The special challenge that has been before us for the last several years is "*Our Journey Into The Future...Together.*" Our Capital Campaign is raising the needed funds for our permanent Church/Sanctuary, our Administration Building and Youth Center, the already purchased five-acre parcel of additional land, the retirement of our debt, and \$1 million for the Diocesan Secondary Education Initiative.

As we continue to focus on *time* and *talent*, we also call special attention to the gift of our *treasure* in order to ensure that St. Thomas More continues to be that "good place" where the Lord's work continues. And we do so, presently, in the midst of a very difficult economy. We need to maintain a healthy "Operations Budget" as we continue to set money aside for our new Church.

This is an extremely exciting and challenging time! We need to continue to pull together more than we ever have in the past. As the Lord's stewards, giving our *time*, *talent*, and *treasure*, the build-out of the St. Thomas More Parish Campus will soon be a reality.

This weekend we welcome very familiar faces to the ambo—The Rudolph Family: Dave, Patty, Randi, Ellie, Tilly, Emma, and David. This family is a model family of St. Thomas More Parish for other households to emulate and follow. They are active in a variety of ministries and the worship of God is the center of their family life.

I welcome the message that they will share with us. I know they will continue to encourage all of us in our efforts to be more faithful Christian stewards.

May our journey through Christian Stewardship Month strengthen all of us to be more faithful stewards, giving back to God in recognition for all that God has done and continues to do for us.

Remember that the Lord is never outdone in generosity!

# CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP Living Stones Managing God's Gifts

Today's Gospel leaves no doubt that God is serious about the treasure entrusted to each of us. Anyone who thinks they don't have any "treasure" of time, talent, and resources, is strongly encouraged to take a better look.

We, like the servants in the Gospel, have been entrusted with God's treasure, the wealth of spiritual and worldly gifts which includes faith, prayer, family, neighbor, earth, sky, skills and talents. Good Christian stewards are like the industrious and reliable servants in the Gospel. They manage these gifts so that they multiply and give a greater return to God. Hoarding is out.

As living stones, we know that Christian stewardship influences our most basic choices: how we spend our free time; how we develop and use the skills and abilities God has given us; and how we earn, save, spend, and share our money.

This is "time, talent, and treasure," to be sure, but it is expressed in terms of daily living, not just as a formula for "volunteerism" or church support.

Christian stewardship should guide our choices: about what we do on the weekend; about the books we read and the movies we see; about how we celebrate Christmas; about how we dispose of our trash; about how we share ourselves and our material possessions with others; about how much we drink; about our relationships; and, yes, and about how much we contribute to the Sunday collection.

As the Rudolph family so beautifully shared with us this weekend, stewardship is a journey that only gets better over time. I have watched this family blossom over the years and it is a beautiful thing to witness. Better still is the fact that we have so many parishioners on the same journey!

The hardest step is the first, and after that all else becomes joyful giving. And *after that* we experience God giving us even more to manage!

As living stones, we have accepted God's gifts with gratitude, cultivated them and are returning them in appropriate places. God expects no less from us than to care for these gifts responsibly.

Next Sunday, the Adult and Handbell Choirs of St. Thomas More will present a concert to benefit North County's Interfaith Community Services.

Interfaith Community Services was founded in 1979 by a handful of diverse faith communities to address the needs of low-income, homeless, and underserved populations.

These faith centers regularly encountered individuals in crisis, but were incapable of meeting their needs. Individually, the faith centers were giving handouts, but by creating Interfaith, they were better able to produce change in the lives of the hungry, substance abusers, the mentally ill, homeless, and the unemployed.

As membership and participation grew, Interfaith evolved into a continuum of programs and services that provides the tools and resources people in crisis need to stabilize and rebuild their lives. These programs are organized into five main areas: basic needs, housing, counseling, employment services, and drug & alcohol rehabilitation. Under these department headings are numerous programs covering a broad spectrum of support. Programs are designed to overlap so that each client receives as many services as necessary for his/her specific situation.

There is no admission to the concert, so BRING A FOOD DONATION which will be collected and transported to the Interfaith centers.






