiar with the Christian way of life and are helped by the example and support of sponsors and the entire Christian Community...to keep their hopes set on Christ." (RCIA, ¶ 75)



### **Giving Is Living**

"Go bring to the needy sweet charity's bread, for giving is living," the angel said.

"Must I give again and again?

"Oh no!" said the angel, chilling me through.

"Give only until the Master stops giving to you!"

God's stewards are in the world, but not of the world. God's stewards recognize that the Lord sets them apart from the world and by the transforming power of the Gospel sends them into the world to live out the Gospel.

The film *The Matrix* posed the question: "Which world are you in?" Unless you followed closely, or watched the movie more than once, it was a difficult question to answer.



Amphibians live in two worlds at once. Some, like hibernating frogs, can live in one world for an extended time before emerging to the other and then casually slip in and out of each environment when active.

The steward's life is amphibious. You slip in and out of the world of the secular and the spiritual. The worlds are completely different, but you can easily cross from one to the other.

The balance for the Christian steward is to live totally in the spiritual world while being in the secular world.

"Standing around in a garage does not make you a car," someone once said. The environment in which you find yourself is real, but that environment does not describe you. What a frog is does not depend on being in or out of the water. A frog is a frog, and conducts its life in two environments without changing its nature.

As a child of God, your spiritual nature lives itself out in the physical world as a place for your to exist. God created and preserves the physical world as a place for you to exist. You are expected to manage it

Being part of society and contributing to its betterment are noble goals of Christian service. Every contribution you make within the Church or outside of the Church are witnesses to God's gifts within you. -R. Nelson

Jesus was led by the Spirit to the desert, a place of harshness and solitude, silence and impoverishment. Although we don't live in a barren desert, it would be wise to set aside time during Lent to simulate His barren desert experience with some, small



act of self-denial, and/or special prayer time to be reminded of the need of conversion or order to draw closer to the Lord.
