

The Catholic Campaign for Immigration Reform: Justice for Immigrants—Part 4

The issue of immigration reform is once again taking center stage in our country, especially in light of the recent legislation passed by the Arizona Legislature and signed into law by the Governor of that state.

In order to help all of us "wrap our minds" around the complexities of immigration reform, I am including in our Bulletin, for the next few weeks, resources from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) that discuss a wide range of topics related to immigration.

I encourage you to take time to read this information in order to inform yourself as best as possible as our country prepares itself for the upcoming debate on immigration reform.

Whatever viewpoint we may presently have on this issue, we must find ways to come together in order to secure passage of humane and comprehensive immigration legislation. Included as an insert in this week's bulletin you will find Part 4, *Immigration Basics*.



Annual Catholic Appeal 2010 Update

Have you made your pledge or given your gift to ACA yet? Only 291 households out of 996 households have given a gift this year.

This is only 29% of our Parish Households who have responded to the ACA request. We should be able to do better than that!

Our Parish assessment is \$43,000. As of Sunday, June 13, we have collected in pledges/gifts a total of \$40,165.

We still need to raise \$2,835. If this is not raised, we will need to take the shortfall from our Operations Budget which is already behind what we budgeted.

If the 707 households who have not yet responded did respond, it would mean an average gift of only \$4.00!

THE PROBLEM WITH CELL PHONES IN AN EMERGENCY

Cell phones have become an everpresent reality in our society. Many people can't imagine life without them. So what's the problem?

Is it that they don't always get turned off in church?

Or, that people tend to talk extra loudly when using them?

Or, that the things might cause brain tumors?

No, it's that just about everybody has one...and we all want to help!

In recent incidents at St. Thomas More, several justifiably concerned Parishioners stepped out to the plaza to report the emergency to 9-1-1.

The problem? It's too much of a good thing. The 9-1-1 system can be overwhelmed by a single incident,

which could then lead to someone reporting a different incident being put on hold or getting a busy signal.

There is a solution! Weekend Hospitality Ministers and Sacristans at St. Thomas More are trained to respond when someone appears to have collapsed, and most of them have been certified in CPR and in the use of the automated external defibrillator (AED).

They know to use a landline (and where it is) so that the dispatcher sees an instantaneous screen display that includes our address—if someone calls from a cell phone, the dispatcher has no idea of where the call originates.

So what should you do when someone collapses next to you during Mass? If you are a trained responder, do what your training says to do. If you are not a trained



responder, have someone alert a Hospitality Minister or Sacristan first. Then, when a trained responder arrives to help the person who has collapsed, you can help them best by standing back and making sure your neighbors are not crowding in.

By letting trained people do their job, and by staying off your cell phone, you are making the situation easier for the responders and for the 9-1-1 dispatchers. You are helping in the best possible way.

Additional Thoughts from Our Dr. Phil

In at least three recent instances, someone at Mass has collapsed. In each case it occurred when the congregation rose from sitting to standing. This suggests a too-rapid change to the upright position and a momentary drop in blood pressure.

Occasionally, fainting is caused by low blood sugar, typically when the person has been fasting from the night before or all day before Saturday Mass. It is probably a good idea to follow the one-hour fasting rule when planning to receive the

Eucharist (see box). If you have some food on board, your blood sugar will remain stable for at least a couple of hours.

High heat and humidity aggravate this problem. Summer is here, and though humidity is not a big deal in Oceanside, keep it in mind when you take that vacation back to Ohio.

Dehydration makes problems more likely and might occur in persons whose fluid intake is inadequate and/or persons taking diuretics.

There are scores of other causes of fainting. My advice is to see your physician if it occurs, to rule out a serious underlying problem.

In case of a serious incident such as cardiac arrest, no one in our church facility is more than a few seconds from a defibrillator and someone who knows how to use it.

Catechists working with children, adults, or RCIA are strongly encourage to consider this class. It is not often that we have a class offered so close to home.



I had often heard Benedictines refer to their Liturgy of the Hours...as "the sanctification of time," but had not much idea what this could mean until I'd attended the liturgies...on a daily basis for many months.

In our culture time can seem like an enemy: it chews us up and spits us out with appalling ease. But the monastic perspective welcomes time as a gift from God, and seeks to put it to good use rather than allowing us to be used up by it... The Benedictines, more than any other people

I know, insist that there is time in each day for prayer, for work, for study, and for play. -from The Cloister Walk

Auxiliary Bishop of Green Bay, Robert Morneau, one of the apostles of stewardship in North America, has spoken of his "12 gardens of stewardship."



He has suggested that there are (at least) 12 different areas in our lives in which we can cultivate stewardship, such as being a good citizen, taking care of ourselves, consuming "good" TV, movies, literature, and also being a good family member, etc.

His point is that stewardship of all that God has given us extends far beyond just giving time and money to the Church and charity.

For Parents, Grandparents, and Extended Family

Think of all the ways that you are a good steward beyond giving money and time. The time you give to being a good parent (and becoming a better one), the participation in your local community, staying healthy (like exercising, getting a flu shot, or eating right), etc. Pat yourself on the back for those ways you are a good steward.

Living Stewardship Together

When you get a chance, help your children to see the things you do (taking care of the environment, giving to charity, helping out your neighbors or family) as good Christian stewardship.

For Children

Remember that taking care of the planet, reading good books, praying regularly, being good to your friends, eating healthy food, are all ways of being a good steward.


