Lent, the Triduum, Resurrection Sunday, and the Great Fifty Days

As most of you know, my Lent was spent at the rectory recovering from back surgery. These weeks were some of the most difficult weeks of my life. It was so because I was attempting to live according to my plans and schedule, and not God's, nor those of the surgeons and the health professionals that were attempting to guide me.

As Lent progressed, I did learn my lessons!

When I "returned" to my duties during Holy Week, the Triduum, it was a most exhilarating and very spiritual experience for me.

Why? Because I saw how everything during this time moved forward without my direct presence in the office and in the Parish.

I was not surprised, but once again, I was amazed and filled with gratitude for this faith-filled community: all of you, the Parishioners, and the Parish Staff!

The word that I use over and over again when describing this Parish to others is "intentionality."

All of you are here because you want to be! You take seriously the responsibilities and duties of being members of this Faith Community.

And each of you, according to your ability, give of your time, talent, and treasure to ensure that St. Thomas More Parish is a vibrant place in which the mission and ministry of Jesus continues for this time and this place!

The details of Lent that came to me from others, and then the Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil, and Resurrection Sunday Liturgies that I had the privilege to lead were so meaningful!

CHRIST THE LORD IS RISEN AGAIN!

Here we go again!

This is a common refrain of those who prepare liturgies. Day after day, Sunday following Sunday, season by season, year after year, our faith community gathers to nourish our souls, to celebrate the mystery, to worship our God. It doesn't stop.

Worship—sung, spoken, or silent—is meant to be ongoing, neverending. Our worship is like that of the four living creatures in the Book of Revelation (4:8),

Day and night they do not stop exclaiming:

Holy, holy, holy
is the Lord God almighty,
who was, and who is,
and who is to come.

And then there are the "elders" who, every time they hear the creatures giving glory and honor and thanks, fall down before the throne and exclaim:

Worthy are you, Lord our God, to receive glory and honor and power,

for you created all things; because of your will they came to be and were created.

Note, that the creatures never stop. This would mean that the "elders" never get to stop either. Nor do we!

I know a number of colleagues who work in the academic world of music, who are not at all comfortable in a church or synagogue setting. For them, the ongoing requirement of preparing a worthy piece of choir music and presenting it seven days after the last piece is too stressful. They are perfectly capable of putting together a ninety-minute concert every ten weeks. Four or five minutes every week is another story.

So when one of my colleagues inquires about the lull after Easter, I reply, "What lull?" The Great Fifty Days of Easter are upon us. Our worship, and our song, continues!

This season the Sanctuary Choir is singing "Christ the Lord Is Risen Again" by John Rutter. Catherine Winkworth's translation of this powerful text intrigues me because it is one of the few times I see the word "again" rather than the more common "today" found in most Easter hymns.

Christ the Lord is risen again; Christ hath broken every chain; Hark, the angels shout for joy, Singing evermore on high, Alleluia!

He who gave for us his life, Who for us endured the strife, Is our Paschal Lamb today! We too sing for joy and say Alleluia!

He who bore all pain and loss Comfortless upon the cross, Lives in glory now on high, Pleads for us, and hears our cry. Alleluia!

Now He bids tell abroad How the lost may be restored, How the penitent forgiv'n, How we too may enter heav'n. Alleluia!

Thou, our Paschal Lamb indeed, Christ, today thy people feed; Take our sins and guilt away, That we all may sing for ay, Alleluia!

The word "again" in the first line reminds me of our ongoing mandate to worship continuously, day after day, Sunday following Sunday, season by season, year after year.

This Easter season is not the first time we have celebrated Christ's resurrection, nor will it be the last. Thanks be to God!
