

What Is Get On the Bus?

Get On the Bus brings children and their guardians/caregivers from throughout the state of California to visit their mothers and fathers in prison. An annual event, *Get On* the Bus offers free transportation for the children and their caregivers to the prison, provides travel bags for the children, comfort care bags for the caregivers, a



photo of each child with his or her parent, and meals for the day (snacks on the bus, lunch at the prison, and dinner on the way home) all at no cost to the children's family. On the bus trip home, following a four-hour visit, each child receives a teddy bear with a letter from his or her parent and post-event counseling.

Change of Date—Luau Moved to March 26!





LITURGY: THE WORK OF THE PEOPLE

Our Parish Liturgy Committee has been diligently working, evaluating, planning, and listening!

Late last summer, we met to begin the process of evaluating and improving our various ministries. We created an opportunity for everyone who serves in ministry to share their impressions and recommendations.

Over the seasons of Advent and Christmas, 203 ministers were asked two questions: What does your ministry do well, and how could your ministry be improved? Approximately 50% responded.

The Liturgy Committee met for three hours on February 12 to review the report, discuss trends, and set short- and long-term goals. This evaluation both affirms the work of our community and challenges us to live our celebration more fully. Members of this faith community are working to better the mission and ministry of the Parish in this time and in this place.

Seventy five liturgical ministers are needed to support and serve at our weekend Masses; this does not take into consideration the various music ministers that are scheduled. Behind the scene are the ministers who care for our sacred linens and vessels, and those who create the art and environment of our worship spaces. We absolutely would be at a loss without them!

Volunteers are the backbone of much of the church's work. Whether you are currently serving or looking for a place to belong and a meaningful ministry where you can share your gifts and talents, you are needed, you are being called, and you are most welcome! CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP Living Waters Run Deep

"Living waters" brings to mind sparkling waterfalls, waves washing upon the beach, a spring bubbling from underneath a rock, a gentle rain falling, or of Jesus who said, "Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them." (John 7:38)


