Pastor's Column

Discernment

Hopefully these months of summer have been a time of greater relaxation and recreation.

Taking advantage of changed schedules and routines can cause you to spend more time in reflection on your life in relation to God. This creates a greater opportunity for discernment.

Discernment is a sifting of our own experience to find where God is or is not in our lives. The main task of discernment is to ask oneself, "Am I allowing God and my faith community to influence and direct my choices? Or am I just 'doing my own thing'?"

I share with you some questions for reflection that may help you in your process of discernment:

1. Recall your story—What was one, or some, event/ occurrence/influence that brought you to faith in Jesus and keeps you within the Catholic Church?

- 2. Can you identify some things that have changed in your life in the past several months?
- 3. How do you let God into your life?
- 4. How do you pray?
- 5. When do you pray?
- 6. How would you describe your relationship with Jesus?
- 7. Can you name three areas of your life that you want to change?

May these words of Thomas Merton strengthen you for the journey of discernment:

Looking for God is like seeing a path in a field of snow. If there is no path and you are looking for one, walk across it and there is the path.

JustFaith is an opportunity to grow spiritually by studying the Church's social doctrine in small groups at the homes of parishioners. 

Are there really religious education classes for children who are 3, 4, and 5 years old?

Yes!

Two Sundays a month, from September through May, there are classes for children ages 3, 4, and 5 on the lower level during the whole of the 10:30am Mass. There is a pre-school class and a kindergarten class.

Parents bring the child to the catechist about 10:20am, then usually go upstairs to Mass. Class lasts as long as Mass does. Parents then pick up their child at the end of Mass.

During this time, the catechists provide age appropriate activities based on the same Scripture readings being used at Mass.

The curriculum for the early years helps children discover God already present in their lives and in their homes and families. It incorporates active self-expression, discovery and inquiry, language and thinking, social relationships, music, art, and prayer.

Christian Stewardship Someone Else Is Me ~

"Invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, the unwanted; blessed will you be because of their inability to repay you." —Luke 14:1, 7-14

A parishioner noted to his pastor that Jesus dined with the rich and famous of his day. He asked, "Do you think Jesus would belong to an exclusive country club if he were here today?"

The pastor answered, "I suspect he might, if he could afford it. But his guests would include people who could not afford it, people who are lame, who limp, or feel their way with a white cane."

The pastor then said to his parishioner, "You belong to a very exclusive country club. Have your ever brought such guests to your club?"

The man said nothing. He had many possessions.

The pastor added, "When we leave Mass and go into God's world we are supposed to be Jesus present in that world. So when you are at your exclusive country club Jesus *is* a member. You might want to start reviewing your guest list."
