

THREE YEARS AND STILL COUNTING

One and Two and Three and Four and...

On May 6, 2007, the Handbell Choir convened for its first rehearsal after the Parish received four octaves of handbells which had been donated. Here are some thoughts from our ringers as they continue the journey.

I joined the choir because...

- ...it was music and I thought it was something I might be able to do.
- ...I always wanted to be in a choir, but I can't sing! The handbell choir was a great opportunity to fulfill that dream in our very own Parish.
- ...I always wanted to be in an orchestra, and this was the closest thing to it.
- ...I enjoyed the sound of the ringing and I wanted to get back into making music, and I felt that it would be a good opportunity to get more involved in a ministry.
- ...growing up as a Protestant I had attended church services including handbells, and I loved the sound. I really enjoy music, but don't have a singing voice. When the opportunity to be in the handbell choir presented itself shortly after I became Catholic, it seemed to be a good way to participate in our music ministry and serve God and my church.
- ...I fell in love with handbells the year prior, when my husband and I went to the San Diego Symphony for their Christmas show and they had a handbell choir. I'd never seen anything like it before and was just in awe. I was thrilled to find—very soon after—that our church had an open spot in OUR choir! I haven't looked back since.

I continue to ring because...

- ...it is a rewarding way to minister to my Parish family and praise our Lord. It is really wonderful to be back in instrumental music.
- ...it's a challenge, but a good challenge.

- ...it's fun to play the really big bells.
- ...it keeps me humble, and I like the people.
- ...I find myself developing a closer relationship to God. It can be both very relaxing and very intellectually stimulating. The people in handbell are fun and certainly the friendship that we have developed is another reason to keep on returning. And, our director really makes me feel like I can do this.
- ...of those "a-ha!" moments when we sound good.
- ...it is now another piece of my church ministry and I really LOVE it. Time and talent given back to the Lord!
- ...it is—honestly—the highlight of my week. No matter how stressful work may be, or how much stuff I have to take care of at home, this is my two hours a week to make beautiful music.

My shining moment came when...

- ...we participated with scores of other ringers at the handbell conference in Riverside.
- ...when I learned to ring two bells in the same hand and had seven assigned bells.
- ...I saw the first picture of the handbell choir with our very proud and happy faces.
- ...I was able to successfully ring more than two bells in the same measure and ring them all at the right times.
- ...we began the *Glory to God* music. At first, it was tough for me since my bells played a lot. But now I have mastered the piece, and it is one of my favorites to ring!

The most frustrating thing is...

...trying to find my notes among a cluster of notes on the staff.



- ...starting over again when we begin a new piece.
- ... "it's only two notes!" (This is a handbell-ism. Since each person often has only two bells assigned, it seems like ringing should be easier than it sometimes is.)
- ...when I am playing on a different page than everyone else!
- ...when I turn two or three pages instead of one!
- ...getting off count. If you lose your spot, there's no magic finger pointing to say, "It's okay, we're in beat three of measure 56." It's more like, "Oh *#\$@, I'm totally lost and have no idea where we are."

The most rewarding thing is...

- ...when we get close to the composer's intent.
- ...getting to know the people around you and being a little family.
- ...being part of something bigger than any one person.
- ...the sound of the completed pieces and especially any appreciation afterward.
- ...feeling that I am helping others feel God's presence during the Mass and celebrating his incredible love.
- ...making and being part of such a beautiful ministry. I love the smiles that we help to create when we ring, and gain such satisfaction in being part of such a great group!

Dear Families.

"This is the day the Lord has made.....let us rejoice and be glad!"

Today we conclude our 2009-2010 season of RE.A.CH: 18 Church Sessions and 18 Home Sessions dedicated to forming our children in faith.




