#### **North County Solutions for Change**

Many of you are familiar with the work of Fr. Joe's Villages in San Diego. Fr. Joe and his Organization have been doing miraculous work with the homeless for many years now. Here in North County we have an Organization that is doing the same kind of work—North County Solutions for Change (NCSC).

St. Thomas More Parish has gotten behind this work because it is nearby, located in Vista, and because it is so remarkable in addressing and solving the issues of homelessness for the people of our own community.

NCSC was founded in 1999 by Chris and Tammy Megison because they didn't think it was right for babies to be sleeping on the floor of an emergency winter shelter.

Prior to starting NCSC the Megison's developed and directed work and housing programs that helped thousands of homeless

men get jobs, pay rent, and earn their way back into society through an intense boot-camp style program.

Their most notable achievement was recognized as being the creators of one of North County's most successful social purpose micro-enterprises, the North County Times Hawker program (those guys selling papers on the streets). Chris and Tammy built the program from the ground up, and over its first seven years developed it into one of the most successful newspaper street-selling operations in the nation, expanding it to three other daily newspapers in eighteen cities in San Diego, Orange County, and Los Angeles.

#### Pastor's Column (continued from page 1)

In 1999 they encountered a startling new reality of homelessness as a nine-year-old homeless girl with her baby sister and their mother bedded down for the night on the floor of an emergency shelter. As dozens more families came to the shelter, the Megison's realized that they were confronted with an enormous problem. Not just because there were many families in crisis needing help, but because the entire homelessness response system was woefully inadequate to deal with the needs of homeless families. Big solutions were in order, and so with the help of other community leaders and entrepreneurs, they struck out with their plans.

From their original 300-square-foot office in downtown Vista, they began casting a vision around solving family homelessness. The vision was different in that it did not include more shelter beds, feeding programs, or traditional human services, but rather an audacious plan to create access to permanent solutions using a hybrid model that the couple developed. All the parents being helped would work, pay rent, attend onsite workshops and classes, and be engaged in a dynamic coaching system. The model, now known as the Solutions University, blends affordable housing, educational opportunities, employment training, and health-related solutions all within one cohesive strategic partnership. There is but one goal: work with this community to solve family homelessness for children and communities, permanently. By doing so, the futures for children can be transformed.

As Pastor, I have encouraged our Parish involvement in the NCSC endeavor. Parishioners and Staff Members have come forward and are turning my words of encouragement into Parish reality and support for NCSC.

Many Parishioners have come forward to provide meals for the residents at NCSC, and Kathleen Bell is co-coordinating a program to collect used books which are donated to NCSC and then sold on the internet. Dick and Charlene Belprez, the Chaircouple of our Social Ministries Committee, have stepped forward and created a special outreach committee specifically for the purpose of acting as a liaison to NCSC. Chris Smith, our Director of Stewardship and Development, is on the NCSC Board of Directors.

I am on the "Finding Our Way Home" Leadership Team along with Mark King, CEO of TaylorMade Golf; Sam Abed, Mayor of the City of Escondido; Danny Ashcroft, CEO of Western CNC, Inc.; Bobbi DePorter, President of Quantum Learning Network; Gloria Foote, CFP of Partner Financial Focus; Matt Hall, Mayor of the City of Carlsbad; Rev. Ted Hamilton, Pastor of New Life Presbyterian Church; Darrell Issa, Congressman of the 49th District; Chris Lischewski, CEO & President of Bumble Bee Foods; Judy Ritter, Mayor of the City of Vista; Sandra Shuda, Vice President of Watkins Manufacturing; Mike Simmons, Executive Vice President of DEI Holdings; and Jim Wood, Mayor of the City of Oceanside. I share these names with you so that you can see the wide community support that NCSC has garnered.

#### Social Ministries/Outreach

#### A Solution That Really Works!

North County Solutions for Change, a Vista-based non-profit organization, has a unique program that can solve family homelessness in our area. Their 1000-day program uses a university-style model that consists of 500 days at a family housing campus and 500 days off campus in independent housing. Adults must forgo drugs and alcohol, search for a job, pay a portion of their rent, and save 30 percent of what they earn. Families work with coaches in a team-oriented environment to focus on financial planning, parenting skills, recovery programs, and anger management. To date, Solutions for Change has helped 600 families transform their lives and become working, healthy, and productive members of our community.

STM Parishioners have been supporting various Solutions programs and initiatives for almost a decade, coordinated by a Social Ministries committee at STM. Last fall our Parish furnished food and entertainment for an open house at the Solutions Family Housing Center. Other activities have included providing financial support, plus donating furniture, Christmas gifts, school backpacks, books, and clothing for the residents, as well as preparing and serving a meal on the last Sunday of each month to residents at the Solutions Intake and Access Facility.

This weekend STM parishioners have an opportunity to provide financial support for a homeless family in our community. For a family of three, Solutions needs \$7,500 per year for three years (a total of \$22,500) to supplement operational funds obtained from other sources. We can permanently change the lives of a homeless family. Special envelopes are attached to the bulletin. Please make checks payable to Church of St. Thomas More. #### WHY WE SING

First in a three-part series from the National Association of Pastoral Musicians © 2002

We sing because singing does something to words that nothing else can do. It gets them into our memory and into our hearts. Singing makes a text memorable and gets it into the rhythm of our living: into our heartbeat and our breathing and our walking, sitting, and standing.

Singing gets words into our hearts and our minds even better than listening does. No matter how good the preacher is, few people go home humming the homily, because it's something that we listen to, not something that we do. Lots of people go to concerts to listen to their favorite singers, or they turn on the radio in the car or at home, or they put on their portable CD or MP3 players when they go walking or jogging. But pretty soon, even without realizing it, they find themselves singing along with certain songs. The words become part of them; they can recall these texts even if they can't recall the words of our creed or of the Declaration of Independence.

Music has a power to make words and events memorable. Studies have shown that musical memory is rooted in several parts of the brain, reaching across even the left-brain and right-brain divide. That makes it hard to forget music that we've learned and the words set to that music. Such rooting also helps to explain why we keep recalling certain tunes, even when we don't want to, and why it's so hard to get such tunes out of our heads: Our own brain's activity keeps running across these tunes and playing them for us.

So we sing at Mass and at other liturgical celebrations in order to remember, in order to recall what it is that we're all about as Christians. We sing to get the meaning of our liturgy into our hearts and minds and the rhythm of our lives. Singing is so powerful that people with dementia and Alzheimer's disease can remember and sing the songs of their childhood, even when they've forgotten their own names or the names of their children. Singing is so powerful that stroke patients can sing a statement or a request even when they can't speak.

# St. Thomas More Cookbook Fundraiser




We will begin to collect recipes from the St. Thomas More parish family and compile them into an attractive cookbook.
