Abortion, Pro-life and Politics

When the national elections were approaching last year, a number of people asked for my advice/opinion regarding the question: "Father, for whom should I vote? Which presidential candidate is in keeping with the 'Pro-life' stance of the Catholic Church?"

Oftentimes, I am asked the question as to whether Catholic political leaders who are "pro-choice," should be denied Communion because of their stance.

And, most recently, I have been questioned as to whether President Obama should have been invited to deliver the Commencement Address at Notre Dame and also receive an honorary degree.

The discussion and debate on these issues are vigorous, and they are taking place in all circles of life within the Catholic Community. Even the Bishops of the United States (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops – USCCB) are not in agreement as to how to best witness our Church's "Pro-life" stance, which is being for life from "womb to tomb."

Pastor's Column (Continued from page 1)

It is important to remember that those of us on both sides of the debate are "pro-life." That is not in question. Our disagreement comes in terms of strategy as to how best witness this position in American politics and life.

Recently, a Jesuit theologian, Rev. John P. Langan, was invited to speak at a seminar on Capitol Hill, held at the Dirksen Senate Office Building. This event was sponsored by The Catholic University of America's Life Cycle Institute.

His talk was reported in the National Catholic Reporter. The article is included in today's Bulletin.

His comments resonate with my own thinking and I am truly encouraged by the challenge that he extends to the Catholic Church in forging a road that will help us better witness to all Life Issues, including, most importantly, the issue of abortion.

This article is meant to be my response to the many people who ask, "Father, what do you think?"

My prayer is, that in sharing this with you, we continue, all of us together, to dialogue and find ways that will help us best witness to Life for this time and this place.

In Support of the Employee Free Choice Act by Bishop Gabino Zavala


"....The Employee Free Choice Act intends to address and counter some of the more egregious violations of workers' dignity

that are today pervasive for so many workers. This legislation would allow workers to form and join unions as certainly and as freely as they might join a church community or a civic organization. Workers would be able to cast their vote for a union from the safety and security of their own homes simply by signing and submitting union authorization cards. Additionally, the legislation would impose just penalties on employers who attempt to illegally interfere with this democratic right of their employees.







During the decades of the sixties and seventies, the baby boom generation watched a lot of television. The devotion of this audience helped make the show *Bewitched* a perennial favorite. Thus, they were granted some sense of the differences between immortals and mortals, at least as conveyed by a popular sitcom in which Samantha Stephens was a witch and her husband Darrin was a mortal.

The more recent popularity of the Harry Potter series of fantasy novels depicts stories populated with a variety of characters, a few of whom are constantly preoccupied with immortality.

The popular works of 20th century fantasy writers such as J. R. Tolkien and C.S. Lewis (*The Lord of the Rings* and *The Chronicles of Narnia* among them) rely on both mortal and immortal characters in developing complex themes and plots.

For centuries there has also been a fixation on works about kings and queens, princes and princesses. There is something about the struggles and triumphs of royalty that the public finds fascinating. Perhaps we get caught up in all of this because we are neither immortal fantasy characters nor royalty. We're able to experience a brief escape from our current reality through these fantasies.

On this feast of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, *it is wise to reflect on the facts*, and the ultimate beauty and gratification that comes from life as God has gifted it to us.

The Bible speaks of both mortals and royalty. "Give thanks to the Lord, who is good, whose love endures forever. Better to take refuge in the Lord than to put one's trust in prices."

The writer of Psalm 118 points out that all men and women are mortal, and a few are princes. But, only the Lord is worthy of our trust. We may look to the immortal and the royal for adventure, but we pray to God for ultimate answers, solutions, guidance and comfort. The abilities of humans, even those with royal blood, pale when compared to the Lord of all.

It is always awe inspiring to note the paradoxes that run through



Christ's message. It is why it rings so true—who would preach a message so contrary to the ways of this world but God?

The more we give up for God (to the Church and community, of time and resources), the more we receive from God! And not just in the next life, but in this life too.

Those who practice Christian Stewardship as a way of life say they have found the meaning and purpose of life: serving others and giving of themselves. They are the happiest and most fulfilled people, certainly more so than those who've focused on getting as many material goods and "toys" as they can.

By their worthy deeds in this life, people also make a limited but real human contribution to building up the kingdom. They do so with an eye to present happiness and also to the fulfillment, which the kingdom—and themselves as part of it—will enjoy in the life to come.
