Pastor's Column

Christianity Only Thrives in Community

This year we celebrate the 25th Anniversary of the founding of our Parish.

Bishop Robert Brom, the Chief Shepherd of the Diocese of San Diego, will be with us in our celebration and lead us in the Eucharist on Sunday, October 17, at the 10:30am Mass.

A Parish celebration will take place after that Mass. A committee, headed by Henny Jocelyn, will be meeting for the first time next week to begin to pull together the plans for that day.

It promises to be a day that will be family friendly, on campus, and one in which all Parishioners will be able to participate. It will be a "down-home" event.

We have much to celebrate as a Parish. We have come a long way in the last 25 years, but we still have a way to go in terms of the build-out of our campus. Hopefully, this celebration will strengthen us as we move into the future!

As part of our 25th anniversary celebration, the Parish Staff felt a need to offer a special gift to the Parish. All of us wanted to do something that would help us to deepen the bonds of community that are already so manifest in this community.





Sunday Potluck and Presentation

"We only have each other," sounds like the thoughts and words of early Christians during their persecutions in the first century by the Romans . . . but it's more than that.

It comes from a 13-year-old girl referring to herself and her 16vear-old sister, in 1941 in the town of Radom, Poland, just south of Warsaw.

A19791 was the number tattooed on the arm of little Yaja Boren. She considered herself lucky. Those who were not tattooed were sent directly to the crematorium.

Yaja somehow survived forced labor under bitter cold and starvation conditions and two trips in line to the showers where by the grace of God water came streaming out instead of the usual.

In 1945, when she was still only 16, the Russians liberated the death camp she was in-the fifth concentration camp she had been held in.



This incredible and lovable woman is coming to share her story with us and teach us about history.


