Pastor's Column

Companions for the Journey

As we go about life and as we try to assist one another in the ways of holiness, how do we "see" each other?

Do we see the other as a friend, a companion?

Or do we see the other as a person that needs "fixing"?

So much is in the attitude with which we see.

I share with you the thoughts of Alan D. Wolfelt, the founder and director of the Center for Loss and Life Transition (*www.centerforloss.com*):

...the word "companion," when broken down into its original Latin roots means "messmate": "com" for "with" and "pan" for "bread," someone you would share a meal with, a friend, an equal. I have taken liberties with the noun "companion" and made it into the verb "companioning" because it so well captures the type of counseling relationship I support and advocate. More specifically, for me, "companioning" is about:

- * Honoring the spirit; it is not about focusing on the intellect.
- ***** *Curiosity; it is not about expertise.*
- * Learning from others; it is not about teaching them.
- ***** Walking alongside; it is not about leading.
- ***** Being still; it is not about frantic movement forward.
- * Discovering the gifts of sacred silence; it is not about filling every painful moment with words.
- * Listening with the heart; it is not about analyzing with the head.
- * Bearing witness to the struggles of others; it is not about directing those struggles.



THE WORDS WE NEED TO HEAR—PART 2

Standing beside David in song

Gabe Huck writes from Damascus, Syria Celebration May 2010.

How to go into that assembly every Lord's Day and "stand beside David"? How to have sturdy tunes and chants with words that bear the weight of Eucharist? Yes, how to have tunes and words so sturdy that we come longing to enter into them again with our assembly, Sunday after Sunday?

And how will all this sound? Listen to John Wesley, who knew a thing or two about singing assemblies:

Sing all. See that you join with the congregation as frequently as you can. Let not a slight degree of weakness or weariness hinder you. If it is a cross to you, take it up, and you will find it a blessing.

Sing lustily and with a good courage. Beware of singing as if you were half-dead, or half asleep; but lift up your voice with strength. Be no more afraid of your voice now, nor more ashamed of its being heard, than when you sang the songs of Satan.

Sing modestly. Do not bawl, so as to be heard above or distinct from the rest of the congregation, that you may not destroy the harmony; but strive to unite your voices together, so as to make one clear melodious sound....

Cantor & Congregation Above all sing spiritually. Have an eye to God in every word you sing. Aim at pleasing God more than yourself, or any other creature. In order to do this attend strictly to the sense of what you sing, and see that your heart is not carried away with the sound, but offered to God continually, so shall your singing be such as the Lord will approve here, and reward you when he comes in the clouds of heaven.

Sing all! Sing lustily! Sing modestly! Sing spiritually! Sing!

Those of us who are Roman Catholic often hold one of two quite different images of what the Mass is and how it is to be done (or try to hold both together). On the one hand there is the image of the Mass that Gregory Dix beautifully set forth decades ago:

Was ever another command so obeyed? For century after century, spreading slowly to every continent and country and among every race on earth, this action has been done, in every conceivable human circumstance. for every conceivable human need from infancy and before it to extreme old age and after it, from the pinnacles of earthly greatness to the refuge of fugitives in the caves and dens of the earth. We have found no better thing than this to do for kings at their crowning and for criminals going to the scaffold; for armies in triumph or for a bride and bridegroom in a little country church...tremulously, by an old monk on the 50th anniversary of his vows; furtively, by an exiled bishop who had hewn timber all day in a prison camp near Murmansk; gorgeously, for the canonization of St. Joan of Arcone could fill many pages with the reasons why we have done this, and not tell a hundredth part of them....

On the other hand, there is the image that Dix begins in the very next sentence:

And best of all, week by week and month by month, on a hundred thousand successive Sundays, faithfully, unfailingly, across all the parishes of Christendom, the pastors have done this just to make the plebs sancta Dei—the holy common people of God.

To those who know a little of Christian history probably the most moving of all the reflections it brings is not the thought of the



great events and the wellremembered saints, but of those innumerable millions of entirely obscure faithful men and women, every one with his or her own individual hopes and fears and joys and sorrows and loves-and sins and temptations and prayers—once every whit as vivid and alive as mine are now. They have left no slightest trace in this world, not even a name, but have passed to God utterly forgotten by us. Yet each of them once believed and prayed as I believe and pray, and found it hard and grew slack and sinned and repented and fell again. Each of them worshiped at the Eucharist, and found their thoughts wandering and tried again, and felt heavy and unresponsive and yet knew just as really and pathetically as I do these things.

In the first image, there is something that needs no assembly though it may have a very immense assembly and choirs galore. It takes on all those guises Dix names. There can be a multitude or a minister alone. There can be the finest voices and instruments making some of the world's greatest music. Or it can be all whispers. In all its guises, this image is about the sacred person and the sacred words and the sacred altar with its bread and wine.

In the second image, Dix is closer to what should concern us as we think about what silence and sound are to be in our liturgy.

Christian Stewardship—Not about Me

Entertaining family and friends entails many facets and details. The host/hostess is very often busy tending to those details and ends up missing a lot of the "fun" part of the festivities.

> "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things." Luke 10:38-42

Martha is doing what was expected of a good Jewish woman of her day—preparing food for her family and guest. Her sister Mary, also a good Jewish woman, plops herself down at the feet of Jesus and absorbs every word He says.

Martha confronts Jesus, "Lord, make her help me!" Jesus knows that Martha is not doing anything wrong. She is doing what she believes is expected of her. And she is doing it very well.

Jesus suggests she should not be so concerned about what others expect of her, but should spend time to discern what God expects of her. What God expects of us can be quite different than what the world expects of us.

We discern God's will for us in prayer—prayer that is not about what we say to God, but about what we are willing to hear from God. Fr. Hacker Fagot, SJ, admits that "Too often my prayer is not *God, thy will be done!* but *God, thy will be changed!*" Do we pray? And what is our prayer.


