Hospitality—A Way of Life

Many wonderful comments were made regarding Fr. Rusty Shaughnessy's Parish Mission this past week.

Fr. Rusty also had many very positive comments regarding life here at St. Thomas More, especially recognizing the great spirit of STM hospitality. This reminded me of a previous Pastor's Column that I had written, and thought it would bear repeating:

Here at St. Thomas More, a hallmark of our weekend liturgies is hospitality. The climate is one of care, concern, and a desire to know one another, especially the newcomer, the guest.

This spirit of hospitality does not just happen. It takes concerted effort and a commitment to do things differently—to be deliberate in our interaction with each other.

As a Faith Community, when we gather to celebrate, we commit ourselves to be welcoming to the stranger in our midst, to the one who may be with us for the first time.

Also, we dedicate ourselves to each other, who come week after week. We commit ourselves to getting to know each other, to sharing our stories, and to supporting each other on life's journey.

Hospitality is a hallmark of a Christian, an attitude that we are to carry with us in all the situations of our everyday lives.

I share with you some thoughts about hospitality from Fr. Henri Nouwen. These words are taken from his book, *Reaching Out*:

Hospitality means primarily the creation of a free space where the stranger can enter and become a friend instead of an enemy. Hospitality is not to change people, but to offer them space where change can take place. It is not to bring men and women over to our side, but to offer freedom not disturbed by dividing lines.

It is not to lead our neighbor into a corner where there are no alternatives left, but to open a wide spectrum of options for choice and commitment. It is not an educated intimidation with good books, good stories, and good works, but the liberation of fearful hearts so that words can find roots and bear ample fruit.

It is not a method of making our God and our way into the criteria of happiness, but the opening of an opportunity to others to find their God and their way.

The paradox of hospitality is that it wants to create emptiness, not a fearful emptiness, but a friendly emptiness where strangers can enter and discover themselves as created free; free to sing their own songs, speak their own languages, dance their own dances; free also to leave and follow their own vocations.

Hospitality is not a subtle invitation to adopt the life style of the host, but the gift of a chance for the guest to find his own.

Let us continue to challenge each other to make hospitality a way of life here at St. Thomas More!

THE SIGNS OF BAPTISM

The Liturgy of Baptism celebrated during the Easter Vigil incorporates specific meaningful signs and symbols. As we prepare for this year's Easter Vigil, we continue with our brief meditation on these signs and symbols.

For most people, the word vow conjures up the phrase "for better, for worse, in sickness or health, forsaking all others, till death do us part."

easy—but it is worth it.

When we celebrate the sacrament of baptism, we forsake all others-Satan, his empty works, his empty promises—and profess faith; that is, we commit ourselves to live in covenant with the one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, for now and for always, no matter what comes. Saint Paul says that nothing can separate us baptized from the love of Christ: not trial, distress, persecution, hunger, nakedness, or danger, not even death (Romans 8:37-39). Being faithful is not always easy, but the saints and martyrs and all the blessed ones who have gone before us and the ones who walk among us attest that it is worth it. And we know that God will always be faithful to the covenant, as promised to Noah when God spread the first rainbow over the earth and vowed never again would all be lost (Genesis 9:14).

A SENSE OF THE SEASON

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

Palm Sunday is the Sunday of Holy Week within the Lenten Season. The liturgical color is deep scarlet red, the color of blood, indicating Christ's supreme redemptive sacrifice. We come together for this solemn celebration as Christ enters his own city to complete his work as our Savior, to suffer, to die, to rise again.

The palm branch is a symbol of triumph and victory, while the crown of thorns symbolizes the passion of Christ. We gather to process with our blessed palm branches and hear the singing of the Passion of our Lord. We stand with Christ in his suffering.
