Ascension—"Jesus Was Lifted Up, and a Cloud Took Him from Their Sight"

When we celebrate the Feast of the Ascension, we celebrate the absence of Jesus. He is physically gone from us. He is no longer with us as He once was.

When we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost, the gift of the Holy Spirit, we celebrate the presence of Jesus in the new way in which He remains with his Church, until the end of time. The gift of the Spirit is a profound realization that the Church is the Body of Christ. The Church is Jesus for this time and this place. It is the Church that continues the Mission and Ministry of Jesus in the here and now, in and through our flesh.

This distinction is at the heart of Christianity. Our God is not just "up in heaven." We are not theists that believe only in a God totally transcendent from us.

Our God is not only transcendent but also imminent. Our God is "down here on earth among us."

Christianity is incarnational. God is in our flesh and bones and comes to the world through us.

This distinction is the difference between theism and Christianity. Fr. Ronald Rolheiser, in *The Holy Longing*, describes it this way:

If my mother is sick and I pray that she gets better, but do not drive her to see the doctor, I have prayed as a theist, not as a Christian.

I have not given an incarnational flesh, skin, to my prayer. It is more difficult for God to answer such a prayer.

If I see a colleague or friend who looks depressed and pray for her, but do not speak to her, then I am praying like a theist, not as a Christian.

How is God supposed to console her? Send her an e-mail from heaven?

It is my voice and my compassion that is called for since I am a part of the Body of Christ, am praying, precisely through the Body of Christ, and am there, available to talk to her.

If I pray for a close friend but do not send him a postcard to tell him I am thinking about him, how is that prayer supposed to touch him?

If I pray for world peace, but do not, inside of myself, forgive those who have hurt me, how can God bring about peace on this planet?

Our prayer needs our flesh to back it up.

As we move through these feasts of Ascension and Pentecost, may we be mindful that if we are feeling the absence of Jesus in our lives and in our world, it is because we are not relying upon the insight and strength of the Holy Spirit and we are not backing up our prayer with our flesh!

If we are asking "Where is Jesus in all of this?" maybe we should be asking, "Where am I in all of this?"

MORNING STAR

At the very end of the Exultet, that long and lovely prayer with which we blessed the Easter candle on Easter eve, we heard the minister sing:

May the morning star. which never sets find this flame still burning: Christ, that Morning Star, who came back from the dead, and shed his peaceful light on all humanity...

Have you ever been awake early enough to see the morning star? It is the brightest star of the moment just before dawn. It's not the sun, but it brightens the sky and brings the dawn, in which the sun rises and sheds light everywhere freely.

The Exultet here compares Christ, the Son of God, to the morning star, and God the Father to the sun itself. Christ, now risen from the dead, will never die again. Remember how in the account of the passion that we heard on Good Friday that the sun was blotted out when Jesus died. Old works of art show the sun covering its face in sorrow and in pain. But God's love

is stronger than death, and so the morning star returns to the night sky, and day begins to dawn.

As we gave thanks and praise to God-Exultet is addressed to the first person of the Trinity—we asked to be faithful. We asked that this great candle may keep burning as we kept our all-night vigil on Easter eve. It's a very poetic way of asking God to help us stay awake and do the church's work of baptizing, anointing, breaking, pouring and sharing. What a night it was. Light of Christ! Thanks be to God!





Introducing THE DAYRINGERS

With the acquisition of our handbells last spring, I invited members of the Parish to join in a new handbell choir which would be forming in May.

And so, we began the Adult Handbell Choir, which meets on Wednesday evenings and has participated at Mass since July.

In January of this year, twelve children met to begin rehearsals of our newest musical ensemble, the Dayringers. Today at the 10:30am Mass, they begin their public ministry to this congregation.

These children are all homeschooled, allowing them to meet on Wednesday mornings each week following morning Mass. Their parents have made room in their curriculum to allow them to pursue this musical activity.

Originally envisioned as a three-month activity, the Dayringers have extended this inaugural rehearsal period to allow them to play at Mass during the Easter season.

The nature of a handbell choir offers a terrific opportunity for people of differing ages and musical abilities to gather along a

single table to make music as part of a greater whole, and the Dayringers are no exception.



so I will weave in earnest and leave God with the rest.


At last when life is ended, with God I will abide.


