praise for my self-giving, or am I willing to make mine an offering "in secret" solely for the good it can produce? Where is God in my life?

- 4. Who have I thought I loved? Was my motive selfgiving or self-centered? When I hear the words "the joy of loving," do I think of what I can get or what I can give to others? How often have I said, in words or deeds, "No Thanks!" to someone who has said to me, "I want to love you"? Does the Golden Rule have any practical place in my life? When have I last prayed for someone who hurt me; acted kindly toward someone who offended me; desired the good for someone who hates me? Where is God in my life?
- 5. When I pray the Lord's Prayer, do I take seriously the words of the petition "Forgive us...as we forgive"? Am I willing to forgive others the wrongs they have done to me? Am I willing to ask forgiveness of wrongs I have done to others? Where is God in my life?
- 6. How open am I to being healed? How open am I to exploring and recognizing and admitting those places in my heart and soul that need healing? Am I humble enough to recognize the role of others in the healing process, or does my ego insist that I "do it all myself"? Where is God in my life?



Lent

A Sense of the Season

The word Lent means springtime. This word comes from the same root as lengthen. Daytime lengthens during Lent. The northern hemisphere turns toward the sun, the source of life, and winter turns into spring. In Hebrew, the word for repentance is the same as the word that means to turn, like the turning of the earth to the sun, like the turning of the soil before planting.

Worship God

"Even now, says the Lord, turn to me." (Joel 2:12) The word sin means separation. We are called to turn from our separate selves, from our sin, to come together in community. Self-denial is the way we express our repentance. In the lengthening brightness from Ash Wednesday until Holy Thursday afternoon, our holy Lent, we turn to God as our source of life.

Self-denial is threefold, advises Matthew. We pray: "Go to your room, close your door, and pray to your Father in private." We fast: "No one must see you are fasting but your Father." We give alms: "Keep your deeds of mercy secret, and your Father who sees in secret will repay you." Through the Lenten exercise of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, we spring-clean our lives, sharpen our senses, put tomorrow in its place, and treasure the day at hand.

Why are there forty days in Lent? It took forty days for sinfulness to drown in the flood before a new creation could inherit the earth. It took forty years for the generation of slaves to die before the freeborn could enter the promised land. For forty days Moses and Elijah and Jesus fasted and prayed to prepare themselves for a life's work.

We keep Lent together. We put aside our businessas-usual to support each other in prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. We turn to God to enlighten us and purify us throughout the lengthening brightness of our holy season of Lent.





CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP The Way of the Cross

"I didn't realize what I was getting into." That is a statement we sometimes make when we find it necessary to back out or turn away from a certain responsibility we have accepted \sim only to find out it wasn't all we'd expected.

This might have been a position to chair a committee at our child's school, or a ministerial position at church. Maybe we accepted thinking this would be an honor, but didn't consider the reality of the sacrifice that would be necessary.

Months later, we resign after realizing how much work was involved, with very little thanks and no honor. (Interesting that this could also fit the description of a mother who has just endured a very difficult pregnancy, followed by a painful birth and a baby with colic! And no one to help or understand; however, mothers don't resign.)

Lent offers us a solid opportunity to honestly and seriously rethink our commitment to follow Jesus and be good Christian stewards of our time and talents.

"My way," Jesus says, "requires you to deny yourself and carry a cross. Are you sure you want to come with me?"

Self-denial does not mean treating ourselves like dirt. Rather it means answering the call of Jesus no matter how difficult it appears. Discipline and self sacrifice can lead to very rewarding results ~ from within ~ that cannot be duplicated by anything this world has to offer.



We are to answer the call of Jesus even when it is not what we had in mind for our lives. We are to be so committed to Christ that we see Him as the bright light that He is, and follow His call, even though it requires sacrifice and a difficult path.

And we are called to do our giving quietly and without expecting, seeking, or hoping for recognition. God is the

only one that counts and God knows all that we do in His name.

- Lent is a good time to reflect upon all that God has given us.
- Lent is a time for occasionally putting down the television clicker ~ really ~ to read scripture or pray in silence.
- Lent is a time to remember that with God, there is no clock. So leave your watch at home when you come to Mass. Remember that God doesn't put a timer on His availability.
- Lent is a time to speak kindly of others and not to place blame.
- Lent is a time to remember that time is made holy (or unholy) by how we use it, either to the glory of God or to the glory of ourselves.
- Lent is a time to remember that we can never hide from God.

God is not only available to us one hour a week.

Pro-Life News Ultrasound Image Saves an Unborn Child's Life

St. Paul, MN (CNS)-Bobbie Hallman was attempting to carry out a simple task-make a poster from an ultrasound image. She ended up saving the life of an unborn child. The drama unfolded at a local print shop. She had agreed to make several posters for use in the Prayer Service for Life at the Cathedral of St. Paul on January 22, which was the 36th anniversary of the Supreme Court decision legalizing abortion. Hallman had brought in a handful of small ultrasound pictures. She showed them to a woman working behind the counter and asked for help making the posters. As she would soon discover, the woman was struggling with an unplanned pregnancy. The woman's eyes welled up and she walked away, but returned to the counter and continued looking at the pictures with Hallman. "She looked at them ... and she said, 'I can't abort this baby," Hallman said. "She said, 'I was thinking about aborting this baby. I thought it was just tissue. And, look at this.' She was pointing to the fingers and the eyes." -The Southern Cross, February 2009
