

A second apprentice raised his hand and said, "Well, tell them there is no hell."

Satan said, "We've tried that too, and it won't work. Sooner or later people realize that mass murderers can't wind up in the same place as Mother Teresa."

Finally, a third apprentice raised his hand and said slowly, "Then tell them—there is no hurry."

And Satan smiled.

We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the master builder and the worker. We are workers, not Master Builders, ministers, not Messiahs. We are prophets of a future not our own. Amen."


