

#### Our Lenten Penance Service: The Sacrament of Reconciliation—God's Unconditional Love for Us!

This was my Pastor's Column a few months ago as we prepared to celebrate our Advent Reconciliation Service. This week we will close out our Parish Mission with our Lenten Reconciliation Service. I thought it would be good to run this again!

In recent years, a name change has taken place with the "Sacrament of Confession." We no longer call the act "Confession," but rather "Reconciliation" and/or "Penance."

This name change better reflects what happens in this celebration. We do not go to the priest just to list our sins, have them forgiven, and receive a penance; but rather, and most importantly, we come to the priest to celebrate the forgiveness of God that we experience in our lives. We come to the Sacrament with a sense of joy for what God has already done in our lives and what God continues to do—showering us with unconditional love.

The verbalization of our sins, the verbalization of the words of absolution, and the acceptance of a penance are steps in the

process of celebrating God's forgiveness and unconditional love for us

If we are open to God's love, we begin to experience the many ways in which God forgives us our sins in the daily occurrences

When we ask forgiveness from someone we have offended, our sins are forgiven. When we accept the forgiveness of another, our sins are forgiven. Each time we talk to God in the silence of our hearts and sincerely seek forgiveness from God, our sins are forgiven. Each time we celebrate the Eucharist, we hear the words of the priest shortly before the reception of Holy Communion—"Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world! Happy are we! We are called to His supper!"—our sins are forgiven.

So why go to the priest? We do so in order to celebrate the forgiveness of God we experience in our daily lives, to ritualize (Continued on page 2)

it, sacramentalize it, and as in all things, to place our lives and God's involvement in our lives within the context of the Church, the Body of Christ.

The priest "stands in" for the community. As we verbalize our sins, we are mindful that there is no such thing as a personal sin. Our sins, no matter how personal we may think them to be, affect others—"No Man Is an Island." We live in community. Our lives always touch the lives of others.

Telling our sins, hearing ours sins from our own lips, helps us to be real and to acknowledge our weakness and our dependence upon God. It is so easy to rationalize our sinfulness when we talk to ourselves "in our heads." It is an entirely different experience when we hear ourselves verbalize our sinfulness. Those sins become much more real! We become much more aware and sensitive of our responsibilities to others.

The priest "stands in" for Christ. Hearing the words of absolution, the forgiveness of God, from the lips of the priest is indeed comforting. You know how wonderful it feels when a family member or friend says, "I love you!" In the Sacrament of Reconciliation we allow God to say those words to us in and through the person of the priest.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is not something to be feared but to be celebrated with trust and confidence because of God's unconditional love for us.

On Thursday, March 4, at 7:00pm our Parish celebrates its Lenten Communal Penance Service. Many priest/confessors will be available for you. They will be in Church waiting for you so that through the words of absolution God will once again say to

"I forgive you and I love you unconditionally!"

#### What is Get On The Bus?

Get On The Bus brings children and their guardians/caregivers from throughout the state of California to visit their mothers and fathers in



P=prison. An annual event, *Get On The Bus* offers free transportation for the children and their caregivers to the prison, provides travel bags for the children, comfort care bags for the caregivers, a photo of each child with his or her parent, and meals for the day (snacks on the bus, lunch at the prison, and dinner on the way home) all at no cost to the children's family. On the bus trip home, following a four-hour visit, each child receives a teddy bear with a letter from her/his parent and post-event counseling.

#### Who's Who—Candidates

#### Who are the Candidates we hear so much about in church?

Catechumens are people who have never been baptized and are now preparing to be baptized, confirmed, and welcomed to the Lord's table at the Easter Vigil through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (commonly called the RCIA). Often there are others who have already been baptized and who now desire to become fully initiated members of the Catholic church. They, too, undergo a period of formation based on the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults; they are called candidates because they are discerning a call to complete their initiation.

Like those whom we welcome into our own families through marriage or adoption, the candidates bring

with them a wide varietv experiences and traditions. Some another faith tradition: into communion with the church. Normally thev confirmed

receive their first communion at the time of their reception. (In the past, these candidates were often referred to as "converts," but that term is not appropriate if they were previously baptized. Baptism is the sacrament of conversion. Suggesting that

Other candidates may have been baptized Catholic, usually as infants, but received no further formation in the Catholic faith. They, too, are preparing for Confirmation and First Communion.


The length of the preparation period varies depending on the background and spiritual needs of the individual. Those who have taken an active role in their church in the past may need a relatively short period of preparation. Others may need a more extended period of formation and catechesis, similar to that of the

> catechumens. both cases, active participation in the Sunday liturgy, prayerful reading of the scriptures and an increasing awareness of the church's teachings and mission are the primary means of preparation.

At the end of this period

preparation, those Candidates who were baptized in another tradition are welcomed into the Catholic church through a simple act of reception. All the Candidates are then confirmed and welcomed to the Lord's table for the first time. This celebration ideally takes place at the Easter Vigil, but may happen on any appropriate Sunday during the year.

The newly confirmed now take their place in the assembly and continue to do what Christians have done throughout the ages: offer thanks and praise to God and spread the good news of God's love and reconciliation.

#### Listening and Answering

God was in the cloud and spoke, saying, "This is my chosen Son; listen to him." How do we listen to Jesus as he continues to speak his message of loving our neighbor as we love ourselves, and asks us to help provide necessities and comfort to those in need?

#### **Enough Is Enough**

A concert pianist one evening gave a stellar performance, and received a standing ovation as the curtain fell. Afterwards, a reception was held in his honor. As the crowd gathered around him, one woman, who was a pretty good pianist in her own right gushed, "Oh, I'd give anything to play like you do!"

The concert pianist looked at her and slowly replied, "No, I don't believe you would."

A hush fell over the room. "Yes, I would," insisted the woman.

The pianist continued, "No, you really wouldn't. If you wanted to pay the price, you could play as well . . . possibly even better than I. It has taken me seven or eight hours a day, seven days a week for at least seven years to play as well as I do. You would give anything to play as well as I do, except the time. When you say you would give anything, you really don't mean it."

Are we really willing to do whatever it takes to help? Or, do we sometimes think, "Enough is enough. No more help. No more for the missions. No more time for the Church. It has to stop!"

But as Jesus' actions make clear enough is never enough. Jesus is filled with compassion (as we usually are too) and then he acts on that compassion by being willing to help. The willingness to help, however, must be reinforced by our doing whatever it takes to help others.


