What Are You Waiting For?

"I'd like to dwell briefly on this suggestive theme of 'waiting,' as it speaks to a profoundly human aspect, in which faith becomes, so to say, one with our flesh and our hearts.

Waiting—standing by—is a dimension that crosses all of our existence: personal, family, and social. This waiting is found in a thousand situations, from those little, everyday ones all the way to the most important things, those which completely, deeply wrap us up.

Among these, let us think of the waiting for a child by a couple; those of a relative or friend who comes to visit us from afar; let us think, for a young person, of the waiting for the result of an important test, or a job interview; in emotional relationships, of

the waiting for one's encounter with their beloved, of the response to a letter, or the acceptance of an apology...

It could be said that man is alive while he waits, that in his heart hope is alive. And from these waitings man comes to know himself: our moral and spiritual 'stature' can be measured by that for which we wait, by that in which we hope.

Each of us, then, especially in this time that prepares us for Christmas, can ask ourselves: what am I waiting for? What, in this moment of my life, reaches out of my heart?

This same question can place itself in the context of family, of community, of nation. What do we wait for, together? What unites our hopes, what do we share?

In the time preceding the birth of Jesus, so strong in Israel was the anticipation of the Messiah, of the Sacred One, descendant of King David, who would finally liberate the people from their moral and political slavery and inaugurate the Kingdom of God.

But no one would ever have imagined that the Messiah could be born of a humble girl like Mary, betrothed to the just man Joseph. Neither had she thought of it, though in her heart the waiting for the Savior was so great, her faith and her hope so ardent, that He could find in her a worthy mother.

From the first, God himself prepared her, even from before the ages.

There is a mysterious correspondence between the waiting of God and that of Mary, the creature 'full of grace,' totally transparent to the design of the Most High's love.

Let us learn from her, the Lady of Advent, to live our daily duties with a new spirit, with the sense of a profound waiting, one only the coming of God can quench."

FINDING GOD AMID THE MESS

Life is messy! It's messy in the microcosm of our own little world. and it's messy on the grand, macrocosmic scale. Even a cursory glance around will fill our eyes with many miseries. Children are abducted and abused, or worse. Countries are mounting senseless, endless wars. Weapons proliferate, and with them, so do threats against human survival. Famine and disease wreak havoc. Floods, earthquakes, fires and mudslides obliterate homes, businesses, families, and futures. Financial insecurity and unemployment result in foreclosed homes, repossessed cars, and a sense of desperation that things might never be the same. Many of us are sure that our times are the worst of times, but history proves us wrong.

Each of the ancient authors whose sacred texts are proclaimed during this Advent season also had experiences that left them feeling helpless and hopeless. Their world was filled with human suffering and struggle that appeared senseless. Israel and Judah were prime pieces of real estate. Gaining control of them became the impetus for many hostile incursions and extended wars. Often, their untenable political situation was attributed to the lessthan-authentic religious and spiritual lives of the people. Like us, they could have looked around and sighed, "Life is messy!"

But their prophets and sages, like Isaiah (Dec. 5, 12, 19) and Jesus ben Sira (Dec. 26), kept before the Israelites the conviction that God knew their mess, and even in the midst of seemingly unresolvable difficulties, God would always be present. God's presence in their midst could make all things new, all things right, all things true, just, and full of peace. God was present in the word that was spoken through the prophets and the psalmists. God was present as well in the beauties and

wonders of the created universe. And God was also perceived as present in the unfolding saga of their journey through life.

God's presence in the mess of their world enabled our ancestors in the faith to hold fast to their hope and place it securely in God's good hands. Through the centuries, this hope alternately flourished and flagged, but it never died. God was aware of their long-cultivated hope, their wish to know God fully and to be known fully by God. So God chose to become ultimately and irrevocably invested in the mess and madness to which human beings can succumb when left to their own desires.

Incarnate in flesh and blood and time and space, the One who was prophesied as Emmanuel, God-withus, fulfilled that promise in the person of Jesus Christ (Dec. 19). Since Jesus' first coming, the mess of this world has become sanctified by his embrace. That which is broken is made whole in him; the lost are found in him; the blind, the deaf, the lame, and those affected by every other physical, psychological, emotional, and spiritual need find healing and strength in him. The poor are made rich in him and the rich are challenged to look at their wealth and see opportunities for helping others. Jesus has taken the mess we have made of ourselves. our relationships and our world and. through his love, forgiveness, and saving cross, has shown us that there is a way out. That way leads believers to put their faith and trust and hope in God and never let go.

Although it is tempting to look at the mess of our world the way we watch TV, and change the channel when the subject matter is too unsettling, Jesus challenges us to put down the remote-control approach to life and to become invested in it, as he did. His coming into our world has set



the example. A hands-on leader, he continues to call disciples who will cultivate a similar approach to their ministry. By his presence, his service, his witness, Jesus began the process of this world's redemption.

As they envisioned their messy world touched by God's redemptive power, the prophets offered descriptions of a peaceful place where wolves and lambs, leopards and young goats, calves and lions would have no enmity for one another (Dec. 5). They foresaw a world where the feeble would be strong and the blind would see (Dec. 12). All of this would come to pass when a child who would be named Emmanuel was born (Dec. 19).

That child has been born, and with him were born infinite possibilities for peace. As we remember Jesus' birth and celebrate the adult risen Christ whose return we await, it is both our privilege and our responsibility to realize the visions of the prophets in our own messy world. Rather than romanticize peace, we are to focus on the realistic peace that we have been challenged to broker—between the genders and the generations, in families, neighborhoods, communities, countries, and continents. The present and coming Christ compels us to bring his presence to bear on every human mess so that the transformative power of the incarnate God may make it otherwise.
