

JustFaith is an innovative national program that is coming to our Parish beginning in September.

JustFaith works in partnership with the Catholic Campaign for Human Development, Catholic Charities USA, and Catholic Relief Services.

JustFaith provides a practical, proven strategy for empowering people to become thoughtful, energetic agents of the Church's efforts to create a more just world.

JustFaith has changed a lot of people's lives. And this, in turn, has made some Parishes' efforts in social ministry come alive. We are looking forward, as a Parish, to deepening our commitment to social justice through the *JustFaith* experience.

JustFaith is a 30-week justice education process that meets weekly employing books, videos, lecture, discussion, prayer, retreats, and hands-on experiences. The intent is to provide a tapestry of learning opportunities that emphasize and enliven the remarkable justice tradition of the Church.

JustFaith participants are exposed to not only a substantive and demanding course of study but are also afforded the privilege of becoming community with other participants and sharing a journey of faith and compassion that is both life-giving and challenging.

JustFaith will be a partnership between St. Francis Parish and St. Thomas More Parish. 37 people have already signed up and a number of small groups have formed which will be meeting on different days and times. Three other North County Parishes are getting onboard as well. The process begins in September.

GREAT AND WORTHY!

St. Thomas More constantly pushes the envelope. And, no, I am not referring to the many opportunities for charitable giving that the Parish presents to its members and friends.

A colleague of mine likes to say that we are a medium-sized church acting like a megachurch. *This* is what I am talking about.

In a Parish made up of about 1,000 families, we seem to be doing the good works of a faith community four times our size.

In a diocese where fifty percent of the people is a great response for a capital campaign, *ninety* percent of the Parish responded in the first phase of our current campaign.

At a recent conference for liturgists and musicians, it was heartening to be encouraged to do all sorts of things that this Parish already does.

Our liturgies are up-to-date, incorporating all the things that the bishop has asked his pastors to implement. Our musicians present music in support of the whole faith community, at *all* the Masses. Our ecumenical and interfaith activities are robust, strengthening our ties to our brothers and sisters in faith, Christian and otherwise.

All of this is good. So, one could ask, what might be left to do?

In his apostolic letter At the Close of the Great Jubilee Year of 2000, Pope John Paul II wrote about the current and coming need for increased participation by the people of the Church:

"[T]he Church of the Third Millennium will need to encourage all the baptized and confirmed to be aware of their active responsibility in the Church's life. Together with the ordained ministry, other ministries,...can flourish for the good of the whole community,

sustaining it in its many needs: from catechesis to liturgy, from education of the young to the widest array of charitable works."

This past spring, Fr. Mike, Liturgy Committee Chairperson Kathy Arciero, and I sat down to begin a process intended to reshape our Liturgy Committee and to start it down the path that will allow it to support the demands that our Parish's future will place upon its liturgies.

This past weekend, the reconstituted Liturgy Committee sat down for the first time to begin a journey that will further strengthen the liturgical actions of this community, encourage the Church's stated goal of full, conscious, and active participation by the assembly, and increasingly support this faith family as they participate in their ministerial roles.

The demands on individual priests are increasing as their numbers decrease, so it is critically important for the non-ordained members (laity) of the Church to step up to assist in areas that weren't previously part of the laity's charge.

For us, there are eminently practical implications. Before we move in to our new permanent worship space, we will need a sufficient number of trained ministers—and the ability to recruit, train, encourage, and evaluate them—to support a liturgical space fifty percent larger than the space we occupy now.

In his song, *Great Is the Lord*, Michael W. Smith puts it this way:

Great is the Lord and worthy of glory / Great is the Lord and worthy of praise

What we already have is good, very good at times. What we strive for is to continue to be worthy! For our great God!


