

OUR NEW OSSUARY

Did you see our Parish's new Ossuary on the plaza after Mass last weekend?

An Ossuary is a container in which a person's Cremains are placed prior to their Funeral Mass. Ossuaries are being used more often in parishes, as the number of funerals with Cremains increases.

When a casket is present for a Funeral Mass, a special cloth called a Pall is placed over the casket representing our Baptismal garment and creating a sense of equality, for in death, we are all the same

> before our God, neither rich nor poor, but equal daughters and sons of God.

> In a similar manner, when Cremains are present, the Ossuary becomes a consistent and dignified container in which the Cremains are placed—be they in an elaborate urn or a simple cardboard box.

> In death, as in life, we are all equally loved and saved by Christ. Stripped of all earthly possessions, we are made rich in Christ. The Pall and the Ossuary are symbols of this equality.

> The Bereavement Team looks forward to using our Parish's new Ossuary at each Funeral Mass where Cremains are present. The Ossuary was crafted at the Parish's request by

parishioner Al Rouse. Thank you Al, for this beautiful new piece of liturgical furniture with which we can further the ministry of St. Thomas More Parish in this time and in this place.

CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP In the Season of Lent

The Gospel story of the transfiguration of Jesus holds many lessons; the most prominent being the transformation of Jesus from simply being perceived as a wise and gifted prophet to the one who has fulfilled the sacred traditions of the Mosaic law and the hope of the prophets, the Messiah, the Christ.

The Lord calls his stewards to participate in His redemptive activity. Heeding this call requires transformation, being willing to renounce patterns of behavior that draw us away from God.

In this coming week , let us pray for the grace to be transformed, so that by our goodness and generosity, we may walk more authentically in the footsteps of Jesus.

In following the path of Jesus, we see that Lent is a special season for the Christian steward to center attention on conversion, one of the first principles of Christian stewardship. It is a time when conversion finds very practical expression in prayer, fasting, and developing habits of greater generosity.

In the current financial crisis, with rising unemployment and a deepening global recession, the Lenten season invites stewards to focus more intensely on their relationship with the Lord and cultivate a greater awareness of those in need. It is because we live in such an increasingly interconnected world, that the poor and vulnerable suffer the worst during these times.



In his annual Lenten message, our Holy Father, Pope Benedict, made clear that fasting from food and detaching oneself from material goods during Lent helps us open our hearts to God and our hands to the poor. "Fasting is an aid to open our eyes to the situation in which so many of our brothers and sisters live."

Lent is also a time to practice almsgiving; to renounce those conveniences and material comforts that keep us from hearing the cries of a fragile world and

find creative ways to respond to the poor. Almsgiving unites our love for God and our neighbor.

As we continue our Lenten journey, let us make a concrete commitment to prayer, fasting and acts of generosity. Let us pray for the wisdom and strength to let go of things that get in the way of our relationship with God; for a strengthening of faith; and for the grace to see that the poor of the world are not strangers, but are our sisters and brothers.
