Pastor's Column

The Wounds of Christ

As we continue to celebrate Resurrection Sunday, as we continue to meditate and reflect upon the various resurrection accounts given to us in Scripture during the "Great Fifty Days," the wounds of Christ still present in Jesus' resurrected body cry out for attention.

The wounds are a source of intrigue and curiosity. Why are they still there?

In today's Gospel, we are given the account of Doubting Thomas who was not present the first time that the resurrected Jesus

appears to the disciples. Thomas responds to the disciples who tell him that they have seen Jesus: "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

A week later, Jesus again appears to the disciples, and this time, Thomas is present as well. Jesus says to Thomas: "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe."

Thomas responds to Jesus: "My Lord and my God!"

To help us in our reflection upon the wounds of Christ, I share with you the words of Philip Yancey, taken from his book, *The Jesus I Never Knew:*

One detail in the Easter stories has always intrigued me: Why did Jesus keep the scars from his crucifixion? Presumably he could have had any resurrected body he wanted, and yet he chose one identifiable mainly by scars that could be seen and touched. Why?

I believe the story of Easter would be incomplete without those scars on the hands, the feet, and the side of Jesus. When human beings fantasize, we dream of pearly straight teeth and wrinkle-free skin and sexy ideal shapes. We dream of an unnatural state: the perfect body. But for Jesus, being confined in a skeleton and human skin was the unnatural state. The scars are, to him, an emblem of life on our planet, a permanent reminder of those days of confinement and suffering.

I take hope in Jesus' scars. From the perspective of heaven, they represent the most horrible event that has ever happened in the history of the universe. Even that event, though, Easter turned into a memory. Because of Easter, I can hope that the tears we shed, the blows we receive, the emotional pain, the heartache over lost friends and loved ones, all these will become memories, like Jesus' scars. Scars never completely go away, but neither do they hurt any longer. We will have recreated bodies, a re-created heaven and earth. We will have a new start, an Easter start.

As we journey through this Feast of the Resurrection, let us take time to reflect upon our wounds and lift them up to the Lord.

Allow them to be an emblem of life on this planet and a sign of future glory!

THE EASTER PROCLAMATION

Be glad, let earth be glad, as glory floods her, ablaze with light from her eternal King, let all corners of the earth be glad, knowing an end to gloom and darkness.

Rejoice, let Mother Church also rejoice, arrayed with the lighting of his glory, let this holy building shake with joy, filled with the mighty voices of the peoples.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up to the Lord. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

O truly blessed night, worthy alone to know the time and hour when Christ rose from the underworld!

This is the night of which it is written:

The night shall be as bright as day, dazzling is the night for me, and full of gladness.

The sanctifying power of this night dispels all wickedness, washes faults away, restores innocence to the fallen, and joy to mourners, drives out hatred, fosters concord, and brings down the mighty.

On this, your night of grace, O holy Father, accept this candle, a solemn offering, the work of bees and of



your servants' hands, an evening sacrifice of praise, this gift from your most holy Church.

But now we know the praises of this pillar, which glowing fire ignites for God's honor, a fire into many flames divided, yet never dimmed by sharing of its light, for it is fed by melting wax, drawn out by mother bees to build a torch so precious.

O truly blessed night, when things of heaven are wed to those of earth, and divine to the human.

Therefore, O Lord, we pray you that this candle, hallowed to the honor of your name, may persevere undimmed, to overcome the darkness of this night.

Receive it as a pleasing fragrance, and let it mingle with the lights of heaven.

May this flame be found still burning by the Morning Star, the one Morning Star who never sets, Christ your Son, who, coming back from the death's domain, has shed his peaceful light on humanity, and lives and reigns for ever and ever.


This is the first time we are offering this course in order to help our teens appreciate the Bible as a part of our culture, how it came to be, and how it can be a deeper part of their lives.

Christian Stewardship God Calls Us to Service

A long time member of a congregation was asked to consider serving as a greeter. She was both surprised and appalled; after all, everyone knew she had a severe speech impediment! Reluctantly she agreed to give it some thought.

By the following Saturday she felt certain her response would be a polite refusal, "... there must be someone better suited for such a task."

However, as she began her evening prayers a picture of Christ came to mind. There he stood with hopeful eyes and outstretched arms. She was reminded of the posters of Uncle Sam as he beckoned to people's consciences to come and serve.

The vision was so overwhelming she was moved to reread the story of Moses in Exodus. There she found God asking Moses to lead the people out of Egypt, and Moses throwing up barriers: "I am not eloquent; I am slow of speech." Instead God directed him to Aaron. The woman thought, "If God could use, and in fact, chose Moses for such a great task, then certainly God could use me. After all, who am I to refuse?" The next morning she eagerly accepted the task as greeter.

Our greatest misconception of Christ is that he seeks the perfect. If that were the case, there would be none fit to serve him! When, in fact, Christ desires all to serve: the timid, weak, faint-hearted, wavering, reluctant, shy, inhibited, old, young. We should remember how he used Paul, formerly an unbeliever!

It is through Christ we are empowered to be the best suited. He can change our fears to confidence, erase our doubts and turn our inadequacies into a bold belief and the ability to carry out a given task.

We all have some talent to give. Our own growth and the growth of our church depends on the willingness of us all to invest that talent for others.

As a member of your church, you are called to share in all aspects of its life. Membership is responsibility, the response to the call to ministry and service. To be a church member is to answer that call with time and talent.
