# **Pastor's Column**

#### Remembering Those Who Have Gone Before Us In Death

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of All Saints, and on Monday, November 2, we celebrate the Feast of All Souls. We take time in a special way to remember all those who have gone before us in death.

The experience of the death of a loved one is always a "reality check" for us. As we grieve for the one who has gone, we also grieve for ourselves. If we are honest with ourselves, we know that the tears we shed are not just for the one who died, the tears are for us, as we come face to face with our own mortality.

We are mindful that we are a pilgrim people who are on a journey of faith. We have come from somewhere and we are going somewhere. Earth is not our home. We are aliens in a foreign land, and we have our citizenship in heaven.

*"Each time that we experience the death of a loved one, just a little bit more of eternity breaks into our existence."* (Fr. Henri Nouwen) These words challenge us to make sure that we do not allow ourselves to let the deaths of our loved ones be in vain.

Hopefully, each time we grieve a loved one, we become more open to life, more loving, more caring, and more open to the eternal life that awaits us.

As we remember and look to the past, we look forward to what lies ahead for us. May our loving memories this weekend spur us on to a deeper respect and love for this gift of life given to us.

I share with you this prayer from an unknown source:

#### We Remember Them

In the rising of the sun and in its going down... In the blowing of the wind and in the chill of winter... In opening of buds and in the warmth of summer... In the rustling of leaves and in the beauty of autumn... In the beginning of the year and when it ends... When we are weary and in need of strength... When we are lost and sick at heart... When we have joys we yearn to share... So long as we live, they too shall live for they are part of us and part of you, O God, as We remember them!



#### Celebration of the Eucharist During the Flu Season

Several people have approached me about the need to take special precautions regarding human contact during the Liturgy in the flu season.

Everyone is reminded that the "holding of hands" during the Lord's Prayer is not a requirement. It has always been an option for the members of the assembly. The sign of peace can be given in a variety of ways: the handshake, a hug, or a bow to the people around you. During Communion, drinking the Precious Blood from the common Chalice has always been an option for the members of the assembly.

We will continue to do what we do, but I would ask that everyone simply use common sense.

If you have any kind of cold or flu symptoms, you may avoid holding hands during the Our Father. Instead, raise and open your hands in the "prayer position." At the Sign of Peace, you may refrain from the handshake. Instead give a gentle, respectful bow to the people around you. During Communion, you may choose to refrain from sharing in the Cup.

Actually, these options are open to all members of the assembly at all times, not just during the flu season.

I ask that all members of the assembly be respectful in the various choices that individuals will make in regard to these liturgical options.


#### Women's Guild News

# So Wonderfully Made

In my basement, just west of the washer and the dryer and the folding table, a coffin sits atop wooden blocks. It is covered with a bright quilt my grandmother pieced and sewed and, over that, a white blanket to catch the dust. The coffin looks more like a cradle than I expected it would, and somehow that comforts me. It was built for my mother, now 91 and frail, and though she might outlive my husband and me, I expect we will be the ones to tuck her in and touch her hands for the last time as she makes her way home.

My son-in-law, Geoffrey Keating, a doctoral student in theology at Notre Dame and a fine furniture maker, spent the last year crafting the coffin out of walnut. He chose the wood, measuring the boards, cutting and planing them, matching grains and colors. There are no metal nails or screws to mar the surfaces; every joint is hand-cut and fitted, wood against wood. He sanded and oiled the walnut; it glows softly and feels smooth to the touch. In the sides he carved long handrails for the grandsons who, I hope, will bear my mother's body from her home to the church and to the graveyard. Geoffrey tells me he prayed for my mother as he worked.

All the surfaces are plain, except for a single inlaid cross of cherry wood in the coffin lid. "The cross," Geoffrey told me, "will go with her, all the way." That seems right to me, as I consider Christ keeping his baptismal promise to my mother as he keeps the promise to all the baptized, to be with her, wherever she goes, even down into the grave. Saint Paul asks the first-century

Roman church, "Then what can separate us from the love of Christ?" And he answers:

"For I am convinced that there is nothing in death or life, in the realm of spirits or superhuman powers, in the world as it is or the world as it shall be, in the forces of the universe, in heights or depths—nothing in all creation that can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Geoffrey has built something beautiful, and I know there will be those who find it odd that we consign such beauty—so skillfully wrought, so long in the making—to the earth. The fine walnut coffin will be covered in dirt and left to decay.

But so, too, will my mother's body—so skillfully wrought, so wonderfully made—be sent down into the earth and left there, to return to the earth, as she

awaits the resurrection of the dead. Geoffrey's work on the coffin is both an imitation of and homage to the work God does in and for and with each one of us.

I remember the patristic teaching: "What Christ assumes, Christ redeems." By taking on human flesh, becoming one like us in all things but sin, Christ redeems and makes holy all human flesh, however frail, however broken and worn. My mother receives Christ in the Eucharist each Sunday. She is a God-bearer. It is fitting that she should be borne to her grave in a worthy vessel, strong and well-made.

Christ chose Mary as the cradle in which he would be carried, as the ark in which he would be borne. And then Christ chose us to be vessels as well,

carrying his body and blood into all the world. In him we are made holy.

I carry my soiled sheets and towels down to the laundry and put them in the washing machine. Then I stop and uncover the coffin and run my hands along its sides. I remember how, in the months before each baby was born, we would go down to the basement and look for the bassinet and the crib, stored away, waiting for

the coming day. It was good to know they were there and would be ready when our new son or daughter arrived. As my due date drew nearer, we dusted and cleaned the wicker bassinet and oiled the wooden crib. We found the box of sheets and receiving blankets and laundered them in sweet-smelling baby soap. We were preparing for the hard and wondrous time of birth.

I promised my mother we would wake her at home. I needed the coffin here, at home, to keep my promise. So now I am preparing for the hard and wondrous time when Christ, who called my mother, will call her to the new and eternal Jerusalem. And there, where Lazarus is poor no longer, may she find eternal rest.





The following excerpt from Things Hidden: Scripture as Spirituality by Richard Rohr provided me with such a fresh

Every time you pray, it's God in you telling you to pray. You wouldn't even desire to pray except for God in you. It's God in you that loves God, that desires God, that seeks God (see Romans 8: 14-27). Every time you choose God on some level, God has in the previous nanosecond just chosen you, and you have somehow allowed yourself to be chosen—and responded back! (John 15:16)

We don't know how to say yes by ourselves. We just "second the motion!" There is a part of you that always said yes to God, it is the Holy Spirit within you. God first says "yes" inside of us and we say, "Oh yeah," thinking it comes from us! In other words, God rewards us for letting God reward us. Think about that, maybe even for the rest of your life.

By the end of the Bible we see the New Jerusalem, descending, unearned, undesired, and unprepared for (Revelation 21:2). It's totally a gift from God. After an entire Bible of warring, arguing, protecting, earning, competing, buying and selling of God, finally the gift is simply given and handed over to us. The New Jerusalem descends from the heavens freely and without warrant.

We all find ourselves with this surprising ability to love God and to desire love from God, often for no reason in particular. That doesn't happen every day, truly, but hopefully more often as you learn to trust and rest in life. Moments of unconditional love sort of slip out of you and no one is more surprised than you when it happens! But when it does, you always know you are living inside of a Larger Life than your own. You know, henceforth, that your life is not about you but you are about God.

# CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP Continuing The Mission of Jesus

Take a moment to reflect on this beautiful quote from Melody Beattie:

"Gratitude unlocks the fullness of life. It turns what we have into enough, and more. It turns denial into acceptance, chaos to order, confusion to clarity. It can turn a meal into a feast, a house into a home, a stranger into a friend. Gratitude makes sense of our past, brings peace for today, and creates a vision for tomorrow."



How do we gratefully continue the mission and ministry of Jesus? What percentage does God ask of me as a good Christian Steward?

*All* of my heart, *all* of my soul, *all* of my mind, and *all* of my strength. At first, and sometimes often, this is not an easy task.

We are blessed to have examples of those who have gone before us.

An inspiring stewardship saint from the month of October is  $\sim$ 

St. Teresa of Avila, Doctor of the Church, who founded the Discalced Carmelite religious community of women. She was one of the first two women (with Catherine of Siena) to be named Doctor of the Church because of her extraordinary contribution to Christian mysticism and spirituality.

Born in 1515 to a large, aristocratic Castilian family in Avila, Spain, Teresa entered the Carmelite monastery at the age of 20 years. (*Have you ever noticed how many saints left a life of wealth to pursue a life of complete service to God?*)

St. Teresa spent several relatively average years in the convent before she experienced a vision that changed her life forever. In 1554, while praying before a statue of the crucified Christ, Teresa underwent a profound spiritual conversion.

Then, in 1567, she met St. John of the Cross, who she enlisted to extend her reform into the male side of the Carmelite community.

For St. Teresa, the test of growth in the spiritual life was the extent one responded to Christ's stewardship call to love one's neighbor. Teresa died on October 4, 1582, and was canonized in 1622. She is the patron saint of Spain.

Below is one of my favorite prayer-poems by St. Teresa of Avila:

"Christ has no body now on earth but yours.

No hands, but yours. No feet, but yours. Yours are the eyes through which the compassion of Christ must look out on this world."



Dear Lord, direct my hands, feet, eyes and heart to continue your work on earth.
