

On September 2, I left for Germany with 38 pilgrims to attend the Passion Play in Oberammergau, Germany. Witnessing the Play was indeed a very moving faith experience for all of us!

We also visited Munich, Prague, Bratislava, Budapest, Vienna, and Salzburg. What a beautiful part of the world!

We returned home on Tuesday, September 14.

This past week, along with Chris Smith, Kathy Arciero, and Ron Briseno, I attended the International Catholic Stewardship Council Conference which was held in San Diego. Over 1,000 people attended workshops and talks to assist all of us in better living and witnessing to stewardship as a way of life, and sharing this way of life with fellow Parishioners. The conference began Sunday afternoon, September 19, and ended Wednesday afternoon, September 22.

This coming week, along with Bishop Brom and all the priests of the Diocese of San Diego, I will be attending our annual Convocation from Monday, September 27, to Thursday, September 30. These days provide some time for a bit of R & R for the priests.

September has been filled with a number of different activities that have taken me away from the Parish. October will bring back my normal routine and activities!



Star Trek and Stewardship

I am not a Trekkie but do enjoy watching the *Star Trek* TV series and the movies from time to time. The other day I was watching the movie *Star Trek: First Contact*, which stars the cast from the TV series *Star Trek: The Next Generation*.

Without going into the whole plot, the 24th century starship, Enterprise, is pulled back in time to the year 2061. I was struck by a statement the captain of the Enterprise, Jean-Luc Picard, made to a woman of the 21st century when she was overcome by the ship's size and technology and asked how much the Enterprise cost to build.

Picard stated, "Money doesn't exist in the 24th century . . . The acquisition of money is no longer the driving force in our lives. We work to better ourselves and the rest of humanity."

Who knew *Star Trek* was an example of stewardship in action? Can you imagine what would happen if we all followed Jesus' example and worked to better ourselves and the rest of humanity instead of increasing our own net worth?

An earlier movie scene answers that question. The fictional scientist, Dr. Cochrane, the first human to travel faster than the speed of light in the year 2063, is told his first faster-than-light flight causes a passing ship of Vulcans to land on earth and make "first contact." He is then told it was a pinnacle moment in human history.

Dr. Cochrane is then told, "This first contact united humanity in a way no one ever thought possible when they realized they were not alone in the universe. Poverty, disease, war—they will all be gone in the next fifty years."

We are not alone in the universe. Two thousand years before the first *Star Trek* books was written by Gene Roddenberry, God made first contact with us in the person of Jesus Christ. Jesus came to earth not as an alien but as fully God and fully human to teach us how to live for God and others instead of only ourselves.

It was *the* pinnacle moment in human history. The Apostles and early Christian Church lived their lives this way and freely shared their possessions, time, and talents in order to better themselves, their faith community, and the rest of humanity.

One man changed fictional history in a movie. One Son of Man changed actual human history by dying on the cross. We can be that pinnacle moment in our own lives and in human history. If we follow Jesus' teachings and use our skills, possessions, money, and lives to better the rest of humanity instead of only ourselves, then we will indeed "live long and prosper."
