Pastor's Column

Lift High the Cross of Christ!

The Cross is the major symbol of Christians. It is on the foundation of the cross that our faith is built.

The Cross and Jesus' approach to it shows us the way in which we are to approach our crosses whatever they may be.

Jesus had a choice. He could either embrace his cross or run away from it. In faith, trusting in the Father, he embraced the cross. He did not fight it, resist it, or run away from it. He surrendered. In that faithful surrender and embrace of the Cross, evil was transformed and changed into Good News-the Resurrectionnew life, new hope, and new beginnings for the entire universe!

We human beings spend so much time running away from the crosses that come into our lives. We deny them. We pretend and lie to others that they do not exist. We medicate them. We abandon them. In all these ways, though, they are still there. The suffering, the pain, the illness, the death, or the sin is still very much present. The more we try to ignore or run away from our crosses, the more ill health, physically, emotionally, and spiritually we cause for ourselves and others. It is only in our embrace of the cross that transformation and healing take place.



When we acknowledge and embrace our crosses and lift them high in faith, they become the very instruments that bring new life, new hope, and new beginnings. The instrument of death becomes the instrument of life.

M. Scott Peck writes, "I cannot be any more specific about the methodology of love than to quote these words of an old priest who spent many years in the battle: 'There are dozens of ways to deal with evil and several ways to conquer it. All of them are facets of the truth that the only ultimate way to conquer evil is to let it be smothered within a willing, living human being. When it is absorbed there like blood in a sponge or a spear into one's heart, it loses its power and goes no further.' The healing of evil—scientifically or otherwise—can be accomplished only by the love of individuals. A willing sacrifice is required...I do not know how this occurs. But I know that it does...Whenever this happens there is a slight shift in the balance of power in the world."

Embrace your crosses, unite them to Christ, and lift high the Cross of Christ!



THE SIGNS OF BAPTISM

The Liturgy of Baptism celebrated during the Easter Vigil incorporates specific meaningful signs and symbols. As we prepare for this year's Easter Vigil, we continue with our brief meditation on these signs and symbols.



in the overalls said.

"What do you mean 'frozen'?" the surprise and sarcasm. "It's 95 degrees out!"

The older guy answered patiently, "You've got a bad oil leak. There's nothing left to lubricate the engine. Without the oil, the moving parts got too hot and they expanded. They couldn't move anymore. Your engine is all locked up, jammed up, frozen up. This car isn't going anywhere."

When we are baptized and confirmed, we are anointed on our heads with chrism, a fragrant oil. Monarchs and priests are also anointed, as are altars and churches when they are consecrated for their sacred purposes. In every case, the meaning is the same: We call upon the Holy Spirit to be present and active in this person's life, through this person's ministry, in this sacred place. Oil is used because it is an ancient custom, a sacramental sign that has many symbolic meanings. But perhaps for us car-dependent folks the clearest meaning is this: Without the Holy Spirit, we are all locked up, jammed up, and frozen up.

One translation of the Pentecost sequence puts it this way: "Light most blessed, shine on the hearts of your faithful-even in their darkest corners; for without your aid we can do nothing good, and everything is sinful."

Am I in Need of a Gratitude Adjustment?

As we become old enough to drive and can afford the luxury of owning an automobile, most of us will encounter the need to periodically align and rebalance the tires. Typically, this will result from normal driving habits, wear and tear, and most likely some contact with curbs or other objects that sometimes get in the way of our journey. The rebalance and alignment becomes necessary to preserve the life of the tires and to smooth out the ride.

The same applies to God's gift of life to each of us. Regularly, we should prayerfully reflect upon how thankful we are for life and all of God's grace and giftedness. This reflection will hopefully result in some realignment and rebalancing of the manner in which we are sharing our giftedness, thus smoothing out our journey and the hope of achieving the gift of eternal life in Heaven. Where am I in this journey? How well is it aligned and balanced?

God's grace and giftedness encompasses all that I am, all that I have, and all that I ever will be. Where am I in the process of recognizing, receiving, accepting, and sharing (generously, sacrificially, and proportionately) of my God-given giftedness in love of God and neighbor?

What obstacles may be getting in the way? Where are my priorities? What is the level of my commitment to and practice of my Faith? Am I allowing our secular culture of numerous destructive "isms" (individualism, consumerism, materialism, egoism, relativism, etc.) to unbalance my attitude of gratitude journey? If necessary, a rebalancing and realignment process will involve that of reevaluating one's basic Baptismal call to discipleship and that of being called forth in action to carry it out in the Sacrament of Confirmation.



Let each of us set aside time in prayer to discern what the necessary rebalancing and realignment areas are in our daily lives. Then seek to develop and facilitate, in committed action, that attitude of gratitude in thanksgiving for God's grace and giftedness. For it is only in this way that we will have a smooth journey, balanced and

properly aligned, thus achieving that ultimate and cherished gift of eternal life in Heaven.
