I am thrilled with the ride! I am grateful for what has been and I look forward to what will be.

It is such a gift to be able to view the world through 30-year-old eyes, and then look at the same world through 60-year-old eyes, and see things so differently. The life experience that we accumulate over the years brings such a richness in how we see and understand the world around us and the people in it.

We live a Mystery that is totally incomprehensible. We find ourselves on this speck of dust called Earth within a Universe that is beyond our measuring and our understanding.

Yet we proclaim a belief in a "Source of All Being" that knows and loves each one of us and has counted every hair on our head.

The challenge, in the midst of our everyday trials and tribulations, is to recognize the Mystery, embrace it, and celebrate it on a daily basis. Our faith gives us the words and the rituals to celebrate this Mystery, and to keep Mystery as the center of our lives as we make our way Home.

I share with you the words of a poster that I once saw. These words capture what I feel today:

> "I cry at least once a day, not because I am sad, but because the world is so beautiful!"





Lip Service or Action?

Jesus said to the religious leaders in his audience that even sinners would get to the kingdom of heaven before they would. How can this be possible? Most likely it is because Jesus saw through them and their transparent ways.

God is never fooled by our outward behavior, our willingness to be publicly agreeable when we really have no intention of following through with our word and/or promises.

Are there times when we pay "lip service" to the Gospel, so as not to disappoint someone (or be embarrassed?) but have no intention of opening our hearts to it? When we know we should take seriously the teachings of the Church, do we refuse because our minds are made up and our lives are too comfortable now?

Bottom line: One cannot hide from the eyes of God.

It has been made very clear to us that the lukewarm Christian is not welcome in the kingdom. The thought of being vomited out of the mouth of Jesus pretty much hits home with me. Crawling out of my 'comfort zone' seems like a much better option in life.

On my way home from work tonight, I witnessed a horrible accident and the aftermath. It was pretty obvious that there was at least one fatality, if not more. The train accident this past week served as another reminder of just how fragile our human bodies are. Hurricanes and natural disasters are all too commonplace. We don't know when we will be called home by God.

While we can, it is good to remember we are stewards of God's gifts. We have only this time and place to make a difference and give back what we have been given. The time to begin is now.

Here are some tips on becoming a partner in God's work:

- Many express concern about the hungry in the world, while millions are starving. Feed one.
- Grieving goes on for all the unborn children murdered every day, and those that are born into abusive home situations. Save one.
- In our own country, the number of homeless poor wandering the streets grows. Shelter one.
