priority. Please know that I am aware of that and know that, as your Pastor, you strengthen not only my ministry, but also, my Faith, as I see parishioners "being serious" about their Faith-life. Your intentionality "feeds" me, as a pastor, as I, hopefully, feed you through leading you in the celebration of the Eucharist and breaking open the Word of God with you through my homilies. Of course, in all these efforts, we know that it is the Lord who feeds us. We are His instruments.

Thank you to each and every one of you who helped to make the celebration of these liturgical seasons so prayerful and meaningful. Know that my heart is filled with gratitude. I will not single out any persons or groups. When that is done, so often, someone is missed. You know who you are what you have done. I know that the Lord is pleased!

As all of us make the necessary efforts and sacrifices in order to continue to live our community life here prayerfully and meaningfully, be mindful that we do so for the Lord, in order to give our God praise and thanksgiving.

At times, our efforts may be taken for granted or go on noticed. We may be hurt or discouraged at times. Yes, it is nice to be recognized and acknowledged, but that is not the reason that we do what we do. All of our individual efforts come together in a community effort to give our Loving Creator praise and thanksgiving. When we keep that focus, our hurt and discouragement will dissipate.

One of the many challenges that we face as a community is to preserve this sense of intentionality. As we continue to grow in numbers, we must resolve to make greater efforts in the area of hospitality, welcome, and personal invitation into the life of the community. I know that we can and will do that!

As we renew our Baptismal Promises this weekend, we, once again, "intention" ourselves to follow the Lord Jesus and to be active members of His Body as the Church of St. Thomas More.





The message of the Christmas Season called us to live the *whole* Paschal Mystery: Christ's birth, death *AND* resurrection . . . each part giving meaning to the other.

The following story from Max Lucado gives practical insight for living the Paschal Mystery in our daily lives:

Once there was a man whose life was one of misery. The days were cloudy, and the nights were long. Henry didn't want to be unhappy, but he was. With the passing of the years, his life had changed. His children were grown. The neighborhood was different. The city seemed harsher.

He was unhappy. He decided to ask his minister what was wrong.

"Am I unhappy for some sin I have committed?"

"Yes," the wise pastor replied. "You have sinned."

"And what might that sin be?"

"Ignorance," came the reply. "The sin of ignorance. One of your neighbors is the Messiah in disguise, and you have not seen him."

The old man left the office stunned. "The Messiah is one of my neighbors?" He began to think whom it might be.

Tom the butcher? No, he's too lazy. Mary, my cousin down the street? No, too much pride. Aaron the paperboy? No, too indulgent. The man was confounded. Every person he knew had defects. But one was the Messiah. He began to look for Him.

He began to notice things he hadn't seen. The grocer often carried the sacks to the cars of older ladies. *Maybe he is the Messiah*. The officer at the corner always had a smile for the kids. *Could it be*? And the young couple who'd moved next door. *How kind they are to their cat. Maybe one of them.*...

With time he saw things in people he'd never seen. And with time his outlook on life began to change. The bounce returned to his step. His eyes took on a friendly sparkle. When others spoke he listened. After all, he might be listening to the Messiah. When anyone asked for help, he responded; after all this might be the Messiah needing assistance.

The change of attitude was so significant that someone asked him why he was so happy. "I don't know," he answered. "All I know is that things changed when I started looking for God."

Now, that's curious. The old man saw Jesus because he didn't know what he looked like. The people in Jesus' day missed him because they thought they did.

CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP Answering Our Baptismal Call

On this feast of the Baptism of our Lord, we are reminded that we, who are baptized in Christ must follow His example and use our time and resources in the service of God and neighbor.

Jesus, whom God called "my beloved Son," is also the "servant" of whom Isaiah speaks in the first reading. Our Lord was sent in our human likeness and set a perfect example for us to follow.

The following New Year's Prayer is powerful, and resounds with the reminder of the life Jesus lived to save us from our sins. God loves us unconditionally and desires for us to fully live the gift of life bestowed upon us. This may not be "ship we signed up for" but life has meaning beyond what we often see at the time.

- Not by shielding you from all sorrows and pain, But by strengthening you to bear it, as it comes;
- Not by making your path easy, But by making you sturdy to travel any path;
- Not by taking hardships from you, But by taking fear from your heart;
- Not by granting you unbroken sunshine, But by keeping your face bright, even in the shadows;
- Not by making your life always pleasant, But by showing you when people and their causes need you most, and by making you anxious to be there to help.

In his book, "David: Man of Passion and Destiny," Charles Swindoll passes along some earthbound wisdom.

When God says "no" it is not necessarily discipline or rejection. It may simply be redirection. You have pursued His will; you have wanted to do His will. You threw that piece of wood on the fire, and you saw your selfish desires go up in smoke.

With all good intentions you said, "By God's grace I am going to pursue this." And here you are, thirty, forty or maybe only five years later, and it has not worked out . . .

The thing we have to do in our walk with God is listen carefully from day to day. Not just go back to some decision and say, "That is it forever, regardless."

We need to look at it each day, keep it fresh, keep the fire hot, keep it on the back burner, saying, "Lord, is this Your will? Is this Your plan? If it is not, make me sensitive to it. Maybe you are redirecting my life."

God has all kinds of creative ways to use us ~ ways we can't even imagine and certainly can't see up there around the next bend in the road. We need to always be *sensitive and open* to God's plan.




