On Living the Resurrected Life

As we continue to celebrate Resurrection Sunday during these "Great Fifty Days" of Easter, we are mindful that the Resurrection is not just a past event, but just as importantly, it is a present reality in which we are called to live, move, and have our being.

I share with you the words of Rev. Henri Nouwen, taken from his book, Sabbatical Journey:

... As we claim our faith in the resurrection of the body, we come to see that the resurrection is not simply an event after death but a reality of everyday life.

Our care for the body calls us to unity beyond organization, to intimacy beyond eroticism, and to integrity beyond psychological wholeness.

Unity, intimacy, and integrity are the three spiritual qualities of the resurrected life.

We are called to break through the boundaries of nationality, race, sexual orientation, age, and mental capacities and create a unity of love that allows the weakest among us to live well.

We are called to go far beyond the places of lust, sexual need, and desire for physical union to a spiritual intimacy that involves body, mind, and heart.

And we are called to let go of old ways of feeling good about ourselves and reach out to a new integration of the many facets of our humanity.

These calls are calls to the resurrection.

Caring for the body is preparing the body for the final resurrection while anticipating it in our daily lives through spiritual unity, intimacy, and integrity.

May our participation in the celebration of these "Great Fifty Days" bring us all to greater unity, intimacy, and integrity!



NOT MONOLITHIC AT ALL

The Pastor at my wife's church has decide to investigate updating their church's "contemporary" worship service as a means to better attract young families (adults in their thirties and early forties, and their children). My wife, a long-time member of the church's praise ensemble, has been asked to join the "task force" looking into various possibilities. They began meeting a couple of weeks ago, and I really, really want to be a fly on that wall!

This week, the latest monthly magazine from the National Association of Pastoral Musicians (NPM is the big national Catholic liturgy and music organization) crossed my desk—an entire issue devoted to teens and young adults in worship.

Sometimes it is difficult to hear the Holy Spirit, but it seems to me that I am supposed to be pondering worship styles right now.

So, perhaps we should begin with two of the most loaded questions in the liturgical world: What makes "traditional" worship traditional? What makes "contemporary" worship contemporary?


Or, perhaps not. In the NPM magazine, the teenaged author of one of the articles reminded readers

that youth are not "monolithic," that is, all of them do not resonate with the same approach to worship. Focusing in the musical part of the liturgical spectrum, she notes that some youth today are finding their worship voices through the music of Christian/Catholic radio. Others are becoming fully engaged in what is known formally as the Extraordinary Rite, Mass that is celebrated in Latin, and have gained an affinity to the unaccompanied Gregorian chant of the ancient Church. Still others are finding their voice in the hymnody and choral tradition of what one could call Cathedral music.

So it seems "traditional" and "contemporary" might not matter at all

I have referred before to the "one tent" approach to our faith community's gatherings as one reason we rotate the musical groups through the weekend's liturgies and why we sing praise songs and hymns at all of our Masses, regardless of which musical group is present. I am happy to find additional confirmation that this non-monolithic approach to musical liturgy is appropriate.


Our Environment ~ Our Concern?
