Our Parish has a wonderful Bereavement Team that is available when a loved one dies. They are available to assist the family with many arrangements related to the funeral, which might include meeting with the family to pray, helping to plan the funeral, and providing bereavement support afterwards.

In addition, those who like to plan ahead may meet with a Bereavement Team member to pre-plan preferences and place them on record, which can be a great help for children or other family members when the time comes.

### Facing a Hospital Stay?

If you or someone you know is planning a hospital stay or ends up in the hospital, marking the "Catholic" box on the registration form ensures that the Diocesan Catholic Chaplain assigned to the hospital will know the patient is Catholic. You may also want to request a visit by the Catholic Chaplain. Most hospitals also have teams of ministers from local Parishes who bring Holy Communion to Catholic patients.

### CHRISTMAS: A SENSE OF THE SEASON

Glory in heaven and peace on earth, now and forever. Amen.

The Liturgical color for Christmas is White, the color of joy, holiness, and light. When the world is over the celebration, we Catholics are just beginning the remembering and reveling of the Nativity of our Lord! Our church celebrates right up to the Baptism of our Lord! The purple and pink of the advent wreath is replaced with the white Christ Candle much like a birthday candle!

Using acrylic on canvas, liturgical artist, Mary Castle, created a beautiful rose window for our focus this season. The rose window operates on many levels; spiritual, meditative, and emotional. There are many paths to reach the divine, simply following the tracery with

the eye, and taking in the path can be calming and meditative—very much like prayer. The motif Mary used, the rose of Sharon, and the colors she chose to depict the roses mean grace, and gratitude. The inspiration for this painting came from a 14th century rose window in the nave of the Cathedral of Our Lady Strasbourg, Alsace, France. The stretcher frame was custom made by Bob Jacobson of More's Workers.

When you light your candles, say the prayer of the angels: Glory in heaven and peace on earth, now and forever. Amen.

### CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP Example of the Holy Family

The Gospel selection we hear today leaves out the account of the horrible event that precipitated the Flight of the Holy Family into Egypt and the slaughter of the children of Bethlehem by Herod.

The important lesson for the Christian steward is to be found in Joseph's willingness to follow God's leading to protect his family. An angel told him in a dream to flee with his wife and the infant Jesus to Egypt and then to return with them to Israel after Herod's death. He could have dismissed the messages the angels delivered as just dreams. However, he had enough spiritual awareness to perceive that they were different from ordinary dreams—and having had that insight, he acted upon it.

We also should seek to discern how and when to follow God's leading. He may not speak to us in a form we would call an angel in a dream, although he may. But he also may give us a message through an inspiration that comes to us in prayer, by counsel during a confession, or from a challenge offered during a homily.

The trouble is, we often react by thinking, "That's an interesting idea. I'll give it further consideration when it's convenient," when what's called for is obedience.

On this feast of the Holy Family, we can learn another lesson in addition to the need to obey God and to do so on his timetable. That lesson is that we are called to care for our family, even when it causes personal inconvenience or worse.

And the amazing thing is that Paul tells us *not* to bear with our family members and forgive them as grudging duties. We're not even to take a disruption to our lives like a flight by night to a foreign land with resentment. As he wrote in Colossians 3, we're to "be thankful," as amazing as it sounds.

The attitude of thanksgiving is the foundation of stewardship, as we respond to God's love. And so it is with family life and the demands family life makes on our own plans and desires. We're called to live with the attitude that "whatever you do, in word or in deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." When we live that way, we experience the joy that comes from living in accordance with God's will for us, even in the midst of the duties of daily life.
