# Gratitude: A Lifetime of Christian Stewardship— Time, Talent, and Treasure Joyfully Given

This weekend we begin our special focus on and celebration of Christian Stewardship. Throughout this month we are reminded that Christian Stewardship is Discipleship, it is the way in which we live out our lives because we are followers of Jesus.

In doing so, as we give praise to God in our words, and in our actions in this Faith Community of St. Thomas More, we demonstrate our gratitude.

Fr. Henri Nouwen, in *The Return of the Prodigal Son*, talks about gratitude in this way:

The discipline of gratitude is the explicit effort to acknowledge that all that I am and have is given to me as a gift of love, a gift to be celebrated with joy. There is always the choice between resentment and gratitude because God has appeared in my darkness, urged me to come home, and declared in a voice filled with affection: 'You are with me always, and all I have is yours.' # Announcement Regarding Coadjutor Bishop for San Diego

I am happy to announce that Pope Benedict XVI has appointed Bishop Cirilo Flores to be the Coadjutor Bishop of San Diego, effective January 4, 2012.

Bishop Flores was born in Corona, California, in 1948, when Corona was still a part of the Diocese of San Diego

and he spent the first 30 years of his life in this diocese. After practicing law for 10 years, he entered St. John's Seminary in Camarillo in 1986 and was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Orange in 1991. He was ordained as Auxiliary Bishop of the Diocese of Orange on March 19, 2009.

Bishop Flores will be formally received in the Diocese of San Diego on Monday, February 13. As Coadjutor Bishop of San Diego, he will assist me until my retirement in 2013, at which time he will become the fifth Bishop of San Diego.

Bishop Gilbert Chavez joins me in welcoming Bishop Cirilo Flores to episcopal ministry with us in the Diocese of San Diego.

lament about the many misfortunes which have plagued me in the past, and thereby wrap myself up in my resentment. But I don't have to do this. There is the option to look into the eyes of the One who came out to search for me and see therein that all I am and all I have is pure gift calling for gratitude. The choice for gratitude rarely comes without some real effort. But each time I make it, the next choice is a little easier, a little freer, a little less self-conscious. Because every gift I acknowledge reveals another and another, until finally even the most normal, obvious, and seemingly mundane event or encounter proves to be filled with grace.

As Catholics, each week we come together to celebrate the Eucharist. The Eucharist is Jesus freely and totally giving Himself to us. "Take and eat. This is My Body. Take and drink. This is My Blood."

The One who becomes Eucharist for us challenges us to become Eucharist for others: "Do this in memory of Me!" We are called to become what we eat and what we drink.

Once we come to this moment of faith that Jesus is God's gift freely given to us, our only response can be one of gratitude in which we give ourselves as gift in joyous response. The gifts of time, talent, and treasure become the means in which we say "Thank You!"

Throughout this month of January, we reflect, in a special way, upon Christian Stewardship as a way of life, the way in which we give thanks to God for all that we are and all that we have.

Our very life is pure gift! Once we come to that realization, we are set free to live life joyously as the sons and daughters of God!

# Interfaith Committee for Worker Justice (ICWJ) Breakfast 2011

At 6:30am on December 1, a stalwart group of Parishioners and Fr. Mike met in the STM parking lot to attend the ICWJ breakfast being held in San Diego. The ICWJ is the voices of faith joined with the voices of labor to inform and support as the Voices of Justice. The principle behind this organization is the belief that a strong family is the corner stone of society. By supporting a living wage and a safe and productive work environment, everyone can contribute to the greater good by helping to bring low-wage workers out of poverty and into the middle class. As Robert Gleason, an Honoree and Chair of the San Diego County Regional Airport Authority, pointed out from the standpoint of an employer, the benefits of maintaining a trained, professional work force are far more cost efficient and good for business than having to hire many more inadequately trained, last-minute replacements which, on the whole, interrupt production and tend toward a disgruntled workforce and loss of quality of service to the paying public.

The other Honoree was Rabbi Laurie Coskey, a well-known presence in San Diego and North County and president of ICWJ for ten years. The City of San Diego, in appreciation of her, declared December 1 as "Rabbi Laurie Day."

An enthusiastic, multi-denominational presence at the Breakfast clearly indicated people of all faiths recognize worker justice as a necessary component in the expression of their faith. Representing various religious communities throughout the area were many local Catholic Churches, the Society of Jesus, and other clerical groups, as well as representatives from the Methodists, Anglicans, Episcopalians, Congregationalists, Nazarenes, Quakers and Unitarians, several synagogues, the Islam community, and the Sufi and Tibetan Temples from San Diego.

Understanding the educational necessities in equipping workers with skills for the future, many institutions of higher learning were also present. The many advocates within the education system sponsoring the ICWJ are notably: the University of California, San Diego, the California Federation of Teachers, the San Diego Community College District, the San Diego Human Relations Commission, and Mr. Marty Block, the Higher Education Chair of the California State Assembly. Also present was Sheriff Bill Gore representing the International Union of Police Associations and representatives from the Governor's office, and our California senators' offices.

At this impressive assemblage, St. Thomas More, among others, received an award for its mission to support worker justice. All in all, it was an entertainingly good time with a delicious breakfast among friends and supporters, making the early morning jaunt well worth while.

A Sense of the Season





# Christian Stewardship Resolution for 2012 Bring Christ's Presence to our World

January is traditionally a time for new beginnings, fresh starts. For the Christian steward, the grace of being given another day, or God willing, a whole new year, stirs deep gratitude.

It also calls us to ask what a "resolution" should really be. Our first resolve should always be to involve ourselves more intimately in the life of Christ, and how better to do that than by embracing Christ's call to be compassionate?

After all, Jesus himself instructed us, "Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate" (Luke 6:36). Clearly, we strive now to live and give compassionately, as we generally understand the term. We try to be kind, considerate, and understanding individuals. We share with others. But Jesus' words challenge us to embrace a compassion that is much deeper, much more radical than our general understanding.



The word *compassion*, at its root, means "to suffer with." This goes beyond merely writing a check, offering a prayer, or sending a note. Suffering is not a popular notion in our society and we strive to avoid it. But we hear Christ instructing us now to "suffer with" the poor, the vulnerable, the powerless, the neglected, and the weak.

How can we possibly choose such a journey, this challenge to be truly present to those who suffer?

All things are possible with God, and it is through a commitment to a life of discipline, discipline in action and discipline in prayer, that we move towards the goal of true compassion.

The Christian steward is committed to the Eucharistic life, and it is through this life which Christ offers us that we gain the courage and the will and even the need to follow Him in His own example of compassion.

Compassion is the doorway to a more responsive stewardship and a committed discipleship. Through our deepening sense of compassion in 2012, may we resolve to be the kind of Christian stewards who bring Christ's presence to a suffering world.






