Pastor's Column

Thoughts on Labor Day Weekend

"On this Labor Day weekend, let me offer for your reflection ten 'habits of the heart' suggested by Robert Bellah in his book of the same name, relating to work in the world, which is of course, where most of us spend most of our time. He suggests we be:

- Gentle in treating the environment
- Just in our treatment of our fellow workers
- Wise in our use of creation's resources
- Sensitive to others as they pursue their vocations and tasks
- Careful in the use of technology
- Frugal in energy consumption
- Vigilant in preventing waste
- Fair in determining prices
- Honest in the ways we promote the sale of our products
- Equitable in earning a profit

These principles would go far toward establishing a wise and orderly universe, but they are only a start.

Maddeningly, as Catholics and followers of Christ, we are held to a crazy and worldly unwise standard, a both/and principle that admits that good sometimes comes from bad, that bad things do happen to good people, that pain and suffering are not always either avoidable or meaningful, that our enemies must be loved, that healthy lifestyles do not guarantee longevity, that some poor people are lazy but still deserving of our help etc. etc. What a counter-intuitive reality!

As my fourteen year old son would say, 'get used to it!' Ours is a relational God, who formed a community, knowing we would need both laws and exceptions to them and most importantly, knowing we would need a faith community to deal with life among a whole bunch of free-will endowed creatures.

The principle certainty that is ours is that our God 'is near... whenever we call' and the main assurance we have is that God, through Jesus, knows and loves us completely.

Help Support Your Neighbors in Need.

Did you know that Catholic Charities Emergency Services has a Food Resource Center Vista? In addition to providing food, the Center helps clients apply for food stamps and makes shelter, medical, counseling, job training, and financial assistance referrals. In June we averaged 94 families a day providing service for 2,210 individuals!

None of this would be possible without volunteer support. There are immediate openings for volunteer Intake Workers, Food Distribution Assistants, and Drivers. The hours are Monday-Friday, 9:00am-12:00pm and 1:00-4:00pm. Training is provided.

Can't make an on site shift? There are ways to help off site. The Center needs administrative supplies such as copy paper, stamps, bulletin boards, and HP2035n ink cartridges. Also janitorial supplies such as 55-gallon trash bags, paper towels, and carpet cleaning services. Then there are logistic supplies such as grocery bags, zip lock baggies, and the monthly use of a truck with a lift gate. CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP Glory and Thankfulness Are Hallmarks of Stewardship

"Glory to God in the highest and peace to His people on earth" is the phrase that stayed with me from Mass a few weeks ago. Afterwards, a friend standing next to me in the coffee line at the parish center remarked that we rarely read of thankfulness in the newspaper.

The words, "glory" and "thankfulness" set the tone for my week.

We mortals witness divine glory in nature, in the order of things, in the beauty surrounding us, in the creation of our bodies, soul and intellect.
