#### Jesus—The Lamb of God

At every Eucharist, during the Breaking of the Bread, and shortly before the reception of Holy Communion, we pray and call out three times—"Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us."



What John the Baptist announced

near the Jordan River over two thousand years ago, we continue to celebrate: Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away sin and who grants us peace. In his mercy and in that peace, we are privileged to live our lives, set apart by grace and set afire by love for the sake of the world and in the service of the word.

What meaning is contained in this imagery of Jesus as Lamb of God and how does he take away our sin?

As for the title Lamb of God, it seems to have been John, the Gospel writer's, intent that his readers call to mind three lamb figures that were featured in their sacred literatures. First, the title

recalled the paschal lamb; according to the tradition recorded in the Book of Exodus (12:6-13), the Israelites were instructed to sacrifice a lamb and apply its blood to the doorposts and lintels of their homes. By virtue of the lamb's blood, the Israelites were passed over and delivered from death.

Second, the title recalled the figure of the Suffering Servant, described in the fourth song by Isaiah—Isaiah as an innocent, oppressed and condemned lamb who would give his life as an offering for sin (Isaiah 53:7-10).

Third, the title Lamb of God referenced the figure of a lamb featured in Jewish apocalyptic literature; though slain, this lamb conquered sin (Revelation 5:6), became the source of life-giving water (Revelation 7:17; 22:1), and ransomed humankind by its blood (Revelation 5:9).

By featuring John the Baptist acclaiming Jesus as Lamb of God, John, the Gospel Writer, has offered his readers a full-blown description of Jesus' saving mission, as the lamb by whose blood sinners are delivered from death, as the innocent one who has borne the guilt of many, and as the victorious lamb who has forever conquered sin.

As for how our sin is taken away by the Lamb of God: As civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr. set out to overcome racial hatred, he said, "I believe that unarmed truth and unconditional love will have the final word." In the face of the real threat of violence, he drew on the image of Jesus and the words of another mentor, Gandhi, who, approaching his own assassination in 1948, insisted on meeting violence with nonviolence:

"If blood be shed, let it be our blood," Gandhi said. "Cultivate the quiet courage of dying without killing. For man lives freely only by his readiness to die, if need be, at the hands of his brother, never by killing him."

"Lamb of God" is a potent messianic symbol that ties the identity and mission of Jesus to Passover. He will liberate his people not by direct power from this or that political oppressor, but from the power of sin itself. Jesus is the one who takes away the sin of the world by absorbing evil into himself, accepting the suffering that sin causes.

John, the Evangelist, shows the kind of messiah Jesus will be and reveals a radical reading of the scriptural prophecies—that God will come to rescue us from evil, not as a warrior but as the victim of our violence and rejection, who is still ready to forgive!

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, grant us peace...

There are many ways to become involved in this program. In addition to providing the monies for the bus, the program offers travel bags for the children, comfort bags for the caregivers, a photo of each child with his or her parent, and meals for the day (breakfast, snacks on the bus, a special lunch at the prison with their parent and dinner on the way home, and a teddy bear with a letter from their parent and post-event counseling.

-Ezekiel 37:15-19, 22-24a


Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

In this media age, our Catechists are constantly challenged to keep children "engaged" during our Religious Education classes. There are many short DVD's available that would help reinforce the instruction on faith concepts.

Our Will or God's Will?

The first reading today tells one of my favorite stories about Samuel answering God, "Here I am Lord; I come to do Your Will." He heard God's voice, listened and obeyed. He got it!

The Gospel tells of John the Baptist pointing out Jesus to two of John's followers. They immediately left John to follow Jesus, who asked them, "What are you looking for?"

This is a very good time to ask ourselves the same question that Jesus asked. What exactly are we looking for in Christ Jesus? Is this lifetime about us, or about the will of Jesus? Timely question.

Clearly, those who followed Jesus during those early days gave themselves completely to His service. Their lives were devoted to promoting the Gospel, mission and ministry of Jesus Christ. How much suffering they endured and how many faithful martyrs!

Over time many came to feel that one hour (on the dot) for Mass, once a week was all that required of them. That is, after all, the Roman Catholic requirement. "Someone else" could take care of the mission and ministry of Jesus. We are busy with our lives.

I was actually "one of those people" for several years—many years ago—after I had gone through a difficult time in my life. At that point I discontinued all volunteer work for the Church and attended Mass once a week. Period. I always contributed as much as possible financially, but that was it. A modern day martyr!

I share this experience with you so that you know that I have been where some of you appear to be now. Life had treated me unfairly and I decided that God owed me for my pain. I had, after all, been very faithful, followed all the rules and was generous in the areas of time, talent and treasure my entire life . . . only to end up in pain over something that was not my fault. So I quit!

God was incredibly patient with me, in spite of my self-righteous, all-about-me attitude, and made sure that I absorbed the homilies each week during my "one hour" at Mass. Christina was fed.

Then the day came. Many years after Samuel got his message, I got mine and there was no mistaking it.

My message was to come to St. Thomas More. Understand that I had been fighting this message from several friends for over two years. It nearly ruined friendships. I finally came, with the clear declaration to God that I would come, but would not be involved in anyway. I paid my dues already—I even had extra credit!

A month later, I became Finance Council secretary, a position I held for over four years. Hospitality ministry, Christmas Angels, Golf Tournament, and Capital Campaign Follow Up Chairperson followed. Next thing I knew, I was leaving a better paying job to come to work here—and was thankful and delighted about it!

God has a sense of humor and works in mysterious ways.

Jesus gave His life for each of us, in forgiveness for the many ways that we put ourselves first. Consider what He has given us. These days I count my many blessings instead of complaining.

God called me here for a purpose. God called you too . . .

#### Here I am Lord. I've come to do Your Will.

## "Our Journey Into The Future . . . Together" Questions & Answers/January 11, 2009 Update

## 1. I was out of town last weekend. How can I find out what was said?

The presentation and bulletin insert are available on our website: www.stmoside.org, on the Parish Information table on the plaza, and in the Parish Office.

2. When will we break ground to build our Church? When we have enough money on deposit with the Diocese. One-third of the project cost is required. For us, that is \$3.1 million, and we currently have \$2.8 million on deposit.

#### **AND**

Our Operations Income needs to be healthy and in a positive cash flow. Presently, our operational income is below budget. It needs to increase significantly, so that we operate in the black and show consistency over a period of time before we can apply for a Diocesan loan. Building pledges need to be fulfilled and/or renewed, and the commitment to the Operations Budget must deepen.

## 3. Why don't we build a cheaper church so I can see it before I die?

The estimated cost of our Church is completely in line with other recently completed Churches. And none of us know when we are going to die (unless God has told you something not shared with anyone else).

#### 4. Can we build a smaller Church?

The Diocese has requirements for size, and we have been encouraged to build for between 1,100 and 1,200 (in keeping with our CUP.) This is positive future planning.
