

#### Did You Know?

- The ten acres of land on which our Parish Campus is being built was a GIFT from the Diocese of San Diego. It has been the policy of the Diocese that it provides the land on which new Parishes will build their Campuses. Our Parish purchased an additional five acres of land several years ago, enlarging our Campus to a total of fifteen acres.
- The Diocese of San Diego provided St. Thomas More Parish with a \$2 million INTEREST FREE loan to help us in the building of our present Parish Center. We had been paying down this loan sporadically between 1999 and 2006. Then in January 2006 we began paying down the debt at \$11,000/ month. Our last payment was in December, 2011.
- The Diocese of San Diego is providing St. Thomas More Parish with a \$5.4 million loan which is allowing us to move forward and build our Permanent Church and the Parish Office Building. Due to our good financial standing, the Diocese granted us many exemptions to its loan policy so that we would be able to build in the present economy. Building now may save us up to \$1 million in construction costs.
- The Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) is our yearly opportunity to engage in the Diocesan effort to participate in Jesus' mission of teaching, sanctifying, and serving.
- The goal of this year's ACA is \$3.5 million. The money will be directed for these purposes:
  - A. Imperial Valley Parish Development... \$1 million

  - C. Education in the Faith, Priestly & Religious Vocations, Marriage & Family Life......\$2 million
- Our Fair Share Assessment this year is \$48,000. This provides us with the opportunity "to pay it forward" and to assist not only the ongoing mission of Jesus on a Diocesan level, but to directly help other sister Parishes in our Diocese who are in need.
- Just as we have been helped, it is now our turn to help other Parishes. Last year, only 388 STM households out of 1,000 chose to participate in the ACA. Last year our assessment was \$48,000. We raised \$52,073 from 39% of the Parish. The average gift was \$134.21. Let us double the number of households participating in the ACA this year. I know that we can do this.
- 80% of the money raised over our \$48,000 assessment will be returned to our Parish, and it will be directed to the Operations Budget to ensure that we continue to balance our bottom line.

Please respond favorably to my "love letter." Please prayerfully reflect upon this information and act accordingly.



#### THE STRUGGLE THAT IS LENT

#### **Scripture themes for March**

During this season of prayer, fasting, and special sharing with the needy, many of us experience a great struggle. We look at God, and then we look at ourselves and find that we are often poor reflections of the One in whose image we are created. We see gaping holes in the quality of our character that seem to belie our belonging to God, and we try to make things right, both as individuals and as church.

We detect a certain shallowness in our faith; our professed beliefs do not always translate authentically into our lived response to God. Our prayer and worship at times become rote, and as a result, we do not carry away from our encounters with God the grace and strength that we need to be truly Christian. We grow weary of work, of others, of life. We look for new energy and purpose.

We look at our world and feel helpless to right its many wrongs. In our efforts to make a difference, we rely too much on ourselves and our own resources, rather than drawing life and courage from our partnership with God. We sink too easily into hopelessness. When others are too slow to help or to do what we expect, our anger and resentment flare.

Susan W.N. Ruach, the first woman to be ordained in the Indiana Conference of the United Methodist Church, wrote in her poem "A New Way of Struggling":

"To struggle used to be to grab with both hands / and shake and twist and turn and push and shove and not give in / But wrest an answer from it all as Jacob did a blessing. / But there is another way to struggle with an issue, a question—simply to jump / off / into the abyss and find ourselves floating, falling, tumbling, being led / slowly and gently / but surely / to the answers God has for us—to watch the answers unfold before our eyes and still to be a part of the unfolding. / But, oh! the trust necessary for this new way! Not to be always reaching out for the old hand-holds."

During the struggle that is Lent, despite the familiarity of the sacred texts, the rites, the prayers, and traditions, we are challenged to jump into the abyss of the unfamiliar in order to discover God and ourselves anew. Instead of just teetering on the precipice of discovery, we must be more daring; Søren Kierkegaard called this willingness to let goand let God take the lead-a "leap of faith." Faith carries believers beyond the secure and the knowable to that realm of surprises, of possibilities, of transformation and renewal.

In his struggle to believe and trust God, Abraham was asked to let go of Isaac. We cannot really know what Abraham thought of such an idea. We can, however, measure our own thoughts against his silent willingness to surrender his hopes for his future to a God whose ways are inscrutable. Peter, James, and John were told that they could not remain in the safe, glorious communion with Jesus on the mountain where he was transfigured. Glory—and their share in that glory—would come only after they



had followed Jesus into the abyss of suffering and death (March 4).

Each of us has a responsibility to own up to our sinfulness. That responsibility is part of the struggle of Lent. On March 11, the terms of our covenant with God (the Ten Commandments) are proclaimed, and a justifiably angry Jesus rails against those who desecrate God's holy places. By his action, Jesus affirmed the value of community over commerce and prayerfulness over profit.

As the month progresses and Lent intensifies, the author of the letter to the Ephesians reminds us that we are not alone in our efforts. Grace lifts us up and supports our struggle; indeed, God's gift of saving grace, which we take in by faith, has lit our way from death to life. Grace is not merely a crutch for weak human beings, as the Johannine evangelist will affirm; it is the very love of God made flesh for us in Christ Jesus (March 18).

On March 25, with Jeremiah's promise of a new, unconditional and everlasting covenant to sustain us, we remember with profound gratitude the struggle of Jesus, who willingly gave himself to be lifted up on the cross and in glory in order to draw all peoples to himself and to God.

Jesus' suffering for our sake is the source of our hope. In Jesus, we find the strength to unite our struggles to his, and thereby offer thanks and praise to God until our Brother and Lord comes again to take us home.

Jennifer Thieme, our candidate, will hear the Bishop say: "the Church recognizes your desire to be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit and to have a place at Christ's Eucharistic table. ## **Christian Stewardship Managing God's Gifts**

St. Paul summed up the basic principles of Christian stewardship when he wrote to the members of the church at Corinth: "I seek not yours, but you!" Jesus gave a similar interpretation of it when he said: "Seek ye first the Kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these other things shall be added unto you." Both Jesus and Paul were appealing for a total dedication to the Kingdom.

This stewardship of all of life will lead some to enter full time Christian service. To all, it will mean an on-the job witnessing, no matter what our abilities, our bank accounts, or our jobs.

Christian stewardship means the glad contribution of time and abilities to the work of the local church and church related causes around the world.

Because our gifts and circumstances differ, we cannot all be ministers or missionaries, teachers or nurses. We cannot all witness to Christ in the professions, like Albert Schweitzer, or in the business world, like a "Golden Rule" Nash.

But we can all give of our time and energy right where we are. This is where such gifts are most needed and most appreciated.

And the answer that the Christian steward will make, will include voluntary service in some of the opportunities in their church.

Of course, we do not all have the same abilities or the same material resources. Not all of us can do the same things. But all of us should do as many of them as time, abilities, and circumstances will allow.

Some will say: "But I'm just too busy to do any of these things!"

There is a saying that if you want to get something done, ask a busy person to do it. This is true because the person who gets things done is the person who has learned to budget their time and energy toward worthy goals.

True, we do not all have the same amount of time to give. But the Christian steward knows how to budget their time just as they knows how to budget their money; and they know that the gift of time and abilities is just as necessary to the Kingdom as is the gift of money. They take time to do the Kingdom's work.



To the Christian steward, life is a vocation that calls for a total dedication, including money, time, talents, everything. They give themself.

With St. Paul, God says to all of us: "I seek not yours, but you." And the Christian steward lays their time and abilities on the altar and replies humbly: "All things come of you, O Lord, and of your own have we given to you."

The Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion calls all the catechumens (the unbaptized), candidates (those who have received only Baptism), and the faithful into a time of intense preparation, by prayer and spiritual recollection, for the celebration and/or renewal of Baptism at the Easter Vigil.
