Pastor's Column

Health Care Reform Update

On Thursday, February 25, the much-anticipated bipartisan "summit" on health-care reform between Congressional leaders and President Obama was held.

Health-care reform, in the background for awhile, is once again taking center stage.


In preparation for the "summit," the following letter emerged from the leadership of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) to Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid:

Dear Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid,

On behalf of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), we strongly urge the congressional leaders from both parties meeting on February 25, 2010 to commit themselves to enacting genuine health care reform that will protect the life, dignity, consciences, and health of all. It is time to set aside partisan divisions and special interest pressures to find ways to enact genuine reform. We encourage

the Administration and Congress to work in a bipartisan manner marked by political courage, vision, and leadership.

The Catholic bishops have long supported adequate and affordable health care for all, because health care is a basic human right. As pastors and teachers, we believe genuine health care reform must protect human life and dignity from conception to natural death, not threaten them, especially for the voiceless and vulnerable. We believe health care legislation must respect the consciences of providers, taxpayers, purchasers of insurance, and others, not violate them. We believe universal coverage should be truly universal and should not be denied to those in need because of their condition, age, where they come from, or when they arrive here. Providing affordable and accessible health care that clearly reflects these fundamental principles is a public good, moral imperative, and urgent national priority.

The U.S. Catholic bishops continue to urge the House and Senate to adopt legislation that:

- Ensures access to quality, affordable, life-giving health care for all;
- Retains longstanding requirements that federal funds not be used for elective abortions or plans that include them, and effectively protects conscience rights; and,
- Protects the access to health care that immigrants currently have and removes current barriers to access.

For details on the bishops' positions on health care, please visit www.usccb.org/healthcare.

We will continue to work vigorously to advance true health care reform that ensures affordability and access, keeps longstanding prohibitions on abortion funding, upholds conscience rights, and addresses the health needs of immigrants. Dialogue should continue and no legislation should be finalized until and unless these basic moral criteria are met. Without commenting on specific proposals that may be brought to the summit, we will work to ensure that legislation meets these criteria and will oppose legislation that does not meet them. We hope and pray that the Congress and the country will come together around genuine health care reform that protects the life, dignity, consciences, and health of all.

Our Journey Into The Future ... Together! Phase II ~ This is it! Marathon Mile 22-The Final Push

In our 25th anniversary year, we've been blessed to date with 35% of our Parish, plus four gifts from non-parishioners, pledging \$1,119,035, which brings us over halfway to our \$2M goal to build our permanent Church.

We are in a similar situation now to marathon runners. My daughter has run several marathons in support of leukemia patients. When she ran the marathons, all went well until the 22nd mile. That is the point where she, and several others, hit a wall. They were "spent and exhausted" and felt like they couldn't run anymore. Some quit, while others somehow dug in and finished they race. They were inspired as they were running for a cause!

We have several parishioners who have been faithfully funding the vision of our permanent Church for 25 years. Some of these generous parishioners have hit a wall financially and are unable to donate as they once did.

Other parishioners have lost jobs and are financially stretched. Thanks to those who have responded, even though they are unable to pledge at this time.

Over 600 households have yet to respond in some way. We need YOUR help! For those who are able, please consider donating \$100/month or more.

On a certain level, we have hit the 22-mile marathon wall in our 22nd month of Phase II. Please realize that our work is not finished and we need to dig in and finish this race during this **one-time** window of opportunity.

Five years into the Journey

Upon joining this faith community five years ago as your Director of Music and Coordinator of Liturgical Ministries, I crafted a vision for music ministry at St. Thomas More. It has held up, and I share these foundational ideas again as we continue our musical journey.

Music Ministry at the St. Thomas More Is...

...God-centered

"Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to him with songs of praise!"

-Psalm 95:2 (NRSV)

...Inclusive

The doors are open. Everyone may participate in the ministry.

... Appropriate

Music presented in liturgies will be offered in support of the scripture appointed for the day or season, or in support of the message of the homily. On other occasions, it will support the reason for the gathering.

...Eclectic

Our Parish is comprised of people who represent many parts of the cultural, religious, and social spectra of our community. It therefore follows that our ministry must be varied in order to reach as many of these different backgrounds as possible. While we will not be able to reach everyone all the time, we



will make every effort to touch most of the people as often as practically possible.

Varying musical approaches will be used: including the use of vocalists and instrumentalists available from within the Parish as well as, on occasion, guest musicians from outside the Parish who might be brought in to fulfill a specific need not available from within.

Varying musical styles and genres will be used, including: music from different historical periods that we might both celebrate our music past and explore today's creativity; and music from other cultures and in other languages as befits the global nature of our church (non-Englishlanguage pieces will always be translated).

...Loving

Choirs and other music ensembles are social entities, and as such they will provide a loving and supportive environment in which people involved in these groups might flourish spiritually and emotionally.

...Educational

Each person involved with the ministry will continually be presented with the "tools of the trade" that they may become more able to understand the craft of music -making. This teaching will be both overt in the form of instructional moments during rehearsals and more subtle using other behind-the-scenes methods.

...Ecumenical

Music provides the opportunity for churches to come together to celebrate our oneness in God in spite of ongoing and sometimes divisive differences. We will participate in musical activities that help to bridge this gap among Christian denominations whenever possible.

The St. Thomas More RCIA Team would like to introduce the catechumen and candidates sent to the Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion with Bishop Robert H. Brom in San Diego on February 21, 2010.

The Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion calls all the catechumens (the unbaptized), candidates (those who have received only Baptism), and the faithful into a time of intense preparation, by prayer and spiritual recollection, for the celebration and/or renewal of Baptism at the Easter Vigil.

This step moves these members into the period of Purification and Enlightenment. The "enlightenment" is the experience of a personal encounter with Christ the Savior during the community's Lenten retreat in prayer. With the faithful and the already baptized candidates, the Elect purify their minds and hearts as they each examine their conscience and do penance.





CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP Stepping Outside of Complacency

For three years I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none. So cut it down! Why should it exhaust the soil? —Luke 13:1-9

This weekend I share with you two interesting and enlightening views of our roles and ensuing journeys toward God's eternal kingdom. We are wise to remember that we are on a journey and life as we know it on this earth is very short compared to eternity.

Jesus tells of a gardener who pleads to save a fig tree so he can cultivate it and hope to make it productive. In chapters one and two of Genesis, God reveals that He created man and woman and gave them dominion over His *Garden* – all of creation.

Bishop Robert Morneau poignantly describes how God made us stewards of many *gardens*: the *gardens* of our faith, our body, our family, our mind, our artistic ability, our many abilities and, most importantly, our ability to reason and our free will. He points out that all of the *gardens* belong to God and poses these questions:

- How are we caring for our *gardens*?
- ✤ Are we being good Christian stewards?
- Have we cultivated our *gardens* or let them go fallow?
- Are our *gardens* as productive as God intended?

If not, it is not too late. The first step is to identify and accept responsibility for the *gardens* that God has entrusted to our care. Do not be afraid. We have Jesus as our helper in our *garden*.
