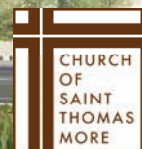

Pastor's Column

Waking the Sleeping Soul

Albert Schweitzer, theologian, musician, medical missionary who was born in 1875 and died in 1965, wrote these words:

You know of the disease in Central Africa called sleeping sickness...There also exists a sleeping sickness of the soul.

Its most dangerous aspect is that one is unaware of its coming. That is why you have to be careful. As soon as you notice the slightest sign of indifference, the moment you become aware of the loss of a certain seriousness, of longing, of enthusiasm and zest, take it as a warning.

As we continue our celebration of the Feast of the Resurrection, may we find time to withdraw and reflect, at least a few minutes each day, to become more conscious of the sights, sounds, and rhythms of life all around us.

Let's not "fall asleep at the wheel" and be dulled by all the activity around us and miss the Presence of Life, Hope, and New Beginnings that is Jesus, the Risen Lord.

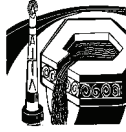

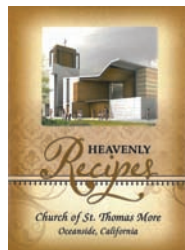

Immigration Survey: A Snapshot of Our Parish

In 2011 our Parish hosted an Immigration Reflection Day attended by members of many congregations throughout North County. It was a wonderful experience for each of us sharing our family immigration stories. Listening to each other's stories helped us get in touch with what we held in common and what was unique to each family. Through the use of a time line, we were able to see from which countries we had come to the United States and when—from early times to the present.

Although we cannot replicate that day, the Parish Social Justice Committee is offering a survey to our Parishioners to help us get a "snapshot" of the history of our Parish families, so that we too can celebrate who we are and from where we have come. In the next few weeks, we invite you to respond to a brief survey by computer. An email will be sent with the survey link. (For those without an email address on record, please pick up a copy at our table on the plaza or at the Parish Office. These surveys can be returned to the people at the table, or to the Parish office, or in the offertory collection basket.)

In the survey, we will be asking questions about you and your family and the way they came to the United States. From the results, we will compile some facts and stories that we will share with you in the Parish bulletin. Ultimately, we would like to work out a time line to show how we all came to be in this place, at this time.

PEACE BE WITH YOU

When God's timing is perfect...

Each Monday, I receive an email called "Sunday Word for Pastoral Musicians" from the National Association of Pastoral Musicians.

Each week, a different liturgy and music colleague offers a reflection on a sentence or phrase from one of the readings for the weekend. I enjoy getting them. Sometimes they are apropos, sometimes they are interesting. Sometimes, they are musical, other times they are liturgical. Occasionally, God is talking directly to me, even if I may not realize it at first.

For the Second Sunday of Easter, or Divine Mercy Sunday, I received the following, offered by Ginny Miller from Sacred Heart Cathedral in Rochester, New York, beginning with the scripture passage:

*Jesus came and stood in their midst
 and said to them,
 'Peace be with you.'*

—John 20:19

Reflection

You're in a locked room, fearful after an extraordinary week that you can't even begin to process, and someone mysteriously stands before you and says: "Peace be with you." The disciples want someone to protect them, tell them what to do next, make the last few days go away. And Jesus says: "Peace be with you."

Several years ago, when I was facing a serious health issue, someone said to me: "You know, it's going to be all right, no matter what happens." Even if I'm facing a terminal illness and may die, it's going to be all right? What kind of advice is that!

What is this state of being "at peace" or "all right"? Perhaps to be

peaceful, all right, steady, calm, serene, is the ability to go forward in spite of our fear, to act out of our "center," no matter what happens. That's not necessarily the peace we might hope for, where everything is perfect and there are no worries. But this might be the peace that Jesus offered his disciples—a peace that centered and sustained them as they faced uncertainty and persecution—a peace that can center and sustains us as we live and minister.

Prayer

God of the resurrection, help us to recognize, long for, and respond to your peace, a peace the world cannot give, a peace to sustain us as we celebrate, collaborate, and minister to your Easter people.

When I got this email a week ago Monday, the only medical thing going on was happening in Las Vegas, where my wife's stepfather was in physical rehab at a hospital for a back problem. So...the email was apropos.

Two days later, suddenly, he was in the ICU and phrases like "renal failure" and "intubation" were flying around, and I knew that I had to go back to the email, because God was talking directly to me, and I hadn't realized it the first time.

When I first drafted this column, my stepfather-in-law was stable, his kidneys were working, but he was still in ICU, and not yet out of the woods. We were praying for a peace that centers and sustains.

Yesterday (Tuesday) Leo "Mac" McCullough died, surrounded by his family, and we pray that the peace our Savior offers—where everything is perfect and there are no worries—



is his at last.

But, here's my point...there are many, many ways God can talk to us, with immaculate timing (God's timing is *always* perfect, in case you were wondering about this page's subtitle), if we listen, carefully. Whether through the scriptures proclaimed at Mass, the homily offered by our preachers, the written daily meditations many of us have at hand, or even the more academic commentaries in the Parish Office and in our personal libraries, in all these ways and more God talks to us, helping us through whatever problems we may encounter and celebrating with us the joys that abound in our lives.

Jesus shows us the way, present among us, through it all, saying, "Peace be with you."

Amen.
