words of The Most Reverend Daniel Pilarczyk, the Archbishop of Cincinnati, taken from his book, *The Parish: Where God's People Live:*

'A parish, then, is a moment, a chapter in God's love affair with us human beings. And being a member of a parish does not mean just 'belonging to something', but rather, being involved in a loving association with God in Christ Jesus and with each other in Him, and with all the world for Him.

JESUS, OUR ALLY AGAINST EVIL

Ever faithful, the word of the Lord steps off the page and stands beside us yet again this month. This living Word meets us where we live and addresses truthfully and knowingly the realities that shape our lives and our world. God's word readily acknowledges that ours is a time and place in which goodness and evil grow side by side, like wheat and weeds in a common field (July 20, Gospel). Often, it is a challenge to distinguish one from the other because evil can masquerade as good, passing itself off as the logical, the practical or even the best legal choice in a given circumstance. Evil has many faces, some of which are usually quite recognizable, such as abuse, injustice, and violence of every sort. These are rearing their heads in so many areas of our world: Congo, Darfur, Kosovo, Kenya, Tibet, along the borders of many North and South American countries, and so on. But evil has other faces as well. These are more cleverly disguised—prejudice, discrimination, and the uncaring parochialism that would negate the dignity, value, and freedoms of others, for whatever reason.

Regardless of the arguments people set forth to support and defend such evils, we are to identify them all for what they are and hold them out to the truth of God's word. Recognizing evil and calling it by name is not an easy process and often results in suffering for the truthteller. In all of the second readings of this month, Paul addresses this struggle. He insists that believers are not left alone or unaided, and recalls for us our conviction that the Spirit remains present, interceding for us and enabling us (July 20). A catalyst for good, the Spirit champions our efforts against what Paul calls the "flesh," a life that condones or tolerates evil and falls short of doing the good that is needed (July 6). Paul also encourages a positive attitude and trusting approach to life that is rooted in faith: "All things will work for good," assures Paul, "for those who love God" (July 27). Moreover, Paul urges hope and perseverance because the present struggle with evil, however great, cannot compare to the glory that God will reveal for us, through us, and within us (July 13).

Zechariah (July 6), Isaiah (July 13), and the author of Wisdom (July 20) also offer their support in the daily struggle to do good and prevent evil. Rather than focus on the magnitude of malignancy and be overwhelmed, our prophetic brothers team together with an ancient unnamed sage to encourage us to center our eyes and hearts and energies on God. Our

God is with us—a God of peace and justice, a God whose word is true and powerfully effective, a God who gives believers good ground for hope. This God knows our troubles and listens attentively to our cries of need, anger, frustration, and grief.

Page after page of the Hebrew and Christian scriptures attests to the caring involvement of this God, the one God, our God. Our ancestral psalmists remind us that our God "lifts up all who are falling and raises up all who are bowed down" (July 6). This God, our God, is "good and forgiving"; our God "gives strength to all who call out to God" (July 20). This God, our God, responds when we ask: "Let your kindness comfort me...let your compassion come to me that I may live" (July 27). This God, our God, has come to move and live and be among us in Jesus Christ.

Each of the Gospels for this month reminds us that in the struggle for good and against evil, Jesus has taken our part. In Jesus, all the Old Testament anthropomorphisms have come to life. He has become for us God's "outstretched arm" who extends a hand of support. He has become a shoulder to lean on and a friend with whom to lock arms and stand strong against all adversity.

Jesus' outstretched and loving support can also be known in the living word that speaks to every moment of our existence. Through that word, Jesus offers powerful reassurance in his invitation, "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you...and you will find rest" (July 6). In Jesus' day, oxen were usually yoked in pairs and shared the burden of the labor. What Jesus is offering, therefore, is not that we take his voke upon ourselves and try to bear it alone; rather, Jesus is offering to be our yoke-mate in life. Knowing that a burden shared is a burden made lighter, Jesus freely offers himself, his strong arms and back and hands and shoulders. He offers to walk beside us through the struggles against evil; he will be there also to share and intensify the joy that comes from persevering to the end. Yoked to Jesus, we can learn from him, and in him find the rest and peace he has promised.

A Time of Gratitude and Renewal

During this time, we celebrate the independence of our country. It is fitting that we recognize the gifts of freedom and abundance God has showered upon us.

As we give thanks to God for all we have, let us examine our stewardship pulse as we enter the second half of 2008.

Stewardship of Prayer: Resolve to strengthen your relationship with the Lord. Notice how often you pray and what hinders you from praying. Commit to short, daily prayer times.

Stewardship of Family: Resolve to set aside more time to stay connected with your family. Eat dinner together, schedule regular dates with your spouse, plan family outings, and go to Mass together.

Stewardship of Money: Resolve to render sacred your annual budget. Reprioritize your financial goals to ensure that the Lord comes first in your spending. Take positive steps to improve your financial health.

Stewardship of Work: Resolve to be faithful to your daily, work-related tasks and offer them up to the Lord. Cultivate your skills. Deepen your knowledge. Be mindful of how you are building the Kingdom of God.

Stewardship of Mind: Resolve to keep your mind active. Commit to being more informed on the issues of the day. Read your bible. In this year of presidential elections in the United States, familiarize yourself with the Church's teachings.

Stewardship of Neighbor: Resolve make time and space for others who enter your life; to be a person of hospitality. Be more aware of those times when a neighbor, co-worker, fellow parishioner or stranger, needs a moment of kindness, attention or affirming gesture on your part.

Stewardship of the Poor: Resolve to live with more compassion and in solidarity with those less fortunate. Remember the poor in prayer, and commit to helping relieve in some way the plight of those who are impoverished or marginalized.
