Pedal!

At first I saw God as my observer, my judge, keeping track of the things I did wrong, so as to know whether I merited heaven or hell when I die.

God was out there, sort of like a president—I recognized the picture when I saw it, but I really didn't know God.

But later on when I met Jesus, it seemed as though life was rather like a bike, but it was a tandem bike. I noticed that Jesus was in the back, helping me pedal. I don't know just when it was that He suggested we change places, but life has not been the same since.

When I had control, I knew the way. It was rather boring, but predictable—it was the shortest distance between two points. But when Jesus took the lead, he knew delightful long cuts, up mountains and through rocky places at breakneck speeds. It was all I could do to hang on! Even though it looked like madness, He said, "Pedal!"

I worried and was anxious and asked, "Where are you taking me?" Jesus laughed and didn't answer, and I started to learn to trust. I forgot my boring life and entered into the adventure. And when I'd say, "I'm scared," Jesus would lean back and touch my hand. He took me to people with gifts I needed—gifts of healing, acceptance, and joy. They gave me their gifts to take on my journey, my God's and mine.

And we were off again. Jesus said, "Give the gifts away—they're extra baggage, too much weight." So I did give the gifts away to the people we met and I found that in giving I received and still our burden was light.

I did not trust Jesus at first, in control of my life. I thought He'd wreck it. But He knows bike secrets, knows how to take sharp corners, jumps to clear high rocks, fly to shorten scary passages. And I am learning to shut up and pedal in straight places, and I am beginning to enjoy the view and the cool breeze on my face with my delightful, constant companion, Jesus.

And when I am sure I just can't do any more, Jesus just smiles and says, "Pedal!"

LET ALL THE EARTH CRY OUT TO GOD WITH JOY ALLELUIA!

Each week, I receive in my email a reflection on a piece of the coming Sunday's Scriptures from the National Association of Pastoral Musicians.

This week, author Meyer Chambers, from Boston College, focuses on the two antiphons (congregational parts) of the responsorial psalm:

Let all the earth cry out to God with joy, and

Alleluia!

Although the reflection is geared toward musicians, Mr. Chambers' words apply to all of us as we enter these final weeks of the Great Fifty Days.

The readings this week are filled with power words: shout, sing, praise, worship, tremendous, rejoice. Has it really been just six weeks since we sang our first Alleluia of this Easter Season? Have we tired of it already—all that joy? As the African American Catholic evangelist Fr. Jim Goode, OFM, might exclaim: "Mercy!"

Have our Alleluias managed to outlast the Easter lilies, or is it back to business as usual in attitude as well as decoration? Have our music selections continued to celebrate Easter every Sunday? Have our rehearsals maintained the same sense of urgency and intensity that we experienced in preparing for the Sunday of the Resurrection? Or are we drooping like those lilies because many of us are

inundated now with First Communions, weddings, healing Masses, funerals, ordinations, baccalaureates, and commencements?

I'm often asked at Christmas and Easter whether it's a busy time of the year for me, but the truth is that we pastoral musicians are always busy. I don't know about you, but I certainly need the energizing and focusing words of this Sunday's Scriptures!


Indeed we *all* need the energizing words of this Sunday's Scriptures. As it is with Christmas and the tendency to let the secular world push the Nativity to the background, so too is with Easter and our celebration of the Risen Lord.

Pentecost, the last day of the Easter season, will soon be here and we will celebrate the giving of the Holy Spirit to the apostles, the disciples, and to all of us through the ages.

May the scriptures of these last weeks of Easter fill us with energy and enthusiasm to celebrate God's many gifts.

O great, renewing God, continue to breathe your Spirit upon us so that we might shout, sing, praise, and worship you as we rejoice tremendously.

YouTube & Faith the New Evngelization

There's something heart-warming about the idea that a two-thousand-year-old institution like the Catholic Church uses the modern technology of YouTube to spread its message.

In a document issued almost 50 years ago, Pope Paul VI tells us the techniques and the technologies of contemporary communications are an integral part of the church's mission in the third millennium.

Blessed John Paul II revisited this topic 40 years later and said "the Church is not only called upon to use the mass media to spread the Gospel but, today more than ever, to integrate the message of salvation into the 'new culture' that these powerful means of communication create and amplify."

Two months before JPII's death in 2005, YouTube was developed and four years later Pope Benedict started the Vatican YouTube page.
