

#### CALLING THOSE WITH A CALL TO MINISTRY!

#### Opportunities to Offer Your Time and Talent to Your Parish Family

There are 25 liturgical ministers at every weekend Mass (up to 60 if you include a choir or two) giving of their time and talent to facilitate and minister to the assembly gathered around the Lord's table. There are more than 300 liturgical ministers in the Parish who serve daily, weekly, and monthly in church and in homes and hospitals, all in service to Christ Jesus. Have you considered becoming one?

#### **Altar Servers**

Servers carry the cross and candles and assist the presider or deacon with the Roman Missal, bread, wine, and water at the altar.

Altar Servers (grade 4 and up) should have received the three sacraments of initiation. However, young people who have not yet been confirmed, but are judged capable, may minister as servers at weekend liturgies. Adults may serve at daily Mass and at Funeral and Wedding liturgies.

#### **Eucharistic Ministers**

"Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion" function as the primary assistants to the priest as he distributes the Precious Body and Blood of Christ to the people of the Parish at weekend and daily liturgies, local convalescent homes, and/or Tri-City Hospital.

To become a Eucharistic Minister, you must be fifteen years of age or older, confirmed, leading an exemplary Christian life, and so recognized by the faith community.

#### **Hospitality Ministers**

These ministers with smiling faces and warm handshakes welcome people to our home and to our table each week. They greet and assist the congregation before, during, and after each Mass.

Hospitality is a terrific place to begin a ministry at the Parish. There are no special qualifications; a smiling presence and a brief training are all you need to start!

#### Readers

"Ministers of the Word" bring the living word of God to the assembled faith community. When the Scriptures are read in the Church, God himself is speaking to his people.

Interested people undergo training by the Diocese and the Parish, and, upon completion, join the rotation of Readers at daily or weekend Masses.

#### Sacristans

Sacristans open our Parish home before each liturgy and ready all that is necessary for our worship.

Weekend Sacristans are preferably high school students who are at least 15 years old. Sacristans should have received the three sacraments of initiation. However, young people who have not yet been confirmed, but judged capable, may minister as Sacristans for weekend liturgies.


During the week, the Sacristans also double as Altar Servers for daily Mass in addition to arranging all that is necessary for the Mass.

- And let us praise those fathers who have died, but live on in our memory and whose love continues to nurture us.




Why would a man give of his time so freely to do such challenging work? Paul laughs when I call it challenging. He sees it as only rewarding.

Fathers and mothers alike set good examples for all of the children to see. In turn, it is so rewarding to see our youth growing up with the joy of sharing their gifts with others.


Over time, we trust that, by God's grace and in God's time, our gifts will flourish and good things will come




