Pastor's Column

An Actor or a Friend?

This is one of my favorite stories, and I enjoy sharing it with you from time to time.

A story once told...

"After a large dinner at one of England's stately mansions, a famous actor entertained the guests with stunning Shakespearean readings. Then, as an encore he offered to accept a request. A shy, gray-haired priest asked if he knew the Twenty-third Psalm. The actor said, 'Yes, I do, and I will give it on one condition: that when I am finished you recite the very same Psalm.'

The priest was a little embarrassed, but consented. The actor did a beautiful rendition... 'My Shepherd is the Lord, there is nothing I shall want,' and on and on.

The guests applauded loudly when the actor was done, and then it was the priest's turn. The man got up and said the same words but this time there was no applause, just a hushed silence and the beginning of a tear in some eyes.

The actor savored the silence for a few moments and then stood up. He said, 'Ladies and gentlemen, I hope you realized what happened here tonight. I knew the Psalm, but this man knows the Shepherd.'"—*Anonymous Source*

This poignant story challenges each of us to look at our approach and motivation for being involved in religion.

Bible Study

Beginning Wednesday, September 28, at 9:00am or Thursday, September 29, at 7:00pm, please join us for seven sessions as we study and discuss the lessons given to us in the catholic letters of St. James, St. Peter, and St. Jude.

We refer to these letters of the Bible in this way because they were addressed to the whole church and not just to a specific church or individual as in the case of St. Paul's letters. They were written to strengthen Christian communities scattered throughout the Roman Empire. Each letter has a specific purpose and content of its own, and they have very few features in common. St. Augustine says they all have to do with refuting errors which were beginning to appear. All of them evidence the teaching and catechesis given to the early Christian communities. The tone is pastoral and the letters contain religious instruction and moral teaching encouraging people to lead deeply Christian lives.

The Bishops' Letter on Marriage—Unitive and Procreative: "Conjugal love expresses the unitive meaning of marriage in such a way as to show how this meaning is ordered toward the equally obvious procreative meaning. The unitive meaning is distorted if the procreative meaning is deliberately disavowed...Likewise, the procreative meaning of marriage is degraded without the unitive." Faith Formation

We cannot live for ourselves alone. Our lives are connected by a thousand invisible threads, and along these sympathetic fibers, our actions run as causes and return to us as results.

Melville's words strike a chord with me as many of our Parish programs spring to life once again.

I hope you received our new Adult Faith Formation brochure in the mail last week. Excited by its content, I pray that many of these opportunities will intentionally become "invisible threads" in your spiritual development this year. Concretely that starts with putting the dates on your calendar or in your phone.

Faith Formation for our youth, known as RE.A.CH, is in its final steps of preparation as catechists are identified, orientations are held to acquaint parents and students with plans for classes, and last-minute details are covered to insure a smooth start of our preschool, elementary and middle school Parishioners on September 11.

The Holy Spirit surprised us with some brand new ideas for middle schoolers known as EDGE. This well-tested program combines the content of religious education classes with the fun of youth group. Whether in Catholic or public school, all 6th, 7th, and 8th graders are encouraged to register for this portion of RE.A.CH.

EDGE will meet two Sundays a month from 5:00-6:30pm on the lower level. We look for 50-75 participants (though we'd love 100!) who will meet as a whole group community for some activities, then deepen their understanding in small group sessions moderated by older teens and adults.

Rory Griffin will be the lead catechist with this group, and Marc Raymundo, our Youth Advocate, and I will be ultimately responsible for it.

Parents of 6th, 7th, and 8th graders: if your child has never been part of our middle school community, NOW is the time for your "actions (to) run as causes."

For every Parishioner, there is a new opportunity for your "faith to seek understanding" in the year ahead. "Our lives are connected by a thousand invisible threads."

CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP Inspiring a Deeper Understanding of True Giving

You will never be in a better position to tithe than you are today. Whether you can tithe has relatively little to do with the amount of your income or the number of your financial obligations.

The person who says "After I pay all my bills, I can't afford to tithe," is telling the truth. He or she simply has the cart before the horse. None of us could afford to tithe with what is left.

Tithing is a matter of putting first things first, taking our tithe out first, and then managing the rest of our income in a way by which we will still pay all our bills. And this is easier than you may think. Strangely enough, the decision to tithe is seldom made by sitting down with a pencil and paper. More often it is made by kneeling down with an open heart.

The decision to tithe has very little to do with a mathematical formula. It has a great deal to do with a right relationship to God. Most tithers began the practice the day they finally realized that their possessions, their money, their very lives were not their own, but God's.



No one can talk you into really believing this. Worship, prayer, and some mature Christian thought are the paths that sooner or later will lead you right into the heart of this inescapable truth.

Once you see God at the very center of your life,

tithing will make sense. You will understand your responsibility to manage 100% of your money, your time, and your ability as a trust from God. Then 10% of your income, dedicated to the owner, may seem to be all too little.

Tithing is a spiritual adventure. It is the beginning of a deeper, richer relationship with God. We need not give up the pleasures and luxuries of this life. God does not call us to be ascetics, but does call us to a right sense of proportion in administering our substance.

The question is: "If I have this for myself, then what should I do for God?" This is the question into which the whole matter of stewardship resolves itself.
