## Parish Advent Communal Penance Service:

### The Sacrament of Reconciliation—God's Unconditional Love for Us!

In recent years, a name change has taken place with the "Sacrament of Confession." We no longer call the act "Confession," but rather "Reconciliation" and/or "Penance."

This name change better reflects what happens in this celebration. We do not go to the priest just to list our sins, have them forgiven, and receive a penance; but rather, and most importantly, we come to the priest to celebrate the forgiveness of God that we experience in our lives. We come to the Sacrament with a sense of joy for what God has already done in our lives and what God continues to do—showering us with unconditional love.

The verbalization of our sins, the verbalization of the words of absolution, and the acceptance of a penance are steps in the process of celebrating God's forgiveness and unconditional love for us.

If we are open to God's love, we begin to experience the many ways in which God forgives us our sins in the daily occurrences of our lives.

When we ask forgiveness from someone we have offended, our sins are forgiven. When we accept the forgiveness of another, our sins are forgiven. Each time we talk to God in the silence of our hearts and sincerely seek forgiveness from God, our sins are forgiven. Each time we celebrate the Eucharist, we hear the words of the priest shortly before the reception of Holy Communion—

"Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world! Happy are we! We are called to His supper!"—our sins are forgiven.

So why go to the priest? We do so in order to celebrate the forgiveness of God we experience in our daily lives, to ritualize it, sacramentalize it and, as in all things, to place our lives and God's involvement in our lives within the context of the Church, the Body of Christ.

The priest "stands in" for the community. As we verbalize our sins, we are mindful that there is no such thing as a personal sin. Our sins, no matter how personal we may think them to be, affect others—"No Man Is an Island." We live in community. Our lives always touch the lives of others.

Telling our sins, hearing ours sins from our own lips, helps us to be real and to acknowledge our weakness and our dependence upon God. It is so easy to rationalize our sinfulness when we talk to ourselves "in our heads." It is an entirely different experience when we hear ourselves verbalize our sinfulness. Those sins become much more real! We become much more aware and sensitive of our responsibilities to others.

The priest "stands in" for Christ. Hearing the words of absolution, the forgiveness of God, from the lips of the priest is indeed comforting. You know how wonderful it feels when a family member or friend says, "I love you!" In the Sacrament of Reconciliation we allow God to say those words to us in and through the person of the priest.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is not something to be feared but to be celebrated with trust and confidence because of God's unconditional love for us.

This weekend, on Sunday, November 28 at 4:00pm our Parish celebrates her Advent Communal Penance Service. In this Parish celebration, a number of our young people will be celebrating this Sacrament for the first time. Your presence will also be a sign of support to them.

Many priest/confessors will be available for you. They will be in Church waiting for you so that through the words of absolution God will once again say to you:

"I forgive you and I love you unconditionally!"

## LORD, LET MY PRAYER RISE UP TO YOU

# MORNING PRAYER

When darkness gives way before the sun's light and a new day begins, people of all religions have had their rites of morning: words and songs and gestures with which to pray.

Christians, following the example of their Jewish ancestors, continued to pray at morning: words to praise God for a new morning.

The daily prayers of Christians were fashioned at first from very simple things: the sign of the cross, the Lord's Prayer, a few verses and songs and short psalms, intercessions.

The daily assemblies of Christians gave shape to what became known as the "liturgy of the hours."

These are prayers of the people of God, prompted by the cycle of our day, offered to the one who made us.

## ADVENT: A SENSE OF THE SEASON

The liturgical color for Advent is a deep violet favoring blue which reflects the royalty of Jesus as the Messiah King.

During the second week of Advent we hear the Prophet Isaiah looking forward to "that day" when a future king will be faithful to God's covenant promises and faithfulness. The story of the Jesse Tree unfolds.

Our environment expresses this season with a new backdrop created by Charlene Buhlert and a copper mixed media sculpture constructed by Bob Wong. The Advent wreath helps us count the weeks until Christ's coming by lighting a candle each week.

## The PBJ Story



In Advent 2005, I received a call from Catholic Charities, asking if we could sponsor a collection of peanut butter and jelly from the children of our Parish to the children of our community. By the end of Advent we had collected 215 jars.

When we delivered the PBJ to the Food Crisis Center, they were thrilled. One man was picking up food for a family with three children and asked for some jars: "It's hard to know what food to bring for kids, but you can't go wrong with peanut butter and jelly!" he said.

Though the drive was technically over, I realized these children are hungry more than at Christmas time, and so I promised to continue delivering PBJ as long as it arrives in my office, and also keep you updated on the goal (a jar a day!)

When parents take children to the grocery store, they are often bombarded with "I want that, I want that!" My hope is that parents will create a sensitivity in their children to the needs of children in our own community that go hungry, and that when they see a jar of peanut butter or jelly in the grocery store, they may see with new eyes and say: "I want that for the children that are hungry!"

## CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP Gift of the Magi

Have you ever noticed the people who return to God a truly grateful portion of their income, in thanksgiving for all the blessings that God gives them, seem almost always to be happy or content?

The reason why is illustrated beautifully in O. Henry's famous Christmas story, "The Gift of the Magi," in which the husband and wife each sacrifice their most precious possession for the sake of the other.

The wife sells her beautiful hair to buy her husband a watch fob, while he sells his watch to buy her an expensive comb.

Each gift, then, is materially useless; but the couple is exuberantly happy because they realize that each one's gift represents an act of truly unselfish love.

Our gift of money to God represents our love for him; and when we sacrifice, or give of ourselves, we more fully appreciate the many blessings God has bestowed upon us.

It is this appreciation, this feeling of love and trust, that shows in the person who returns to God the first portion.



Think of the different things in life that make you happy: an entertaining motion picture, for example, a good book, a child uttering his or hers first words, a birthday celebration, or a family wedding.

These occasions give us joy because we project ourselves into them or become a part of them.

The experience of sacrificial giving is much like this, but with one tremendous difference.

Material pleasures are temporary.

Giving is permanent.

The giver's joy does not end with the last chapter of the book or the final scene of the movie. It stimulates a lasting joy because good steward constantly give of themselves in deep appreciation of what God has given them.

We realize that the joy of sacrificial giving then is love. In spite of trial and tribulation, love emerges as the factor in the individual's happiness.

It is the inner glow that distinguishes those people who become good stewards of their money from others. It is the joy of sacrificial giving. *—Stewardship, December 2010 with permission*

## 2010 YEAR-END CHECKLIST

- ♦ BE SURE TO <u>COMPLETE</u> all gifts by December 31 to qualify for tax savings on this year's tax return. Advance planning with the Parish Office is essential, since we will be closed from December 22 at noon-January 3, 2011. Gifts received in the offertory at Masses the weekend of December 25/26 will be credited for year ending 2010.
- ◆ Annual Catholic Appeal payments? Any parishioners with a balance due on their pledges made to this year's ACA are requested to conclude their payments before December 31, 2010. Thank you to all who have already fulfilled their pledges! (*Tithing families, remember that your tithe covers* your ACA contribution.)
- Keep all gift receipts and acknowledgment letters, especially for gifts of \$250 or more.
- If you sold securities this year and will owe capital gains tax, remember that gifts of cash or other securities may partially or fully offset any tax on your gains.
- ♦ 2010 is drawing to a close. As you review your financial situation for your IRS returns, you may have an opportunity for greater charitable giving before the end of this year. If so, now is the time to check out those options!
