# **Pastor's Column**

### The Vineyard

The vineyard is a popular Christian symbol. It appears a number of times in the New Testament.

Very simply, the earth is the vineyard. We are workers in that vineyard. There were workers before us. There will be workers after us.

While we are in the vineyard, we are called to tend it and to bear fruit. One day, for each of us, there will be an accounting of our efforts in the Owner's vineyard.

God is the Owner. We are the workers. We are God's stewards. We get ourselves into trouble when we begin to create illusions that we are the owners. Failing to recognize that all is pure gift, and that we enjoy the gift just for a short time, we fantasize that we own things; that these things, whatever they may be, belong to us.

We get caught up in our ownership and begin to use God's vineyard for our own purposes.

We cloud our vision with ownership. We clear our vision with stewardship.

When we, deep in our hearts and souls, come to the realization that we are just "passing through" the vineyard, as invited guests of the Owner, we begin to see clearly.

These Stations of the Cross were crafted and installed by a small team of people from the Environment and committee Art and from More's Workers. Thev put in many hours of effort to provide this more permanent set of Stations for our Parish's use.

Kathy Quinn assisted in choosing wood

product, and mounted figures on panels. **Bob Wong** assisted in choosing wood product, removed figures from the original stations, and mounted figures on panels. **Carl Streling** drove his truck to pick up materials, cut out and shaped wood panels, and applied edge banding material. **Jerry Gayvert** purchased and picked up materials, cut out and shaped wood panels, applied edge banding material, and finished the panels. We thank all of them!

### A Bit of History

You may recognize the new Stations as being similar to the old set, and you would be correct. They were constructed using the previous set's wooden figures, which were removed and reattached to the current wood panels. The previous set of panels were designed to be temporary, and not to be used for more than one Lenten season. These many years later, they were due for a facelift.

But actually these are the fourth

version of the set. St. Thomas More's original Stations of the Cross were made for the storefront. Natalie Provinse was on the Environment and Art committee with Charlene Buhlert at that time, and Natalie drew each station and cut them out in purple felt and Charlene made a long strip of background material. They adhered the cuttings onto the brown material, seven stations on each side of the worship space. (This was before Pope John Paul II revised and expanded the customary Stations to the fifteen we celebrate today.) Believe it or not, Natalie still has the patterns under her bed. In later years, when the Parish moved to our current space, Bob Wong and Charlene Buhlert cut each station off of the brown material and made individual frames for them. Then, Bob took the original patterns apart and used them to create wood carvings which were used until the current set were crafted.

Now, we have a set of Stations of the Cross designed and built to be able to stand the test of time. They will hang in our worship space yearround until we move into our new permanent worship space. At that time, a set of Stations will be installed in the new church, and our current set will find a new home.

The ministry of the Word is a fundamental element of evangelization through all its stages, because it involves the proclamation of Jesus Christ, the eternal Word of God...


### The Word of God nourishes both evangelizers and those who are being evangelized so that each one may continue to grow in his or her Christian life.

Those who have been designated by the community to serve as catechists will be called forth to be commissioned for their ministry at Mass this Sunday:


