We hear much about "coming home" for the holidays. My Christmas greetings and prayers for you and yours are contained in these words from Fr. Henri Nouwen:

Coming Home

There are two realities to which you must cling. First, God has promised that you will receive the love you have been searching for. And second, God is faithful to that promise. So stop wandering around. Instead, come home and trust that God will bring you what you need. Your whole life you have been running about, seeking the love you desire. Now it is time to end that search. Trust that God will give you that all-fulfilling love and will give it in a human way.

Celebration of the Eucharist **During the Flu Season**

Several people have approached me about the need to take special precautions regarding human contact during the Liturgy in the flu

Everyone is reminded that the "holding of hands" during the Lord's Prayer is not a requirement. It has always been an option for the members of the assembly. The sign of peace can be given in a variety of ways: the handshake, a hug, or a bow to the people around you. During Communion, drinking the Precious Blood from the common Chalice has always been an option for the members of the assembly.

We will continue to do what we do, but I would ask that everyone simply use common sense.

If you have any kind of cold or flu symptoms, you may avoid holding hands during the Our Father. Instead, raise and open your hands in the "prayer position." At the Sign of Peace, you may refrain from the handshake. Instead give a gentle, respectful bow to the people around you. During Communion, you may choose to refrain from sharing in the Cup.

Actually, these options are open to all members of the assembly at all times, not just during the flu season.

I ask that all members of the assembly be respectful in the various choices that individuals will make in regard to these liturgical options.

The Christmas Season

Despite the appearance of decorations in September, Christians have always kept Christmas as a season from December 25 until January 6 (the traditional Epiphany). The church today extends the celebration until the feast of the Baptism of the Lord—the Sunday after Epiphany—January 10.


Next to the annual celebration of the paschal mystery—the Triduum and Easter season—the church holds most sacred the memorial of Christ's birth and early manifestations. This is the purpose of the Christmas season.

More than just "Jesus' birthday," the Christmas season is a time for remembering and reveling in the nativity of Christ, the revelation of Christ to the Jewish shepherds and to the Gentile magi, Christ's baptism by John in the Jordan, and Christ changing water into wine at the wedding in Cana. In all these saving events, we know that "the Word is made flesh and dwells among us."

How can we keep Christmas not just as a day, but as a season? Keep the tree up (and watered!), shining bright until the Baptism of the Lord. Sing carols and read the scriptures every day. Sing or say the prayer of the angels: Glory in heaven and peace on earth, now and forever. Amen!



Mary kept all these things, and pondered them in her heart. How many things a mother keeps, you think as you look about . . . Baby shoes. Battered little first books. Scrapbooks stuffed with pictures and souvenirs. A daughter's first prom dress . . . Such foolish things only a mother would cling to. All mothers, mothers like Mary, who have gone before—and mothers to come . . .

You feel a renewed kinship for that girl—Mother Mary. You wonder what reminders of His childhood did Mary, perhaps, save. His first little garments, or the sandals in which He learned to walk? A wooden toy cart perhaps, that His father had made for him in the carpenter shop? And what memories did they bring back to her later to ponder in her heart?

Christmas is for keeps. It comes each year and will go on forever. And along with Christmas belong the keepsakes and the customs. Those humble, everyday things that a mother clings to with her hands and ponders, like Mary, in the secret spaces of her heart. ~

I am constantly inspired by the generosity demonstrated by all generations at St. Thomas More. This faith community is truly incredible! Thank you for your efforts and ongoing renewal!
