It is my desire each year to give you my first Pastor's Column in which I shared with you the words of Archbishop Daniel Pilarczyk, as he talks about the meaning and purpose of a Parish. A parish, then, is a moment, a chapter in God's love affair with us human beings. And being a member of a parish does not mean just 'belonging to something', but rather, being involved in a loving association with God in Christ Jesus and with each other in Him, and with all the world for Him.

Parish is therefore concerned with relationships—our relationship with Christ and our relationship with each other in Him.

Consequently, the main participant in every parish is the Lord Himself. It is He around whom the people gather in worship. It is He whose word the parishioners hear there. It is for the strengthening and expression of His Body, the Church, that the parishioners build buildings and carry out programs.

It is in response to His love that the parish engages in care for the poor and in outreach to those who have forgotten Christ or have never known Him.

I now have the privilege of joining you, the Church of St. Thomas More, on its Faith Journey, its Love Affair with God, in and through the Lord Jesus Christ. I pray that, because our paths now become one, we will continue to deepen our relationship with the Lord Jesus, and that we will continue to center our lives more completely on Him.

As I begin my ministry as your Pastor, I commit all of my time, talent, treasure, and energy in building on the strong foundation that has already been set, that is, the ongoing creation of a climate and an environment of hospitality that says: "The Church of St. Thomas More is holy ground. The Church of St. Thomas More is a people and a place where God is revered, and all God's People are treated with dignity, respect, and offered the opportunity to be challenged by the Gospel. The Church of St. Thomas More is the home of brothers and sisters in Christ who take time to support each other in deepening their relationship with Jesus the Christ for the purpose of making our world a better and safer place for all people."

I promise all of you that I will do all that I can, during this time of transition, that as a Faith Community, we do not experience 'a loss of momentum,' but rather, that we experience a 'surge of energy.'

As we pilgrimage through life, as individuals and as a community of Faith, our book of Life is being written. Some chapters we write. Other chapters are written for us. Chapters end. New chapters begin. Today we begin a new chapter in the Faith Life of the Church of St. Thomas More. With me, I ask that you 'look forward' to opportunities for growth that change affords.

As we begin to walk together, may our prayer be: "For all that has been—Thank you. For all that will be—Yes!"

JESUS SPOKE TO THEM IN PARABLES

Scripture Themes for July

When Socrates took on the responsibility of educating the youth of his native Greece, he formulated a method of inquiry and debate in order to stimulate critical thinking and illumine the truth. Pythagoras, like a midwife bringing a child to birth, would draw out of his students the knowledge he knew to be there. Aristotle began with what can be known through experience and challenged his students to probe deeper and investigate more fully. Later came Jesus with a method of teaching the truth about the reign of God that continues to inspire and guide his followers on their way.

Jesus taught in parables, which are stories that set something familiar alongside something that is not familiar in order to shed light on the latter. Because three of the five Gospels for July are drawn from Matthew 13, a chapter in which the evangelist has featured many of Jesus' parables, it may be helpful to look once again at this excellent teaching method.

A parable is meant to convey one basic moral lesson. In order to teach that lesson, Jesus' parables possess an existential quality; they were tailored to the character and experiences of his contemporaries, who fished and farmed and bartered and tended sheep for a living. Jesus' parables were paranetic, i.e., they were intended to persuade, to challenge, to move the listener to some decision, resolution, or action. In order for this moral response to be forthcoming, listeners would have to look beyond the story itself to the deeper meaning and allow themselves to be grasped by its truth.

While he did not originate the literary form of the parable (recall Nathan's parable as told to David, 2 Sam 12:1-4; and Isaiah's parable of the vineyard, Isa 5:1-7), Jesus made powerful use of the parable in order

to: (1) evoke a transformation in his listeners; (2) challenge them to embrace a new system of values; and (3) have them open themselves to a new concept of salvation—as not a reward to be merited by the righteous, but the gift of a loving God to sinners. To this end, Jesus invited his listeners to accept the good news of the kingdom, which he communicated in parables. To the closed-minded, the parables remained a puzzle; to those with faith, the parables were a window into the heart and mind of God.

Looking through that window, believers will also learn what C. Milo Connick has identified as the six key concepts concerning the reign of God that had been inaugurated in Jesus (Jesus: The Man, the Mission and the Message, Prentice Hall, 1994). On several different occasions, Jesus communicated these concepts to a variety of audiences through clusters of similar parables.

First among those concepts was the *nearness* of the kingdom. Jesus' declaration "The reign of God is at hand" took story form in parables that conveyed a sense of urgency and reminded believers that being prepared is the order of the day. The utter nearness of the kingdom required people to have a new ethic and a new mindset so they would appreciate God's plan and recognize God's surprisingly generous and compassionate manner with sinners, as reflected in the words and works of Jesus.

Other clusters of parables affirm the *inevitability* of the reign of God, which might start small and may take time but will not be deterred. Jesus' parables on the *inclusivity* of the reign of God attest that all people, without exception, are to be a vital part of God's plan. Shocking as it may seem to the righteous,



God's predilect for the lost and the lowly assures them a place at the eternal banquet table. Not only does this notion of inclusivity concern heaven, but it says that here and now, believers are to reflect in their words and works this same quality in their dealings with all others.

A fourth concept concerning the *cost* of membership in God's reign is communicated in parables that call believers to offer no less than all they are, all they have, and all they hope to become in order to enter the kingdom. In the fifth and sixth concepts regarding the kingdom, Jesus taught of its supreme value and of the challenge inherent in attaining membership. In the month of July, we will encounter parables that exemplify each concept.

As with every word Jesus uttered, the parables have been handed on to generations of believers through the interpretive filters of the community in which they were preserved and the lens of the evangelists and redactors of the Gospels. These adaptations brought the message of Jesus to bear more relevantly on the changing times and evolving circumstances of the growing movement of believers. As we hear these same parables proclaimed among us this month, we must allow their message to speak to our hearts and transform our lives.

Can a simple knit cap help save a baby's life? In many developing countries it sure can! According to the Save the Children organization, four million newborn babies die each year within the first month of life. Bill Gates has been quoted as saying one of the easiest ways to cut down on infant mortality is to keep babies warm and dry.



Through their Knit One Save One campaign, this organization has sent thousands of baby caps and newborn care kits to new mothers in such places as Bangladesh, Malawi, and Vietnam.

This past fall one of the college students at St. Paul's Church in Milltown, NJ approached the Pastor asking if he thought some of those in the congregation might be interested in knitting/crocheting baby caps. She was hoping to collect a few to send along to the Save the Children organization.

Thinking that maybe the people of St. Paul's would donate 25-30 hats, Pastor Rich asked one of the Parishioners to spearhead the project. Some Parishioners stitched away, some donated wool, and others asked friends and elderly family members to make hats.

One woman offered her time and talent to teach more people how to knit. For the next two months baby caps of all colors and sizes were dropped off at the church!

Through the overwhelming generosity of a few women from St. Paul's and Rutgers University, 242 little ones were a bit warmer this past winter. Yes, the hands of a few provided love and warmth for many newborns around the world.
