## **Pastor's Column**

#### The Forty Days of Lent

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday. We begin the Season of Lent. In these days, as we embrace the disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, we focus upon the Passion of Jesus the Christ.

Through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving we clear our minds and hearts a bit in order to make more room in our lives for the Paschal Mystery of Christ, His suffering, death, and resurrection.

We dare to ask ourselves "What meaning does the Passion of the Christ have for me?" and "How am I uniting my life to the Paschal Mystery of Christ?"

I encourage you to take seriously what our Parish offers you during this Season of Lent. Let your Lenten journey be not only private, but also communal.

Begin your walk with your Parish Family on the road of renewal and refreshment by attending Mass on Ash Wednesday and being signed with ashes. This external sign is a commitment of your desire and readiness for interior renewal. If your schedule allows, attend Morning Mass. Morning Mass is celebrated every Tuesday through Friday at 8:15am.

Morning Prayer, the Official Prayer of the Church, will be prayed on Monday mornings at 8:15am.

Take advantage of the Knights of Columbus Friday Lenten Dinners at 5:30pm followed by the Stations of the Cross that will be prayed on Friday evenings at 7:00pm.

Make plans to attend our Parish Lenten Mission with Fr. Rusty Shaughnessy, OFM, from Monday, April 4 to Wednesday, April 6. The Mission is for the whole family and is entitled, "Navigating Life's Whitewater Moments."

A Lenten Communal Penance Service will be celebrated as part of the Mission on Tuesday, April 5, at 7:00pm. When was the last time you went to confession?

begin their immediate preparation to celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil, on Saturday, April 23.

Attend Mass each Sunday as a family, ALL household members present together. Plan ahead for the Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, the Easter Vigil, and Easter Sunday. Mark your calendars for the days and times. Will it be necessary to rearrange some family schedules and work schedules in order to participate in Holy Week activities? Are you willing to make this a family priority?

Unite your crosses to the Cross of Christ. In that union you will find, not suffering and death, but new life, new hope, and new beginnings.

In these days, let us once again die to sin, to selfishness, to our own needs and concerns, and, on Easter Sunday, rise to new life on high with Jesus the Christ!

#### Fr. Mike's Health Update

My surgery will take place on Tuesday, March 8, on Mardi Gras, Shrove Tuesday! The surgery will entail a laminectomy and a laminoplasty. (If you are interested in further details, please GOOGLE.)

The surgery will be performed at Alvarado Hospital by Dr. Choll Kim of the Spine Institute of San Diego. The hospital stay should be only a day or two, with a four-week recovery period.

Fr. Rich Lewandowski will arrive on Monday, March 7, and will be with us until Monday, March 28.

I am grateful for Fr. Rich. In him, I will have a "supply priest to cover the Parish," a caregiver, a housekeeper, a chauffeur, a dogsitter, and a good friend all rolled up in one person!

It is my hope to return to duty on a limited basis on April 1, "All Fools' Day." That seems appropriate!

#### CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP Partnering with Jesus in Love and Service

In the Gospel reading from Matthew where Jesus was preaching to 5,000 people and dusk was starting to set in, supper was long overdue, stomachs were starting to growl, and all there was to eat were two fish and five loaves of bread. The disciples were aware of the predicament.

They said to Jesus, in effect, "This is a sticky situation, and we can't do anything about it anyway. Let's take what we gathered and go away and eat!"

By nature there is some of that mentality in all of us. Whenever God places us in a situation that challenges us to use our time and talent, and to invest some of ourselves in finding a solution to someone's problem or need, our first response is to remove ourselves from the problem.

Matthew, the one who wrote the account of the miracle of the feeding of the five thousand, was an evewitness to the event. Can you imagine the joyful satisfaction . . . the uplift in faith Matthew experienced when he was able to write, "But everyone ate, and there was more than enough. They gathered twelve baskets full of leftovers!"

Do you think there could be any symbolic significance to the fact that there were twelve baskets full? One for each disciple? Enough to satisfy their needs for days to come? All because they trusted God and had the joy and satisfaction that comes with being a partner with Jesus in his ministry of love and service.



For that matter, some of the most tired, worn out at times, almost burnt out disciples at every church have become that way because they have a difficult time saying "no" when our Lord calls them to join hands with him in using their time and talent to serve their church.

Tired? Yes! Weary? Yes! But then, you should be let in on a little secret: You should see their "baskets"!

Invite others to work with you. A text from the Letter to the Hebrews is always relevant: "Let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together . . . but encouraging one another." --- Hebrews 10:24
