# **Pastor's Column**

## We salute our 25 Year Pioneers!

The Church of St. Thomas More was established as a Parish in Carlsbad on September 1, 1985, to ease the overcrowding at St. Patrick Church. Sunday Masses were celebrated in the Eternal Hills Mortuary Chapel, while daily and special Feast Day Masses were held in various Parishioner homes.

A number of years later, the Eastern boundary of our Parish was extended to Lake Blvd. to include the residents of Ocean Hills (formerly Leisure Village), and the celebration of Mass was moved to the Shadowridge area.

Many of the original Pioneers found it difficult to travel from Carlsbad to Shadowridge over Highway 78 and returned to St. Patrick Parish.

We're grateful for the dedication of our original Parishioners and salute them! You will recognize them today by the "STM Pioneer" ribbons they are wearing. Please share a smile and a thank you to each of them. Their dedication to our Parish was instrumental in our bright history!

is no option but that locations change, people meet each other for the first time, and the food... well, let's just say that the Parish of St. Thomas More eats well together.

Starting a Parish

from scratch, there

Marking a quarter -century may not seem like a big deal from the

grand perspective of the life of the Church through the centuries, but in this piece of the world, it is noteworthy.

Just ask yourself, where were you twenty-five years ago? Where were your parents? Your grandparents?

At that time, I was just about to join the church choir that would eventually lead me to my ministry here at St. Thomas More.

That choir had four of us in the bass section: myself, and three retired men, all of whom had worn the silver eagle as a colonel or captain in three different branches of the military, one of whom could still fit into his uniform, each with a personality as different as night and dawn and day. I now know that these three men taught me the true foundation of church community: the people, and their love of God and God's mission and ministry.

In the faith communities I have been a part of, and in the choirs I have both sung in and directed, the most important ingredient has always been my fellow travelers.

At St. Thomas More, what distinguishes us from most other communities is that quality which Fr. Mike refers to as the "intentionality" of the Parish.

In my world of Liturgy and Music, there are many people in a score of ministries serving our fellow Parishioners and the local community. Looking at the entire faith community, we number in the thousands and our reach is global.

In Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, proclaimed at today's anniversary liturgy, he declares:

Brothers and sisters, You are God's building.

Paul affirms that we are moving in the right direction. With stopovers at multiple locations, and led by various priestly leaders, we have become "God's building" for this community. In our first twenty five years, we have become a single, intentional, faith-filled entity, dedicated to the mission and ministry of Jesus.

We have become God's building, the Body of Christ, in this time and in this place.

In our next twenty five years, we will have built a permanent Church, but our ever-moving faith journey will continue—within the Parish, embracing our local community, and extending across the entire globe.

For all that has been, we say "Thank You." To the present day with its many challenges, we say "Yes." To a future filled with hope, we confidently say "It Will Be."





Shopping in a department store, a minister saw a man whom he knew to be the director of the City Mission on Skid Row. Though the minister did not know the director, he wished to be friendly and to encourage the man who spent most of each day ministering to those trapped in poverty and/or addiction.


