Pastor's Column

Pilgrimage to the Holy Land: November 1-15, 2011

In recent years, there has been a return of pilgrims to the Holy Land. Many people are once again considering sharing in the joy and blessing of visiting the land where God's plan for the salvation of the world unfolded.

This will be my sixth pilgrimage to the Holy Land. For me, Israel/ Palestine is a place to which I want to return over and over again, because each time that I visit, my faith is deepened and I am more connected to the Scriptures and more centered in the celebration of the Eucharist. When you walk where Jesus walked, you are never the same again!

I am happy to announce that in November of this year (November 1-15), I will be leading a pilgrimage to the Holy Land.

The pilgrimage will be a comfortable, two-week opportunity to grow in faith and to deepen your relationship with God.

Imagine visiting Tel Aviv, the Judean Hill Country, Bethlehem, Ein Karem (the home of John the Baptist), Tiberias, Caesarea and the Mediterranean Coast, Haifa, Mt. Carmel, the Jordan River, Nazareth, Cana, the Sea of Galilee, Capernaum, the Mt. of Beatitudes, Mt. Tabor, the Jezreel Valley, the Jordan Valley, Jerusalem, the Western Wall, Mt. Zion, the Upper Room, Dormition Abbey, the Mt. of Olives, the Garden of Gethsemane, the Old City of Jerusalem, the Pool of Bethesda, the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, Bethany, Jericho, the Dead Sea, Qumran, Ein Gedi, and more!

It is a well-planned pilgrimage, and it will be educational and prayerful.

JustFaith

Four groups of St. Thomas More and St. Francis of Assisi Parishioners are completing the first half of the JustFaith program, a spiritual journey into compassion. We have read books, viewed videos,



and heard speakers. Joined in prayer, we have reflected on poverty and social issues, such as racism, in the United States and within our immediate community.

As an "immersion experience" we visited Brother Benno's Center in Oceanside. Brother Benno's Center provides not only food but clothing, furniture, household items, and social services such as a secure mailing address, shower facilities, and abuse counseling. At one with those served, we stood in line and were served lunch by volunteers-some, members of our Parish, and shared the meal hearing the stories of the men, women, and children who were fellow guests.

Attending a meeting of Interfaith Communities for Worker Justice, we learned that volunteers from many faiths work together to support low income workers in an effort to improve labor conditions and solve other community problems through legislation, contract negotiations, and community awareness campaigns.

Most recently the JustFaith curriculum has focused on how we use and misuse the world in which we live. We have considered our culture of goods consumption and have become more aware of the need to simplify our lives so others may simply live.

In coming weeks the JustFaith program will focus on an examination of the causes, the extent, and consequences of poverty throughout the world.

Marriage Moments—(Black History Month) Not all injustices are black or white. Often there's a lot of gray when trying to figure out who is right in an argument. Before digging in your heels and insisting on having your way, try to get in your spouse's skin. Look at the problem through his/her eyes.

Parenting Pointers—Kids can be mean—to each other and even to you. Perhaps your child has said, "I hate you!" A natural reaction is to respond defensively. "You don't understand." or "I'm just trying to protect you." True as this may be, consider that your first words might be to seek to understand and to acknowledge their anger. "So, you hate it when I treat you like a baby." Or "You feel furious because I won't let you eat more candy, stay up later, have the cell phone…" Let the child vent if necessary, but don't cave if your reason still stands.

DARE TO BE CHRISTIAN

Scripture Themes for February

by Patricia Datchuck Sánchez and Rafael Sánchez Alonso, Celebration February 2011. by permission. Each of the Gospels for this cold month of February puts us in touch, yet again, with the cold, hard facts of what it means to be a Christian. Like harsh medicine that needs to be meted out in small doses so it does not overwhelm us, each Gospel will remind preachers and people in the pews that living as a Christian in this world puts believers in direct conflict with much of the wisdom our contemporary culture espouses. Each Gospel will clearly and unequivocally speak the truth of the Matthean Jesus' Great Sermon. Each will test our mettle and challenge any excuse we may have for not taking Jesus seriously. Will we align ourselves with those who dismiss the sermon's challenges as passé or highly impractical, and therefore impossible to maintain? Or will we embrace the ethic put forth here, and thereby become authentic disciples whose words and works fulfill humankind's urgent need for salt and light?

Salt preserves life and prevents decay. Being salt means stemming the evils of poverty, injustice, and need while keeping alive hope and joy. Light generates life and dispels the darkness that threatens wholesome human existence. However, in order to be truly effective, both salt and light must be consumed. For believers, being salt and light means being willing to let others use us through our giving, our caring, our service. A good parent understands this quality of selflessness, as does a loving spouse or a devoted friend whose whole self exists to give to the other. Paul called it kenosis or self-emptying. Jesus called it being salt and light to serve the needs of all. Do we dare to take Jesus at his word?

Eberhard Arnold has challenged believers not to approach Jesus' words in the Great Sermon as a new set of laws that replace the old law, but to understand them as the revelation of God's real power in human life (*Salt and Light: Living the Sermon on the Mount*, The Plough Pub. Co, Farmington, Pa.: 1998). When we surrender to this revelation and believe it and begin to live it, then there will be nothing that can stop us—not fear, not ridicule, not rejection, not violence, not hatred. To believe and to live these demands is to reach beyond the limits of the law to that realm where

love, forgiveness, mercy, and stalwart determination in the face of daunting obstacles become a chosen way of life.

In calling others to dare to live this way of life, the Matthean Jesus offered a series of antitheses regarding the law: "You have heard it said, but I say to you..." These antitheses lead believers beyond mere observance of the law to that place of mind and heart and being where we have been gripped by the love of God made known in Christ Jesus. a new justice can emerge; this new "justice of the warmly pulsing heart replaces the stony tablets of the

law" (Eberhard Arnold, op. cit.).

Daring to be Christian, daring to be gripped by God's love, daring to be salt and light, daring to bring about the new justice based on love and mercy—all this daring is but the first step, which must be followed up by many graced and deliberately chosen steps in the process of becoming Christian.

Of course, there are some who have taken the demands of Jesus seriously. These are the saints of every generation whose holiness often seems unattainable to most of us. Joining these saints as modern, authentic witnesses to Christ are Mother Teresa of Calcutta, Sr. Thea Bowman, Dorothy Day, Peter Maurin, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Edith Stein, and Martin Luther King Jr., among others. There are also people whose lives reflect Gospel values even if their religious affiliation does not, those such as Gandhi and the Dalai Lama. But the few whose attempts at Christian living continue to inspire us are too often the exception rather than the rule of Christianity. For that reason, Jesus dares us in each Gospel this month to take his words to heart, to embrace the ethic that will bring forth justice and peace and to dare, daily and deliberately, to be Christian in all we are, in all we say, in all we do.


We welcome these courageous young women into our Parish family and offer them our prayerful support as they journey in faith with our St. Thomas More community.

CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP

What Is Our Motivation?

Why do you perform good deeds? Is your goal the glory of God, or are you looking for human praise? The motivation behind our service is important to God, according to our Lord Jesus Christ.

In a few weeks, on Ash Wednesday, we'll hear Jesus' teaching from a later portion of the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 6), where he tells us to "not let your left hand know what your right is doing, so that your almsgiving may be secret."

But in today's Gospel from Matthew 5, he instructs us "your light must shine before others that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father." So are our good deeds to be secret or to be open? The answer depends on our motivation.

If we are searching for praise, we are seeking our own glory, not God's. But that's not the approach Christians are supposed to take. As St. Peter wrote, whatever we do should be done in such a way "that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ" (1 Peter 4:11). In other words, not every good deed we perform has to be hidden. However, we should do them in such a way that any praise that results is given to God rather than to us.

Worry about motivation must not, however, serve as an excuse for not performing good works. We can't say that our motives may not be pure, so we won't serve others until we know we aren't doing them to seek praise. Developing pure motives is a lifelong task for most us anyway. Simply obeying Jesus' command to perform good deeds is an important first step.

We are called to serve others in the name of our heavenly Father, without any excuse. The prophet Isaiah lists some of the things we are charged to do: "Share your bread...shelter the homeless... clothe the naked..." (Isaiah 58). God is a God of love and compassion, and when we serve others for his sake, he is glorified, and we discover we receive our spiritual reward.



It's easy to find the stewardship applications in today's readings. Compassionate care of those in need requires gifts from our treasure and gifts of our talents in service. The gift of our time in prayer and worship is also called for, to develop our spiritual

awareness that God's glory, and not ours, should be the goal of our service. It's only "the power of God" St. Paul mentions in the reading from 1 Corinthians 2 that enables us to do good, and to do it for God's glory and not our own.

But then, we're called upon to make a difference, to be "the salt of the earth... the light of the world."
